VCR's are yet another wonder. Who would have thought that the day would come when a tiny, hand held camera could record sound and picture then have it ready for instant playing on an ordinary television set?

In spite of the problems of modern technology, in spite of the fact that occasionally developments happen at bewildering speed, we live in a world surrounded by convenience and things that are nearly miraculous.

And think, in the future what we consider the height of modern abilities will be as outdated as the old-fashioned crank phone is today!

Rain Relieves, More Needed

Two thunderstorms which left behind about 79 one-hundredths of an inch of rain provided welcome relief from what area farmers were already calling a drought.

Records were set during the month of April for both low rainfall and extreme heat, with several days being in the middle 90 degree range.

The moisture that has fallen still leaves things short however, and hopes for more rain continue.

To go along with the lack of rain and high heat, insects have done heavy damage to milo crops, and a number of farmers have begun replanting, both because of the insects and because there was just enough moisture to sprout seeds, but not enough to allow the seedling to live.

The added expense of replanting will make hopes for a profit even dimmer, as farm prices show little sign of increasing.

Wheat farmers are discovering that the late, hard freeze experienced in

the last days of March has affected their yields, and the freeze worsened leaf rust, already a factor in diminishing yields.

Cattlemen, however, are experiencing higher cattle prices and following the mild winter, when little feeding was necessary, hope to recoup some of the past few year's bad prices.

Long range weather forecasters are cautious about predicting whether rain and normal temperatures will occur on schedule this late spring and early summer, since indications of the past few months seem to point

toward drier, hotter conditions.

In the meanwhile, those with an eye for beauty might consider taking a drive through the back roads and country lanes to view the profusion of brilliant wildflowers brought out by the recent moisture.

Local Student Wins Contest

Michael House, son of Rev. and Mrs. Gary House of Talco, has been named winner in the Annual Youth Trip Contest sponsored by the Lamar County Electric Cooperative Association. The results were determined Friday, May 1 in the judging of eight finalists at a dinner given by the Cooperative at El Chico Restaurant in Paris. Special guests at the dinner were the contestants, their parents and school sponsors. Mrs. Barbara Russell, English teacher at Rivercrest High School, accompanied the House family.

The Rivercrest High School senior will enjoy a thirteen day, all expense paid trip to the nation's Capitol. On June 10, House will join other winners in Austin, and they will travel by bus, returning on June 23. Two winners, a boy and a girl, from each participating cooperative were named. Deanna Varner of Bogata, also a senior at RHS, was named first runner-up in the girls division of the contest.

Entry to the contest originated in Mrs. Russell's English classes through submission of an essay entitled "The Conveniences of Electricity, the Dangers Thereof". 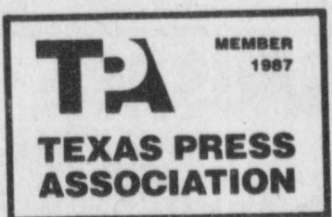
Upon being named a finalist, Michael received a list of questions detailing the work of the electric cooperatives and also included some

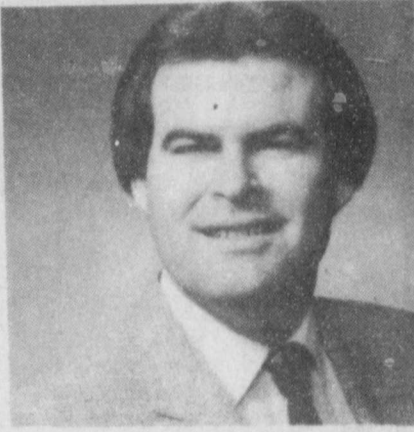
Freeman To Minister At Assembly Of God Church
