

# Clements Defeats White For Governor

Titus County voters, more or less, followed the statewide trend as they elected officials in the Tuesday, November 4 general election.

Bill Clements will become the new Governor, defeating incumbent Mark White. However, Titus Countians voted for White, 3,290 votes to Clements' 2,688 votes.

Write-in candidate Charles Lee received one vote.

Unopposed U.S. Representative Jim Chapman received 4,065 votes. Lieutenant Governor Bill Hobby received 4,095 votes to Republican David Davidson's 527 votes.

Attorney General Jim Maddox received 3,876 votes to Roy Barrera Jr.'s 1,858 votes.

State Comptroller of Public Accounts Bob Bullock received 4,566 votes and treasurer Ann Richards

received 4,487 votes.

Commissioner Garry Mauro received 4,285 votes to M.D. Anderson Jr.'s 1,351 votes.

In Titus County, for Commissioner of Agriculture, Jim Hightower received 4,025 votes to Bill Powers' 1,586. For Railroad Commissioner, John Sharp received 3,978 votes to Milton E. Fox' 1,454.

Oscar Mauzy received 3,846 votes to Charles Ben Howell's 1,628. Place II, Campbell received 3,833 votes to White's 1,540. In Place III, Wallace received 4,320 votes and Place IV saw Gonzalez receiving 3,614 to Bates' 1,794.

In the Judge for Court of Criminal Appeals, Place II, Duncan received 4,247 votes to McCormick's 4,253. Place III in the Court of Criminal Ap-

peals Judge race found Marvin Teague receiving 4,224 votes.

The District 8 State Representative Sam Russell, who was unopposed received 4,674 votes.

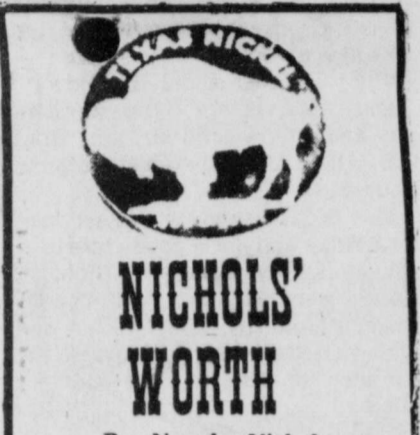
Chief Justice Court of Appeals District 6 William Cornelius received 4,238 votes.

## Rebels Lose To Bulldogs 55-0

The Cooper Bulldogs came calling last Friday night and made Halloween 1986 a night everyone would like to forget. The Rebels wound up on the short end of a 55-0 contest, but never came up short on effort as they had one of their best offensive games of the season.

The Rebs won the coin toss, but opted to kick. An inside kick attempt failed and the Bulldogs had the ball on the 50. The much heralded duo of Chris Carter and Bart Tatum wasted little time establishing dominance by marching 50 yards in nine plays.

Quarterback Jason Holcomb carried the ball in from the 1-yard line. The point after attempt was good giving the Bulldogs an early 7-0 lead. Rebel back Amos Brown returned the ensuing kickoff 17 yards to the 37-yard line.

The Rebels combined the running of Brad Woods and Amos Brown to move the ball to the Cooper 20-yard line before giving up the ball on downs. Cooper wasted little time here as quarterback Jason Holcomb connected with Byron Morris for a 75-yard TD on a second down play. The extra point made it a 14-0 game midway through the first quarter.

Rivercrest took possession on the 36-yard line following a 15 yard return by Justin Roach. The Rebels managed two first downs for this series before the Bulldog defense forced the ball over on downs again.

Cooper took over on their own 43-yard line and once again gained massive chunks of yardage via Carter and Tatum. Carter carried the ball in for the score. The extra point gave Cooper a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter.

Rebel Chris Anderson fumbled the kick off and Cooper recovered on the Rebel's 20. Two plays later, Rebel defender Wesley Hood recovered a Bulldog fumble on the 9-yard line. A tough Bulldog defense forced the first punt of the evening as the Rebs could not muster any offense. Cooper took possession on the Rebel 45, following a 37-yard punt by Brad Woods. Cooper used a combination of passing and running to find the endzone for their fourth TD of the game. The half ended with Cooper 28 and Rivercrest 0. The Rebels opened the second half

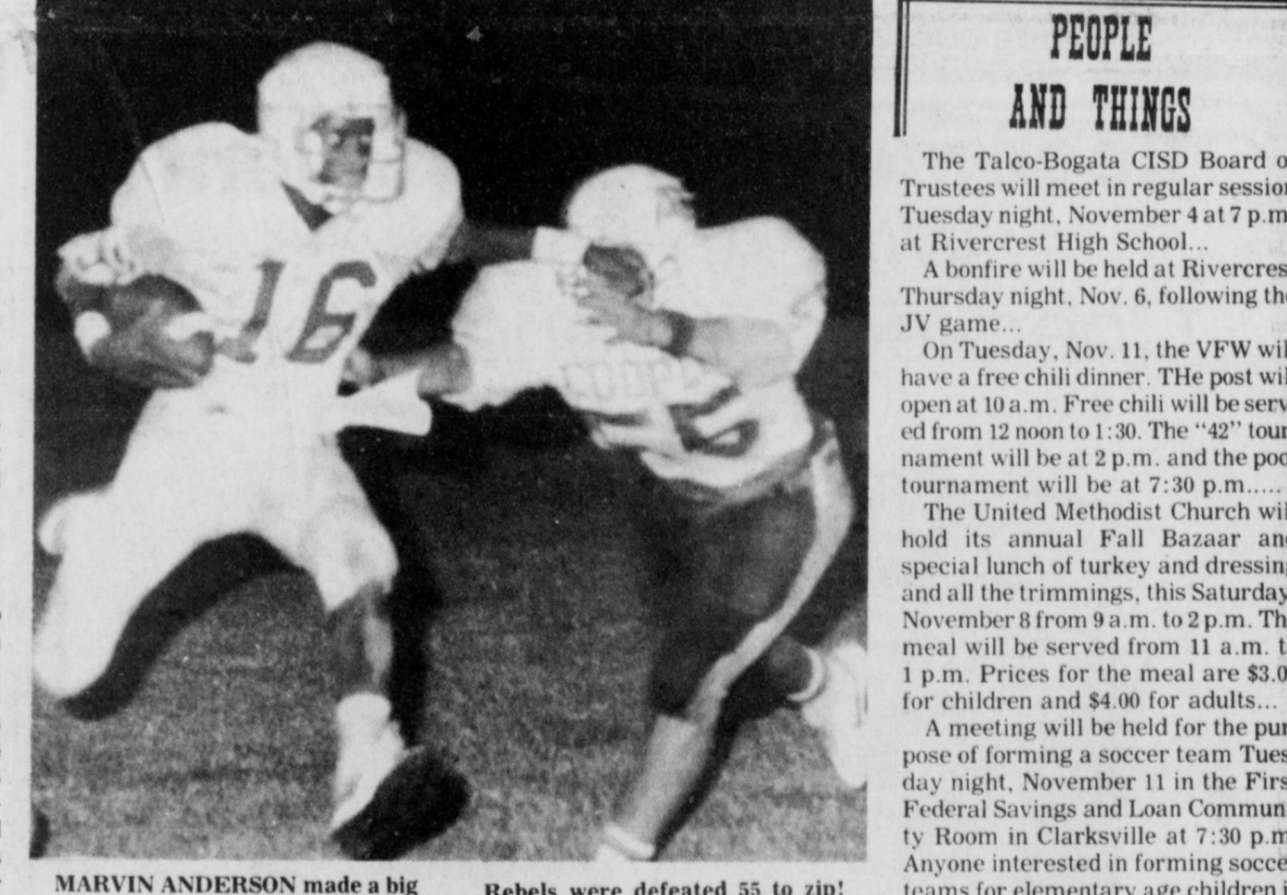
