It apparently touched down again at the home of the Mac Webbs, destroying two large trees and damaging a garage and the house itself.

From there, it heavily damaged a hay barn belonging to Fred Swint of Deport. The huge structure, once a cotton storage warehouse, contained approximately 20,000 square bales of hay, and received serious damage. Across Highway 271, the twister slammed into the Quickie Superette Grocery, where the largest property loss occurred. The Quickie Superette exploded, with the back wall blowing out and the roof collapsing.

Several pieces of two by four lumber from the adjacent barn were

speared completely through the front wall of the building, giving mute testimony to the awesome power of the tornado.

Another barn, this one belonging to Larry Whittle of Deport, was completely destroyed during the storm. The twister followed closely the

same path as a previous tornado, which occurred on April 25, 1982, and destroyed several barns.

High winds and torrential rains accompanied the massive storm pattern which swept through the northeast Texas area, and these "straight" winds tore sheet metal and shingles loose, too. Power crews worked through the dark to re-establish electricity to Deport, which had a power outtage of a four hour duration.
