

Erosion Is A Major Problem Nationwide

Erosion, in any rural area, it is a major problem...and this area is no exception.

The National Wildlife Federation has released some statistics that point out just how crucial a problem it is. Our soil, coupled with the extremely difficult economic climate for farmers and agriculturalists at this time is a major factor in the area's economy.

The United States is losing 6.5 BILLION tons of soil each year, according to the U.S. Department of

Agriculture. This amount of soil would fill 320 million dump trucks, which, if parked end-to-end would extend to the moon and three-quarters of the way back!

Besides being crucial for farming and ranching, the soil provides homes to countless forms of life. One acre of soil may be the home to 5 to 10 tons of animal life!

Kentucky leads all other states in the amount of soil lost per acre from sheet and rill erosion. Texas, for-

tunately, doesn't rate in the top five of that sad fact.

But the nation's cultivated cropland is eroding at an average rate in excess of 8 tons per acre each year, much more than the rate at which eroded soils are replaced through natural processes.

Topsoil, as just about any East Texan knows, is essentially the "cream" of the soil. It has the most nutrient matter and the best structure for aeration, moisture and temperature.

Texas does have a high level of wind erosion, some 13.4 tons per acre!

Texas, in terms of sheer tonnage, loses more soil from wind erosion than any other state. It is losing, according to the most recent federal data, 436.1 million tons of soil annually from cultivated cropland.

There are three types of soil erosion caused by rain, sheet, rill and gully.

Sheet erosion is the most difficult to see. It is the gradual wearing

away of a thin, uniform layer of soil. It occurs when there is not enough vegetation covering the soil, and seen as muddy runoff water.

Rill erosion occurs on gentle slopes that have little protective vegetation. Water runoff on the slopes accumulates into small channels of only a few inches deep.

Gully erosion occurs when runoff water accumulates into rapidly moving water channels. The water causes the channels to grow wider and deeper. This happens on steeper

slopes with little or no protective vegetation.

Erosion is a serious problem, not just a minor matter. An increased awareness of this fact by everyone can only help.

No human, plant or animal is exempt from a dependency on the soil. Some people live further from the earth, but their dependency is no less, only less evident.

National Wildlife Federation's slogan for this year is "Soil, we can't grow without it", is an appropriate one.

Council, Board Races Decided

Election results for the area held few surprises, as Jerry Russell of Talco, with 263 votes, and H. Drue Pirtle of Bogata with 195 votes were elected to three year terms on the Talco-Bogata CISD school board, and Eddy Brown of Talco, with 259 votes, captured a one-year term at large. Eddy Denny received a total of 185 votes.

In Bogata, there was an uncontested election, with positions being open and three men on the ballot. Sixty-nine votes were cast.

Billy Smiley received 60 votes, A.G. (Jeff) Puckett, 59, and incumbent Travis Hale, 49.

Mary Hudson and Frances Rozell served as election judges at the City Hall.

Talco City Council and Mayoral election positions were also uncontested. Joe B. Morse was re-elected mayor, while councilmen Lyndon Ray Reed and Mike Slone were returned to their seats on the council.

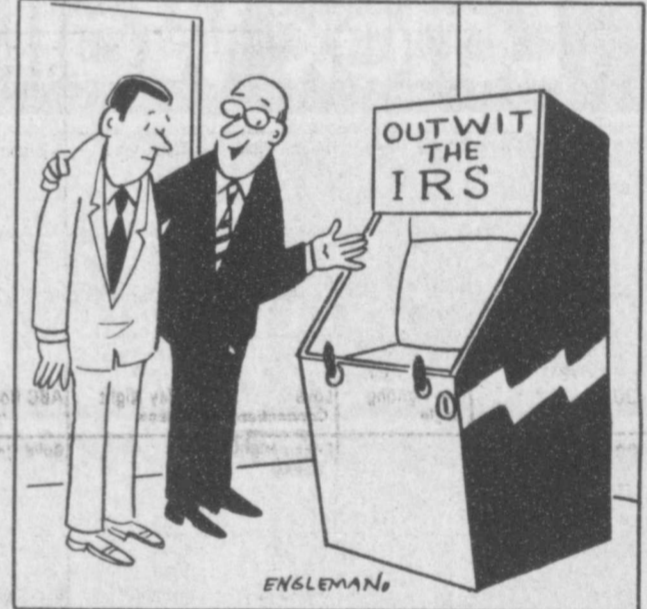

Old Newspaper Article Brings Memories

The following appeared in the May 28, 1937 Bogata News.

The grammar school auditorium was well filled Friday night, the occasion being the commencement exercises of the Bogata high school when 27 seniors received their diplomas, delivered by Superintendent F.L. Branson.

The program was as follows: Processional, Miss Ethellen Williams; Invocation, Walter McDavid; Salutatory, Miss Dorothy Pearl Hancock; Piano solo, John Paul Cooper; "Little Beginnings" Miss Mona Ray Shaw; Special song, Mrs. Virginia Pike and Curtis Latimer; Valedictory, Miss Dorothy Glover; Song by Seniors: Address by Mr. Fling; Presentation of diplomas by Supt. Branson; Benediction by T. L. Bryson; Recessional, Miss Ethellen Williams.

LAND PRODUCTIVITY VALUATION

MAY LOWER YOUR PROPERTY TAXES

The Texas Property Tax Code provides a form of tax relief for farmers and ranchers. If you qualify, your agricultural land will be taxed on its productive value rather than its market value. Productivity valuation may lower the 1985 taxes on your agricultural or open-space land.

If your land has never received open-space (1-d-1) valuation, or if your land has been receiving agricultural (1-d) valuation, you must apply to the appraisal district office before May 1 this year to get tax relief for 1985.

If your land received open-space (1-d-1) valuation in 1984, you will not need to reapply for 1985 unless required by the chief appraiser. Remember, however, that the law requires annual applications for agricultural (1-d) valuation.
