Insects On The Move

Insects are on the move throughout East Texas, says Dr. James Robinson, entomologist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. The pecan nut casebearer is appearing in pecan orchards. This insect is showing up earlier this year and some commercial producers have already sprayed and others are in the process.

Fire ants are prevalent again. Robinson says that it is probably not economical to treat the entire farm or ranch to control fire ants. However, treating around the home and barns may pay dividends. A few days after a rain is a good time to locate and treat new mounds.

Christmas tree producers should be on the lookout for pine tip moths. Either a systemic insecticide should be applied or spraying should be done when infestations are found. Control is critical, especially in trees that will be marketed this year.

Fleas and ticks are common on pets and around the house and yards. Sprays, dusts and dips are effective control methods. The pet as well as the premises must be treated. Several applications of the insecticide may be needed for desirable control.

Vegetable gardens are also being invaded by numerous pests. Aphids are common on many vegetables. Effective control can be attained by using malathion. Loopers on cabbage and

broccoli can be controlled by using the biological material bacillus thuringiensis, commonly called BT. Treatment for squash bugs should be started. Fifty percent wettable powder Sevin sprayed around the base of the plant and on the plant should give control.



Freeze-Up
Air conditioners occasionally freeze up. Most room air conditioners will not operate properly if the outside temperature drops below 65 degrees. Other causes of icing include a dirty filter, fan speed too low or running unit at a very cold setting for too long.
