Abnormal Spring Results In Drought

While some areas of the state floundered under too much rain, the majority of the state, and much of the nation has had to watch as crops and water sources burned up and dried

Throughout North East Texas cattlemen have eyed dwindling pasture and hay meadows producing less that fifty percent of their normal yield

while farmers have had to replant for as two inches of rain as several thunlack of moisture, many having the second, and expensive, planting fail to make a good stand either.

Cotton, always the best of dry weather crops, will shortly be in desperate need of moisture, while soy beans and milo are already in dire

Some fields have received as much

derstorms have swept through the area, but the size of the rained on area is sparse and spread over a wide number of counties.

April and May were record setting for their lack of rainfall. The usual moisture that is so crucial to grass, trees and every other growing thing did not arrive.

Meterologists have pointed ominously to the similarity of the existing weather patterns to that of 1980, which was one of the worst droughts of the century.

Even in '80, though, May was not as dry as this year.

So far relatively cooler temperatures have helped alleviate the problem, but with July fast approaching

temperatures are bound to increase. Deep soaking plants, gardens and

trees is recommended by experts. Shallow watering can actually do damage, causing root systems to stay close to the surface when they need to be deep.

Meanwhile there is little that can be done to change the situation expect watch weather reports and hope.
