Walking For Fitness...Not A Fad!

Physical fitness, healthy eating, overall well-being...the phrases are in front of us all, from infants to the aged. And although no one exercise or diet is perfect for everyone one thing comes close...walking!

This is an age of physical fitness fetishes. The quest for muscle tone and youthfulness has become a multi-million dollar industry. Video tapes prescribing exercise programs for the elderly, for babies (no, it's not a joke) and for expectant mothers as well as run-of-the-mill exercise programs abound.

Almost everyone has invested in a stationary bicycle, a weight set, jogging outfit or some other item to help them become slimmer, trimmer and healthier.

But being an impatient species, most people ignore the dire warnings and overdo, leading to pain, soreness and even permanent injury as a result of overzealous attempts to get fit fast.

But walking requires almost no investment, no video tapes and no special equipment.

From a toddler to great-grandmother, walking is near-perfect.

While jogging places stress on joints, weight lifting certainly isn't for everyone, and exercise clubs are expensive, walking is available to just about everyone who can put one foot in front of the other.

Walking helps release a chemical in the brain that serves as a natural tranquilizer, serving to create a feeling of well-being.

Walking serves to lower blood pressure and heart rate, and builds muscles.

Where to walk? Well, options vary according to the environment. In the city there are usually walking tracks available, or walking and running paths in parks. In the coun-

try any farm to market road will do, as long as an eye is turned to watch for traffic.

Even small towns boast places to walk, constructing simple gravel

Like any exercise, walking should be worked into. Short walks that gradually lengthen are much better than beginning with a 5 mile hike that results in sore leg muscles. But even if soreness results, it's rare to ever do any damage, which makes it superior to jogging or running.

Naturally, walking doesn't burn up the enormous amount of calories that running does. But as an overall health promoter, it simply can't be beat!

Not enough exercise? Just work walking into the regular program. It keeps muscles limber and can contribute significantly to an overall healthy program.

Aside from comfortable walking shoes, no equipment is required for the pedestrian mode of physical fitness. Comfortable "sweats" are available though, as well as a range of specialized shoes ranging from \$15 to \$200!

Weather really needn't keep a dedicated walker in. Rain gear and warm clothing takes care of inclement conditions. In summer there is little danger of becoming too hot, a major advantage over other forms of exercise.

Walking is custom tailored. Want a leisurely relaxing time? Walk slowly, taking time to look around at the world.

Want to work up a sweat? Set out at a brisk pace and keep it up.

All in all this a period of physical fitness mania. But long after the exercise machines have become covered with dust, long after the health foods have become unpalatable, the habit of taking a walk for mental and physical well being will remain. It's a habit that can last a life time...and extend that lifetime too!

Beauty Pageant Set

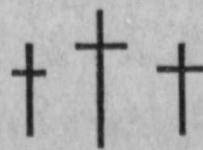
A Miss Ark-La-Tex Sweetheart beauty pageant will be held Saturday, March 4 at the Holiday Inn in Sulphur Springs.

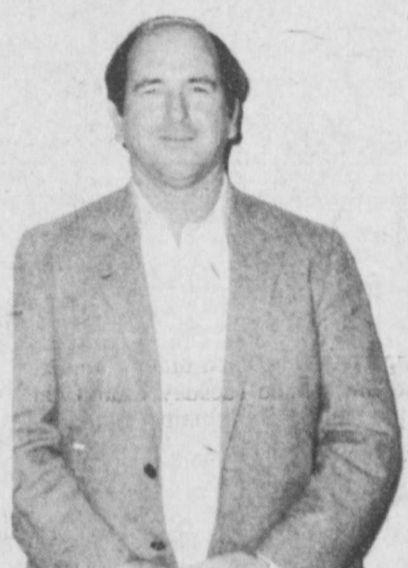

Two Die In Franklin County Plane Crash

Craig Bliss, age 39 of Mt. Vernon and Frank Edwin Pinkston, age 34, of White Oak, were killed at approximately 4:30 p.m. Thursday, February 23, when the small plane they were flying crashed.

Bliss reportedly was in the process of selling the recently rebuilt J3 Cub to Pinkston when the mishap occurred.

Preliminary reports state that the aircraft had been performing take-offs and landings earlier in the day and was in the pattern at Franklin County Airport when the right wing

of the aircraft broke loose from the fuselage and folded up over the top of the cockpit, rendering the plane unmaneuverable.

The plane landed in the inverted configuration approximately 1/4 mile west of the airport in a pasture in a pool of water.

Both men were pronounced dead at the scene and rescue workers from Titus County, DPS troopers and local citizens worked for over three hours removing the bodies from the wreckage and out of the crash site.

Scholarship Named In Memory Of Former Student

A scholarship fund in memory of paramedic Eddie Thomas has been established at Paris Junior College, according to Bobby Walters, president.

Thomas was electrocuted on May 30, 1988 while trying to rescue a victim of an automobile accident near Lindale. In his memory, his family has established a scholarship fund to assist a paramedic student at PJC. The scholarship fund was created by Thomas' mother, Elanor Maddox, former Johnstown resident, and her husband, Ken; Thomas' sisters, Janie Barger, Patti Jenkins and Joy Negron; and the Campbell Soup Company (Mrs. Maddox' employer).

Thomas was a 1974 graduate of Paris High School, served six years in the U.S. Navy, and completed his paramedic training at PJC in August 1987. While attending PJC, he worked full time for an auto parts store in Paris.

Because of the demands on Thomas of working full time while going

to school were so great, the scholarship was established to help someone in a similar situation. "There were times when he was working full time in the auto parts store, going to school at night, and spending every possible hour he could on weekends at the hospitals doing his clinical (laboratory) hours," said Mrs. Maddox. "I thought if we established a scholarship, that maybe another student might be able to go to school without having to work full time."

The scholarships will be awarded to students based on need and also on motivation, she said.

The scholarship fund was also established as a tribute to Thomas, she said. "Eddie had so many friends around Paris, and I would like for them to know that he is not going to be forgotten."

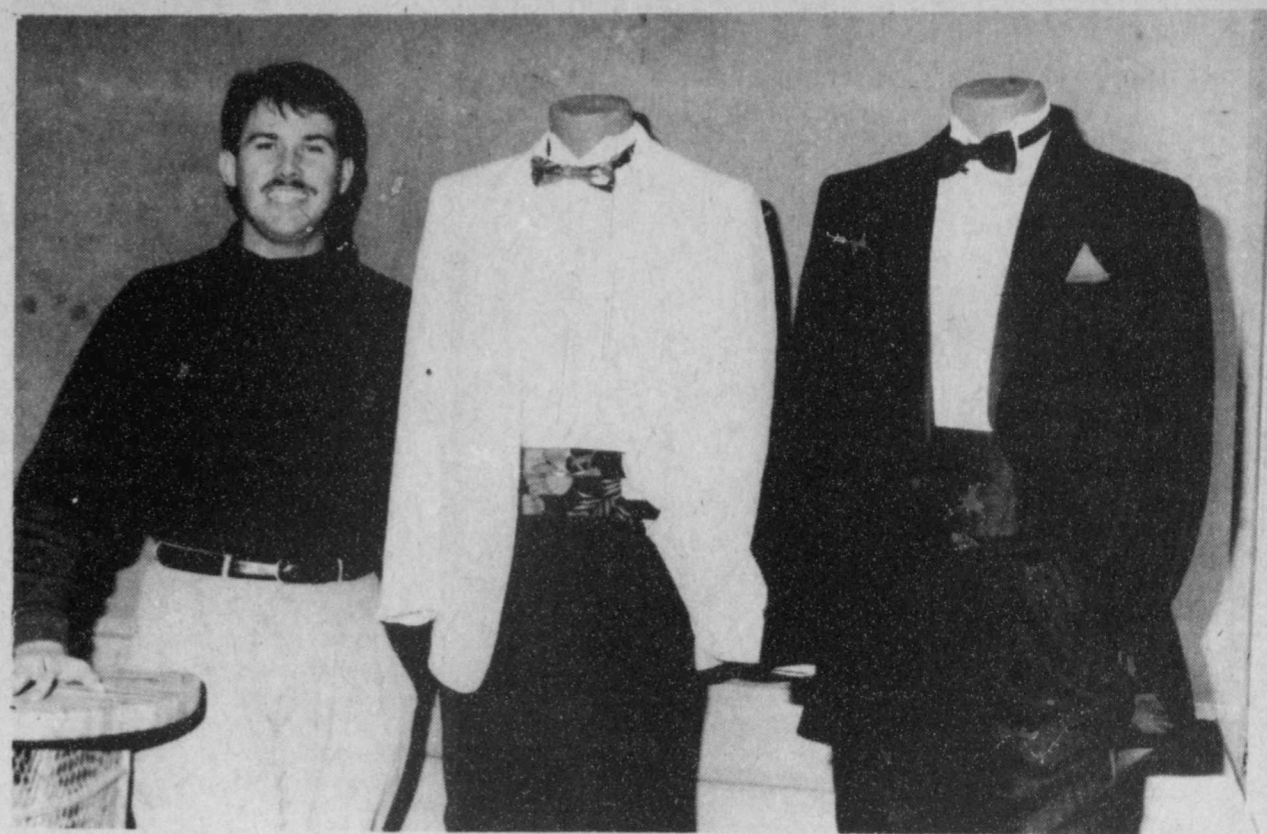

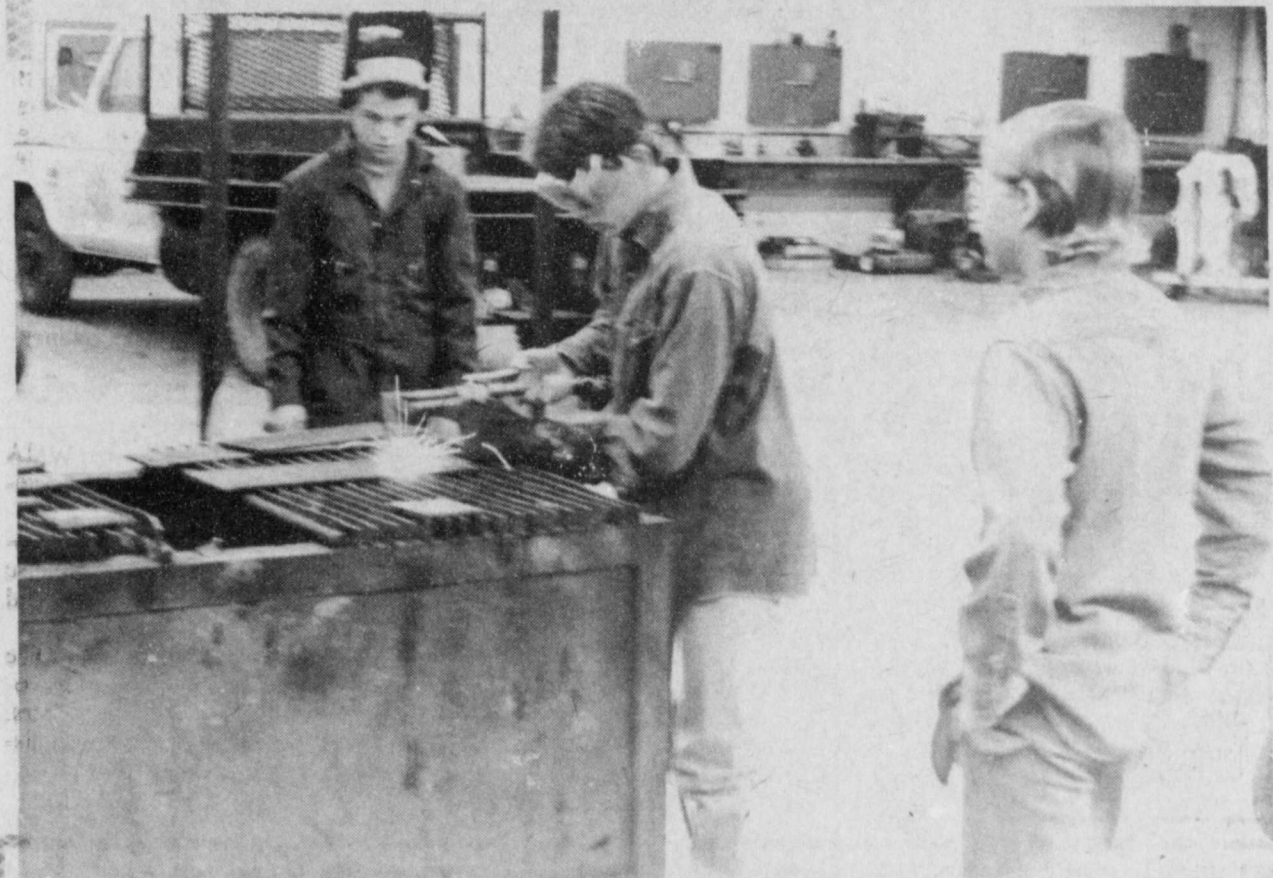

March Has Gardening Chores

With the arrival of March, spring cannot be too far away. But there can still be many days of winter-like weather before spring arrives for good in the Red River Valley.
Our last frost date is around March 25, but can be the first part of April. Hopefully, one will be able to determine the last frost as we approach the end of the month.
March will be extremely busy for the home gardener, as the bad weather in February has delayed many chores until this month. Fruit trees need to be pruned prior to emergence of blooms. If dormant oil is to be applied to fruit trees, wait until after pruning and sam on the amount of oil needed. Apply dormant oil when the weatherman is calling for a couple of days of warm weather in the 60 degree range.
Do not apply dormant oil to swollen buds. Some plum tree buds are at this stage at the present time. Spray the trunks of the trees, but not the bud area. Remember, dormant oil must

be diluted with water before applying to the tree.
All fruit trees should be sprayed with a fungicide in the pink bud stage. When flower petals begin to fall apply a fungicide plus an insecticide. The same combination should be repeated every 10 days to two weeks until about two weeks of harvest time.
Many peach trees last spring had peach leaf curl which causes the leaves to pucker change to a pinkish color and fall off. The proper time to prevent that condition this spring is during the bud swell period. A fungicide containing chlorothalonil should be used at the rate of one teaspoon per gallon of water.
Now is also the time to apply pre-emergence herbicide to lawns for control of grasses and weeds that come up from seed. These type herbicides must be in solution in the soil prior to the time the weeds emerge in the spring. So, the time to apply these herbicides is now.

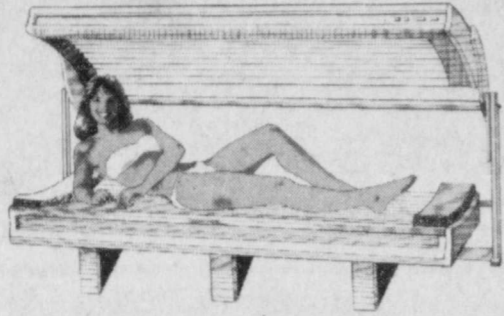
