## Top Hands Enter Bogata Rodeo Competition

When entries closed on Monday evening for the upcoming Bogata Rodeo, June 22-23-24, over 200 cowboys and cowgirls had entered the competition in the seven championship events sponsored this year at Bogata.

With added money increased to \$400.00 per event this year, sponsored by the Bogata Rodeo Association, the total purse is expected to exceed \$12,000.00, the largest payoff for the Bogata rodeo since 1985.

Scheduled to compete in the bareback riding is the 1986-88 C.R.R.A. Bareback Riding Champion, David Worden of Cooper, TX; and the 1987 C.R.R.A. Bareback Riding Champion Scot Mitchell of Lake Creek, TX. Worden leads the 1989 season for the title again this year. Ranked second in the championship standings is Rickey Rhodes of Talco, TX who will compete at the Bogata rodeo during the third performance.

The 1988 C.R.R.A. Saddle Bronc Riding Champion, Keith Morgan of Sapulpa, OK will be in competition on Friday evening, along with his wife, Juliana, who is the 1988 C.R.R.A. Barrel Racing Champion.

Other barrel racing hopefuls entered in the Bogata competition are

Ann Bateson of Texarkana, TX, the 1987 C.R.R.A. Champion; Cindy Billingsley of Wewoka, OK, the 1987 runner-up to the championship; and Connie Lynn Cooper of Broken Arrow, OK, current leader for the 1989 Barrel Racing Championship.

In steer wrestling, Kenneth Prater of Checotah, OK, the four time C.R.R.A. Steer Wrestling Champion will be entered in competition on the opening performance Thursday night, along with the current leader for the 1989 Steer Wrestling title, Willie Crooch of Boynton, OK.

Team ropers heading the list of entries are Paul Foreman of Barnsdall, OK, six time C.R.R.A. Team Roping Champion and current leader Todd Markham of Vinita, OK.

Bull riding will be an exciting event at the Bogata rodeo, as three-time champion David Wesson of Delaware, OK will be featured in the opening performance and the reigning Bull Riding Champion, Terry Don West of Henryetta, OK, will be competing in the final performance on Saturday night.

In addition to championship rodeo action, the Bogata rodeo will feature "Gizmo" the one-man show from

Branson, MO and three-time C.R.R.A. Bullfighter of the Year, Donny Sparks of Texarkana, TX.

The Arigo Riders 4-H Horse Club will be setting pivots two nights at the rodeo and the band "Texas Express" will be entertaining the rodeo audi-

ence nightly.

Two parades will be featured this year, one on Thursday afternoon and another on Saturday afternoon, through downtown Bogata.

On Thursday night, the annual Hub Whiteman drawing will be held for a \$100.00 savings bond and a calf

scramble will be held nightly for the youngsters attending the rodeo.

## Bogata Rodeo Bullfighter Likes His Job

What do you think would possess a young man with much higher than normal intelligence and a world of athletic ability, to be a bullfighter? Why would a guy want to put his physical being in jeopardy to save someone that, many times, he doesn't even know? Why would a guy want to be dragged around, hooked, run over and sometimes even worse, by a bull, just to save a bullrider's life?

Well, I don't know WHY, but I know WHO does....Donny Sparks from Texarkana, TX, that's who, and he loves his job.

Donny, now age 25, is actually one-half of the dynamic duo "Double Trouble", that thrilled rodeo audiences across the United States with their daring antics and life-saving feats. His twin brother, Ronny, who is 10 minutes younger than Donny, has slowed down some, since becoming a father last year and is pursuing other business interests.

But Donny has steadily gained momentum over the past several years, and has learned how to work alone, something that was hard for him at first. His most famous move is jumping over bulls that are charging

at him at full speed.

"I could trust my brother," Donny said. "He could always understand my moves, and I could depend on him being in the right spot when it counted." And "being in the right spot" when it comes to fighting bulls, is very critical.

Their rodeo history is not unlike that of many other successful bullfighters, however, their technique might have been a little unorthodox. "See," Donny quipped, "Ronny goes to the [bullfighting] schools, then he comes home and teaches me everything he learned. We save money that way!"

And like many others, their bullfighting began by accident. Ronny was attending a bull riding school, but there were no bullfighters. "I hung up to a bull, got my rear jerked around for about five minutes and broke my arm in the elbow," Ronny said. That was on the second day of the school. The third and fourth days of the school, Ronny, joined by Donny, fought bulls. And that's where it all began for the pair.

Injuries, oh yeah, there have been injuries. I guess there's not any one

"It's my job," said Donny. "And I've been fortunate enough in my life to have the ability to do what I love, and," he says with much humility and a deep sense of pride, "that I've been successful at it."

Though Donny didn't offer this piece of information, I know it is by far his most important and significant accomplishment to date.

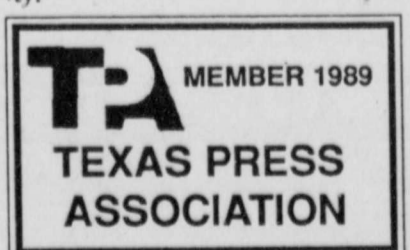
In 1988, Donny earned his PRCA bullfighting card and is currently leading the Wrangler Bullfighting Series for the world championship.

And I'm going to ditto what their parents said when they started fighting bulls, "Go for it!"

So, if you're late for the Bogata Rodeo one night and are approaching the arena while the bull riding is going on and happen to see someone flying through the air above the crowd, don't think a bull rider got thrown that high, it's just Donny Sparks, doing his job!

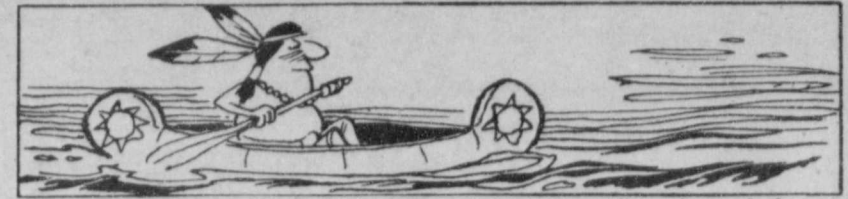

Statistics Rural Accident Released

Rural fatal traffic accidents in the 18-county Tyler Highway Patrol District decreased by 17% and deaths increased by 6% during the first four months of 1989, compared to the same period in 1988.

During the first four months of 1989, Highway Patrol Troopers investigated 1723 accidents in the district, including 38 fatal accidents that claimed 51 lives and 705 injury accidents that injured 1,094 persons. Property damage accidents totaled 981.

During the month of April, 1989, DPS Troopers investigated 379 accidents in the district including 11 fatal accidents that claimed 14 lives and 167 injury accidents that injured 272 persons. Property damage accidents totaled 201 during the month.

Captain Tony White, Tyler District Commander, stated "A six% increase in rural traffic deaths is always a matter for our concern. This is particularly true when the 17%

reduction in rural fatal accidents is considered. Although many factors are involved in fatal traffic accidents, fewer fatal accidents and more deaths indicate an increased accident severity rate which can be a result of higher speeds."

"The failure to wear safety belts continues to be a frequent factor in rural traffic deaths," noted Captain White. "Texas has had a say belt law since September 1, 1985, but in Texas last year, 76.3% of the persons killed in the front seat of cars and light trucks were reported as not wearing safety belts."

Rural accident statistics in the district by county for 1989 including the month of April are:

Red River: Yearly totals: 43 accidents, 2 deaths, 27 injuries. April totals: 7 accidents, 1 death, 3 injuries.

Titus: Yearly totals: 10 accidents, no deaths, 4 injuries. April totals: 10 accidents, no deaths, 4 injuries.
