Bank Robbery Committed In Talco

A long list of recent crimes in the Talco area seemed to have been "capped" by the Monday morning robbery of the Talco State Bank, leaving residents shaking their heads in frustration and anger.

A lone white male, wearing dark glasses entered the Talco State Bank at approximately 12:15 Monday, January 28.

He proceeded to window number three in the bank and handed teller Dana Anderson a note demanding money. Mrs. Anderson gave the man \$5,750 in twenty, fifty and one-hundred dollar bills. A part of the money was marked.

Seven other employees were in the bank at the time of the robbery, other employees had gone to lunch, including bank president Jerry Jones and vice-president Rusty Jones.

Mrs. Wanda Vickers, who was

working at her desk in the lobby, said she was aware that a customer had entered, but didn't look up from her work.

Mrs. Zenith Hargroves was talking on the phone in her office across the bank in front of the teller's window, but did not actually see the man.

Mrs. Gena Gage and Mrs. Nelda Carroll were both in the bank kitchen, and Mrs. Barbara Hardy was at the drive-in window.

Mrs. Jo Anschutz recognized the man, as a former Talco resident. She was coming from her office to put papers on Jerry Jones' desk.

She turned and went back into her office, not realizing a robbery was in progress.

Titus County Sheriff John Moss was notified immediately after the suspect left the bank, and Mrs. Anderson confirmed the identity of

the suspect to the sheriff.

Deputies were searching the area almost immediately for a sky blue Honda with a windshield wiper in the back, carrying two men.

Around 3 p.m., the pair were apprehended in DeKalb. At the time they were caught by DeKalb police, they were riding a motorcycle which they had apparently bought in DeKalb.

The suspects, Patrick Odell Bradshaw of Mt. Pleasant and James Otis Lee of Greenville were turned over to Titus County officials, where they were charged with felony robbery. Bradshaw was the suspect identified by the two bank employees, and was placed under one-hundred thousand dollar bond while Lee was placed under a \$50,000.00 bond.

Bank president Jerry Jones had

nothing but praise for the quick and efficient way the robbers were apprehended.

Officers taking part in the investigation were the Titus County Sheriff's Department, F.B.I., Texas Rangers and the Department of Public Safety.

Other investigations in the Titus area were:

Judge Laing of Mt. Pleasant arraigned Cheryl Elaine Cato, 17, of Talco for burglary of a building. Bail was set at \$15,000.00.

A Talco resident was suspicious of a person headed toward the school building Saturday and called the principal, Bill Vickers. Vickers went to the school and surprised the girl at the coke and candy machines. She escaped through a window in the boys restroom. It was assumed that

that was how she made her entry. The girl was later apprehended.

Justice of the Peace Johnny Mac Brown arraigned two Talco men for burglary of The Store in Talco. Gary Bernard Fagan, 30, and Raymond Norman, 19, were arraigned in J.P. court and bail was set at \$1,500.00 and \$25,000.00 respectively. A juvenile was also detained in connection with the burglary and has been turned over to juvenile authorities.

Justice of the Peace Eva Laing arraigned Ronnie Stephen Clements, of Talco, on two counts of aggravated robbery and burglary. Bail was set at \$30,000.00. Clements had just been sentenced to 30 years in the Texas Department of Corrections on a Lamar County warrant for aggravated robbery and burglary.

Children Die In Fire

Two Mount Vernon children died in a house fire Monday, Jan. 28 when a space heater located in the bedroom where the children were sleeping apparently set the room ablaze.

Dead are two-year-old Justin Duke Anderson and four-year-old John Anderson, Jr., both pronounced dead from smoke inhalation and severe burns at Franklin County Hospital at 3:15 p.m. Three local doctors, Dr. Abul Agual, Dr. Otto Walling and Dr. Kenneth Threndyle, treated the children. Funeral services were at 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, Jan. 30, at the First Baptist Church with the Rev. Mike Milburn officiating. Burial was in the Talco Cemetery.

Mrs. Anderson told City Police Chief Jim Perritt that she was asleep in the living room when the fire started, and was awakened by smoke. When she ran to the children's room, she found the children on the floor, not moving. Mrs. Anderson took both children outside the house to the doorstep, and called for help. Two neighbors, Glenda Andress and Ricky Nuziard, and a passer-by, Bill Ray Blue, gave assistance, with Nuziard and Blue administering CPR on the doorstep, then in a neighbor's yard, until

the Franklin County Ambulance arrived.

The fire was extinguished by the Franklin County Volunteer Fire Department, with extensive fire and smoke damage to the structure. The house, marked in 1984 by the Franklin County Historical Commission as the Majors-Kneiff House, was built in 1906 and located at 704 Holbrook. The house is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Carl Cronholm.

John Anderson was born March 2, 1980 in Jacksonville, North Carolina, and Justin Anderson was born April 26, 1982 in Titus County. Johnny Anderson and the former Juanita Ticer were the parents of the children.

Survivors include the parents, Johnny and Juanita Anderson of Mount Vernon; one sister, Jerri Anderson, Mount Vernon; grandparents, Jerry Simmons, Talco, Nita Simmons, Talco, and Bernice Ticer, Mount Pleasant; great-grandparents, Jack and Lucille Pettit, Bogata, Opal Anderson, Paris, and Wayne Brownlee, Jefferson.

Pallbearers were Hooker Bryant, Donnie Smith, Justin Eudy, Steve Wright, Bruce Case, Gary Weaver, Lee Banks, and James Moss.

A fund has been established at First National Bank in Mount Vernon to aid the Anderson family.

He told of his experiences as an addict. After 14 years of drug abuse he decided to quit. He has remained free of drugs for almost eight years now.

all day counseling with students. Displays of material available to students were set up in the school library. Posters made by the elementary students were also displayed.

Tim Wood and Laura Baird along

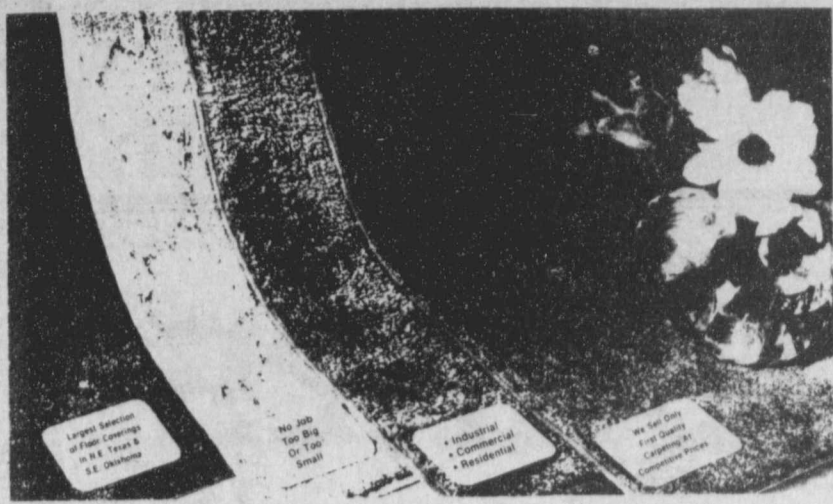

Jimmy N. Gurley Dies At Age 77

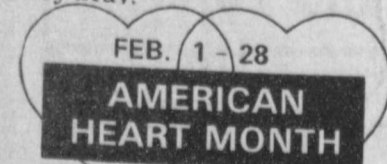
Jimmy Nuwlin Gurley, 77 of Bogata, died Monday, Jan. 28 in Red River General Hospital.
