

PJC Schedules Fun Courses

For the fifth summer, Paris Junior College has scheduled summer short courses for area youth. This year, the college has added classes for high school age students and for other adults, explained June Jones.

The summer program, entitled 'Summer Can Be Fun at PJC", will include courses in art, music, reading, Spanish, puppet theater, chess, microcomputer, math, wildlife, tennis and etiquette for those from age four through the eighth grade. These courses will be offered during a three-week period from June 9-27

Also scheduled are varied classes for high school age students and adults in basic drawing, water color, chess, drivers education, health occupatins career opportunities, microcomputer, photography, prealgebra, scuba diving, sign language. speed reading, tennis, study and test taking skills, these courses will be at different times the last of May and in June

Registration will be Tuesday, May 27 from 1 to 6 p.m. in the Alford Center on the PJC campus. Course descriptions will be available at the registration. Classes are arranged so that various age groups take classes from 8:30 to 10 a.m. and from 10:15 to 11:45 a.m. in the mornings or from 1 to 2:30 p.m. and 2:30 to 4 p.m. in the afternoons on Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday during the three weeks.

Classes for those 4-5 years of age include reading aloud, Spanish, art and music. Wildlife classes are scheduled for those in kindergarten through the second grade while art, music and reading are also planned for those in grades one and two. Math magic classes will be taught for those in grades two and three or for those in grades four and five.

For students in grades three through five, classes scheduled are computer I and II, art, music, art appreciation, Spanish, etiquette, tennis, wildlife and reading takes us everywhee.
