## School Counts!!

It is that critical time again when all students are asked to attend school every day. This is the School Attendance Counting Period provided by the State of Texas. The Texas Legislature enacted a law in 1984 basing the Average Daily Attendance on the best four of eight weeks of student attendance. The first four weeks will begin October 2.

Students should be in school since research clearly reveals that low and failing grades are directly related to school non-attendance. Dropouts and potential dropouts exhibit a poorer attendance record than their classmates who continue and graduate from public schools.

A system of public schools is the cornerstone if a free society and educating is an art. The public schools in Texas belong to the citizens of this state. Although the public schools are not perfect, everyone should be proud of the school system. There are outstanding students and supportive parents, talented, caring teachers and administrators who are dedicated to educating all young citizens, and the community has elected members to the Board of Trustees who are recognized for their concern and leader-

As a result the cooperative efforts of these individuals, Taico-Bogata students are learning and achieving at high plateau. Creative teaching is the norm in the Talco-Bogata schools. It is unique in that it attracts quality applicants and when teachers are hired, their capabilities are looked at to teach the course, but also the type of relationship they might have with the students is looked at, whether they will be child or student oriented and whether they have a real desire

to be in the teaching profession. In Talco-Bogata schools, all students are winners and teachers know beyond a shadow of a doubt that they are makinga difference in the lives of

the children they touch. From a financial standpoint, approximatley \$3,719 per child will be spent during this school year. The State of Texas assists the district by alloting \$1,827 per child. This does not mean the school enrollment can be multiplied by \$1,827 to arrive at allotted funding. It means the \$1,827 per child is paid according to the Average Daily Attendance. This \$1,827 allotted for each child averages \$91.35 per day per child during this critical 20-day counting period. This means each day a child is absent during the counting period, the Talco-Bogata I.S.D. will lose \$91.35. If our attendance is low, this cost will ultimately be reflected back to the taxpayer or less school programs.



## Rivercrest Wins Homecoming 2

quarterback Shane Beers to senior Clint Tidwell during the Friday pep rally gave a greater emphasis to the Rebels '89 homecoming tussle with the Maud Cardinals. The Rebel squad played the game in honor of their injured teammate. Tidwell underwent knee surgery on Tuesday, following a season ending blow in last week's game. The Rebel squad made good on their pledge, with a dominating 21-7 win, their first of the year.

The Rebel seniors showed they meant business, as they led the total team effort. Senior fulback Marcus Savage and tailback Jeremy Abshier rushed for 173 of the team's 189 yards. Savage gained 103 yards on 20 calls, with another run of 74 yards erased by penalty, while Abshier moved to the tailback slot vacated by Tidwell, compiled 70 yards on 10 carries. Abshier was also on the receiving end of the only major completed pass of the game, a 65-yarder from quarterback Shane Beers late in the first half.

The play of the seniors in the trenches proved the difference in the contest. Senior center/linebacker Kevin Binion played the best game of his life as he recovered two Maud fumbles in the first four minutes of the encounter. The second came at the Maud 1-yard line, and followed a 41-yard coffin corner kick by freshman Tony Sanders.

With 8:19 to play in the quarter, Shane Beers took theball across the goal line on a quarterback keeper. Joshua Abshier added the PAT. Instant replay of that vignete unfolded

Those words of dedication from ers caught a 35-yarder which brushed the pylon near the goal line. Beers again dove into the endzone. The younger Abshier missed his first PAT attempt in two games, but with 3:19 to play in the quarter, the Rebels held 13-0 lead.

The Rebel defense so controlled the game, that Maud did not make a first down until the third quarter, and netted only three for the entire game. The bulk of Maud's 132 yards total offense came against the younger Rebels, junior varsity squadmen who were seeing their first action of th

The Rebels mounted an eleven play, 95-yard march to their final touchdown late in the third quarter. Due to heavy fog, the march was all on the ground, with Abshier and Savage alternating in carrying the ball. On the first play of the fourth quarter, Savage scored from the 1yard line. The offensive line led by seniors Chad Ingram and Joey Webb, along with Binion and junior Jesse Woods, played havoc with the Maud front four, allowing substantial gains through the holes they created.

Maud lost six fumbles on the night, due not to the wet conditions, but to the hard hitting of the Rebel defense. Junior Eric Cabell and David Davidson, together with linebacker Shane Beers and senior Jeremy Abshier simply shut down the Cardinal attack.

The Cardinal score came with 1:24 left to play as Aaron Slider ran around left end for two yards, then added the extra point.

It was an emotional scene for

five minutes later in the period. Sand- Rebel players, coaches and fans, when upon game's end, the game ball was presented by Jeremy Abshier to Tidwell, who had come to midfield on crutches.

Rivercrest Coach Terry Giddens evaluated the Rebel victory as a total team victory. "We made some mis-takes, resulting in some penalties, but all of those were due to the hustle of the players. A coach can never fault hustle and hard play."
Concerning this week's foe, Winns-

boro, who was trounced last week by Cooper 46-6, Giddens said "They run an option from the I set, which is led by their quarterback, who does an excellent job. However, he was reportedly injured in last week's game and his status for us is questionable." Giddens added that the Red Raiders ran primarioy an outside game. The Rebels will continue to make adjustments in their offensive scheme. "We plan to move Jeremy Abshier back to split end," said Giddens. "He does well at tailbackat the split end he is a six-point threat every time he touches the ball. We plan to use Marcus Savage as a primary runner, whifl senio Marc Teel and sophomores Joe Dellis and John Smith will see action at tailback.

"Because this is the final tune-up before District play, we have to have a good game. We have a good chance to win this one, if we play as well as we did against either Mt. Vernon or Prairiland, since Winsboro is not nearly as strong as th Purple Tigers, and about equal to the Patriots.
