more! Take a little time to enjoy the people, the decorations, the entire atmosphere. And remember what the celebration is about





½ cup low-fat margarine 1 egg, well beaten



week. Here a Rebel shoots over the head of a Mt. Vernon Tiger enroute to their victory. (Staff Photo by Gary House)


