Cold Snap Damaging Tender Buds

Mother Nature has done it again. freezing temperatures. After 70 degree days with mild nights, the thermometer is once more plunging into the twenties during bitter, ice crusted nights, and damaging fruit and produce.

For the second year in a row, fruit trees and shrubbery, flowers and trees have begun to bud out during a lengthy warm spell, only to be hit with

If the weather forecast for the latter part of the week holds correct, the temperatures may well fall even lower, into the "teens", a guarantee of damage to most tender, just blossoming plants. There is even the possibility of some precipitation, which could cause some icing. Over-eager gardeners, weary of being housebound after a long, cold winter, have been planting diligently. Some of their work will have to be redone

The freeze shouldn't be as bad as the one in the spring of 1987, because oaks and other large trees have not yet begun to leaf out. Perhaps, if the cold trend breaks, damage to pecans and other nut trees can be avoided.

Residents already becoming climitized to warmer temperatures have dragged on heavy coats as a cold wind sent them shivering back to stoves and wood heaters. In spite of the cold, the sun has been deceptively bright, giving the appearance of things being warmer than they real-

ly are. Some ranchers are experiencing a hay shortage, and pasturage is only marginal in providing enough grazing. Houseplant gardeners, tired of the

crowd of potted plants in living rooms, have been rushing onto porches and patios to rescue tender indoor plants from the cold.

It's nothing unusual, just a typical East Texas spring.

was looking at a magazine and saw a picture of some wooden hearts with decorative paintings. She told herself, "I can do that". She then gathered the necessary materials and began her work. She admitted that the first hearts she made were terrible, but she enrolled in decorative painting classes and kept working until she was able to produce satisfactory work. She still takes lessons to improve her skills and to learn new ideas and techniques. She has recently finished a weeks workshop in Arkansas on wood crafts and decorative painting and is presently taking elssons at Reflections in Paris. Elaine's husband, Vandy, helps on his days off from his job at Texas Utilities. He cuts the crafts from patterns with a band saw and uses a flat sander and a small belt sander to smooth the edges. Their daughter, Kara, age 6, also helps with the family business. She especially enjoys helping her mother show the crafts.

Elaine said that soon after she began making and painting the crafts, her house became so full of them that they decided it was time to expand by

providing a special shop to display the crafts. The shop is located next to their home on S. Douglas Street in Bogata. They display their crafts at bazaars, arts and crafts shows, and Frontier Day in Bogata each year. Elaine also gives lessons in making the crafts.

Elaine says that she's tried many different craft projects and usually tired of them within a short period of time, however, she's never lost her interest in woodcrafts. By examining the workmanship of her crafts, it's easy to see that Elaine takes great pride in her work and that she has mastered the art of woodcrafting.

Fewer persons died on Texas older." streets and highways during 1987 than in any year since 1976, according to the Department of Public Safety.

The Texas traffic death total for 1987 was 3,261, a decrease of 8.6 percent from the 3,568 deaths recorded in the state during 1986, according to DPS Director Col. Leo Gossett.,

Another way of measuring traffic safety is to calculate the number of deaths for each 100 million miles traveled. Although the miles driven increased slightly over last year, the rate dropped to 2.2 deaths per 100 million miles traveled, the lowest mileage death rate in Texas history.

The record year for traffic deaths in Texas was 1981, when 4,701 persons were killed.

Gossett said the principal goal of Texas traffic law enforcement is to discourage dangerous driving practices and reduce the probability of fatal crashes occurring

"The efforts of our troopers, along with the other Texas law enforcement agencies, in the enforcement of the DWI, speed and safety belt laws, have contributed to this decline in traffic deaths," Gossett added. "Our challenge is to maintain a high level of seat belt usage as the law grows

Hoyle Ladd Was WWII Hero

When Hovle Ladd was alive, he refused to consider himself a hero. "I had a job to do, I did it and I came home" was his standard statement.

Hoyle did a great deal more than just a job in World War II. he was one of two "Yanks" who witnessed the surrender of a German town.

The surrender of Lubz was incidental to "one of the most fantastic episodes of the war" as a Reader's Digest article written by Captain William A. Knowlton attested. The article, entitled "Your Mission

Is To Contact The Russians" relates how an all but unbelievable bluff through the German lines was perpetrated, only Sergeant Ladd accompanied Knowlton when the surrender was offered. It appeared in the August, 1945, issue.

The rest of the troop had been sent back to seek radio contact outside town when a German major and the Burgomeister of Lubz met the two

Americans and surrendered the town. Ladd was the son of Mrs. Carl Ladd of Deport, and graduated from high school in Deport before entering the

The story is lengthy, but fascinating. An article also appeared in the Paris News shortly after.

But perhaps the most recent recitation of the story was received from William Kowlton on February 27, 1988 when Ladd's widow received the following letter: Dear George Rachel,

It was a shock for Peggy and me to learn of Hoyle's death, even though we knew he had not been well for some time. We thank you for letting us know. I shall let the gang from the 7th Armored know as well, and we send you our deepest sympathy.

Hoyle was a great soldier, to whom I owe much. When we were at Fort Benning, and I was in "E" Troop, I was one of a panel convened to look into who the next First Sergeant of "B" Troop should b. We unanimously decided on a very qualified Platoon Sergeant named Hoyle Ladd. Little did I know that I would live to have that decision repaid a hundred fold.

On 31 December, 1944, at midnight, I took over what was left of "B" Troop. The line platoons had been cut off on the hill outside St. Vith. The headquarters platoon would have suffered the same fate in the town had not Hoyle reached back into his platoon sergeant skills and led them out through the German lines in an amazing display of military professionalism. He won a Bronze Star for that effort, which saved so many lives. After the War, Bruce Clarke learned that Hoyle had received only a Bronze Star (I had a little clout as a first lieutenant) and wanted to change it to a Silver Star for gallantry in action, but in a typical, selfdeprecating way, Hoyle said that he was pleased to be remembered and not to bother with the Silver Star.

Originally, Hoyle and I and a Tank Company lieutenant named Jim Shelton (who was loaned to me) had to run and rebuild the troop together, until we got some more officers. With little experience in a reconnaissance troop, I relied heavily on Hoyle, and always treated him as another commissioned officer. My successor, who commanded the troop for a few months until he was wounded and I took over again, never understood that relationship. But Hoyle was really my right arm. Our country owes much to him.

Then he did the country another service when he got young Eddy Jones interested in West Point. Eddy was followed by another lad from Newport who, unfortunately, did not last. But Eddy has done very well. So, in a sense, Hoyle's military contribution continues with me and with Eddy. He had a hand in educating us

The country has lost a man who contributed much to its security. And we have lost a friend; we grieve with you. But we are grateful that he lived as long as he did and departed among family and those close to him. Please do not bother to answer this;

you will have enough to do. But I did not want to know that your sense of loss will be shared by many others. Peggy jons me in our best to you for

If you qualify, your agricultural land will be taxed on its capacity to produce crops, livestock, or timber, instead of its value on the real estate market. Productivity valuation can lower the taxable value of your land, and lower your property taxes as a result.

If your land has never received productivity valuation, you must apply to the appraisal district by May 2 to get tax benefits for 1988. You can choose from two types of productivity

If your land already receives open-space or timber (1- d-1) valuation, you don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to. But remember, you must apply every year for ag-use (1-d) valuation.
