

Rodeo Time Is Here Once More

Frontier Days, Queens Race, Rodeo Highlights Big Weekend

A giant rodeo parade will kick off rodeo activities in downtown Bogata on Thursday, June 27 at 5 p.m. at Kisser's Grocery. The rodeo, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, will begin at 8:30 nightly at the Bogata fairgrounds arena.

Advance tickets are available from the rodeo princess candidates. Ticket prices are \$3.00 advance, \$3.50 at the gate for adults; and \$2.50 for 12 and under, preschool are free.

Bonnie Eloise Williams, trick riding expert, will entertain the fans at each rodeo performance with superb trick riding exhibition along with a comical routine where she roman rides two miles over high jumps, dressed as Raggedy Ann.

The Arego Riders 4-H Horse Club will set pivots each night of the rodeo and ride in the parade. The club was formed four months ago of students in the Deport, Detroit, Bogata, Clarksville and Fulbright areas under the leadership of Sammy and Betty Woodall and Luke and Dee Crayton.

The Bogata Rodeo is a Dodge Series Rodeo and is sanctioned by the Cowboys Regional Rodeo Association.

Hiner, who was injured just after winning the '84 championship, has been out of competition until the first of June and will be trying to crack into the Top 15 standings to qualify for the 1985 Finals to be held in Ft. Smith, AR.

Five time bareback riding champion Jim Martin of Canadian, TX has

entered the Bogata rodeo on the final performance.

The 1984 CRRA Rookie of the Year, Scot Mitchell of Lake Creek, TX has entered the bareback riding event on the opening night of the Bogata rodeo. Also entered on Thursday is David Worden of Cooper, TX, perennial finalist in the Cowboys Regional

Rodeo Association.

Local favorite Casey Jeffrey, first year saddle bronc rider, is entered in his hometown rodeo on Saturday night.

In the bull riding competition, the 1984 Bull Riding Champion of the CRRA, Steve Gann of Tulsa, OK has drawn up to compete in Friday

night's performance. The 1981 and 1983 Bull Riding Champion, Gary Hiner, now of Avery, TX, is scheduled to compete on Saturday.

Kirby Brumble of Coweta, OK who is leading the steer wrestlers in the Dodge Rodeo Series, has entered the Bogata rodeo on Saturday night, along with the 1984 Steer Wrestling

Champion, Eldon Day of Beggs, OK. Pete Belcher of Cuthand, TX, former all-around cowboy and many years a pickup man in rodeo, has entered the steer wrestling at Bogata on Saturday, also.

Perennial Cowgirls Barrel Racing Champion, Kelly Allred Ray of Lavaca, AR will compete at the

Bogata rodeo on Friday night.

With the calibre of contestants entered in this year's rodeo, all indications point to an outstanding, action packed rodeo performance every night.

Everyone is invited to come to Bogata on Saturday, June 29 for the festivities.

They will be taking work orders until July 5 and 6 at the water tower behind the First Baptist Church. Customers will pay a \$25.00 installation fee when work orders are placed and work orders will be on first come, first served basis.

Basic cable, which covers eight channels, will be \$15.00 per month and

if a customer wants the movie channel, that will be \$12.00 extra. For senior citizens 65 and over, a 10% discount will be given.

Owners Brad Mangrum and Monty Mangrum said they had built a new cable system in Bogata and have recently completed the Detroit-Blossom trunkline system. They are experienced in cable construction and feel that Talco will have a good quality system when finished in the third and fourth weeks of July.

I had some difficulty in getting them up to the lumber pile, but finally made it and with the help of a yard

We had loaded only a few pieces when it became twelve o'clock noon. The fireman blew the whistle and shut the engine down. It became very quiet and the team became less agitated, then the safety valve on the boiler popped off and steam began to escape with a deafening hissing roar.

That was more than the mules could stand. They ran away with the wagon and scattered lumber as they went. It took the mill hands a good part of their noon hour to get the team and wagon back to the millyard and loaded.

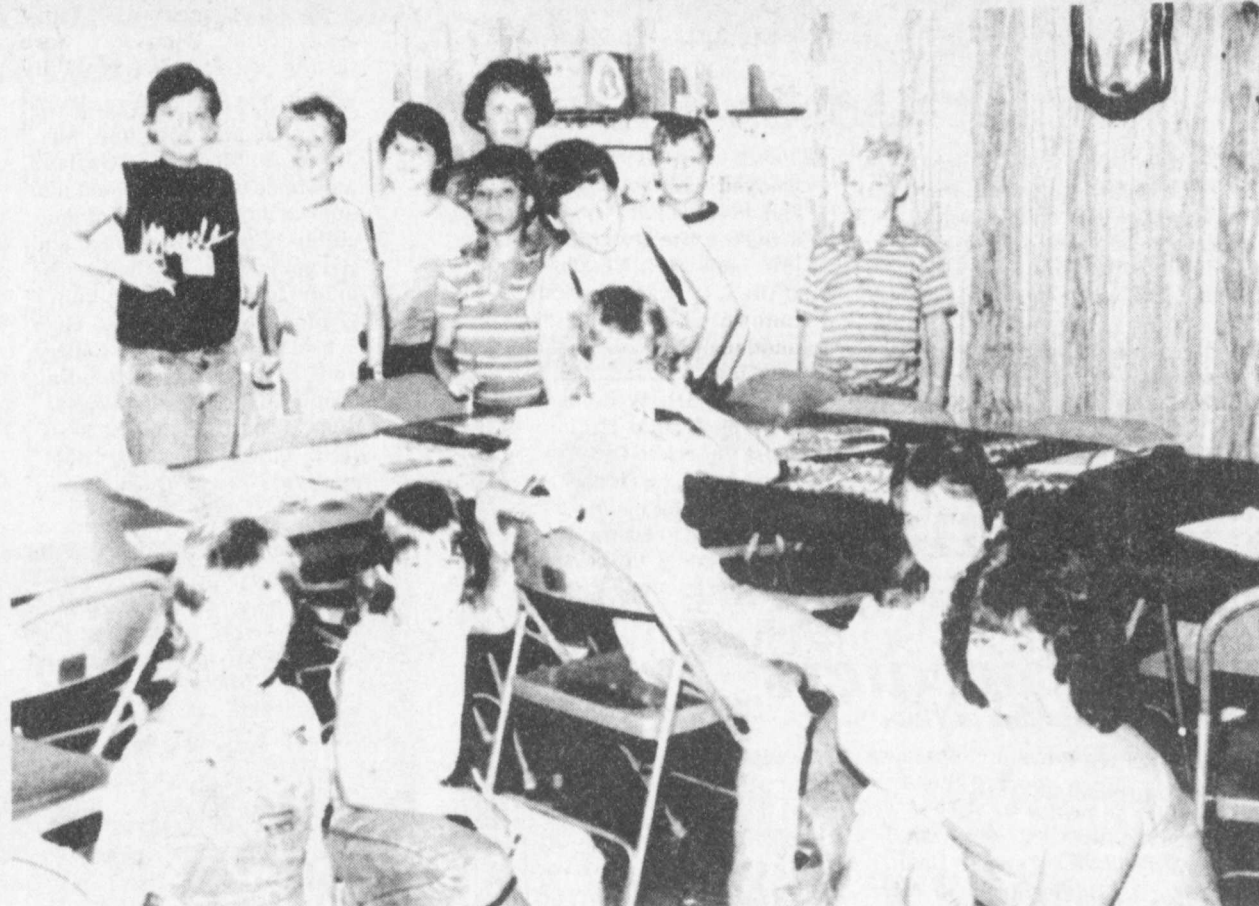
The meeting next year will be held in Washington, D.C. and the messengers voted to invite President Ronald Reagan to address the group.

Down The Nile, A Strange Land

The sun wasn't quite up the morning we left Cairo airport for Aswan. That meant that it was around 4 a.m., and for us, it seemed way to early. The four hour flight showed little out the window but the desert sands, and the ever present, ever beautiful river.

Aswan airport had one concrete runway, and a terminal with no air conditioning. When the baggage was unloaded from the plane, we went out with the rest of the crowd and dragged our suitcases from the pile on the cart.

We found that it would be about five hours before the boat we were to cruise the Nile on docked, so, needing to kill some time, our guide took us for a boat ride up the Nile and onto an island.

A boy met us there, and we hiked back into the hills and mountains for a long, long way in order to look at hieroglyphs carved into the tumbled rock faces. They were strangely beautiful, and a climb to the very top of one mountain rewarded hot and thirsty climbers with a view of the entire world for miles and miles around.

Then we hiked back down to the hot, deep sands, and visited the boy's village.

It was there that the astonishing poverty, and dignity of the common Egyptian really came home to us.

We visited in the home of the sheriff, one of the richer people in the village.

He was rich by reason of having two ancient refrigerators sitting in the

main room of his home.

Clean enough, there was no furniture in the entire house except for an ancient table, one old bed frame, and some stuffed sacks of cotton for sitting on.

The women, notified by an instant village grapevine, soon appeared to present their babies.

Sensing that Jayne was the one crazy about youngsters, they soon had surrounded her, showing her their dar eyed, long lashed children.

She spoke no Arabic, but no English, but the common bond of mothers leveled the barriers quickly, and they were all nodding, smiling and cooing within minutes.

We were served scalding hot tea, with about a half inch of grounds in the bottom, in tall glasses.

We put thoughts of germs behind us and drank and smiled and nodded that it was good.

Our courage didn't quite extend to refills, though.

The children had no toys, in fact, we never saw a toy the entire time we were in Egypt. They have no shoes, little education, and their biggest occupation is playing in the river.

They tend to swim like little fish, and bend over to drink out of the water much as puppies do, not using hands at all.

Yet they are happy children, laughing and smiling.

As our ship cruised the waters, they ran to the edge of the river waving and shouting happily, "Hallo, Hallo"

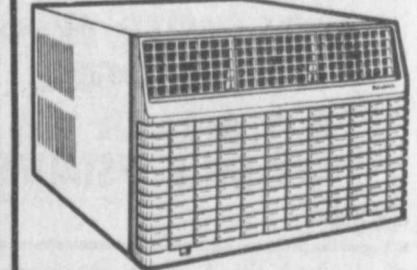
