The Deport Methodist Women will have food for sale at the lunch hour that Saturday, plus there will be arts and crafts booths.


Over the next few weeks this paper will be running more about who this interesting society was formed, and about some of their rules.





In the fourth quarter, Combs again tied the score at 33 all with 4:09 to play. After the Rebels stalled for over a minute. House scored what would prove to be the final Rebel points to post a 25-23 lead. 
