Instead I spent four days confined to a hospital.

You know, those overpriced otels with no view, bad food, and eally strange house rules.

It's those house rules that get me. I mean, what can you do with a place that believes liquid fed to a patient through veins is perfectly adequate?

I'm convinced that these people are serving urine samples under the heading of "chicken broth". One whiff of that stuff when the lid comes off the bowl, and it's goodbye appetite!

And who ever convinced the hospital dieticians that Jello is going to appeal to folks three meals a day, day after day...especially since the stuff is about as edible as

For some reason all the rules of civilized behavior seem to fall by the wayside in a hospital.

No one feels the need to knock, they just breeze right in. They seldom close the door behind them, seeming to assume that one wants to be stared at by strangers passing down the hall while lying in bed taped, strapped, IV'd and sick as the proverbial cat.

I actually overheard someone (whom I shall presume was a doctor) asking this poor lady as she walked down the hall, "How are you today Mrs. Jones, those bowels still working okay? I'm sure the elderly patient was absolutely verjoyed to be asked such a ques-

Besides, no one asks personal, embarassing questions at home!

Wednesday, November 23, north of Clarksville.


