The night before there will be a big fund raiser stew supper, which volunteers from the communities will help with. The next morning the cooks will have a free breakfast.

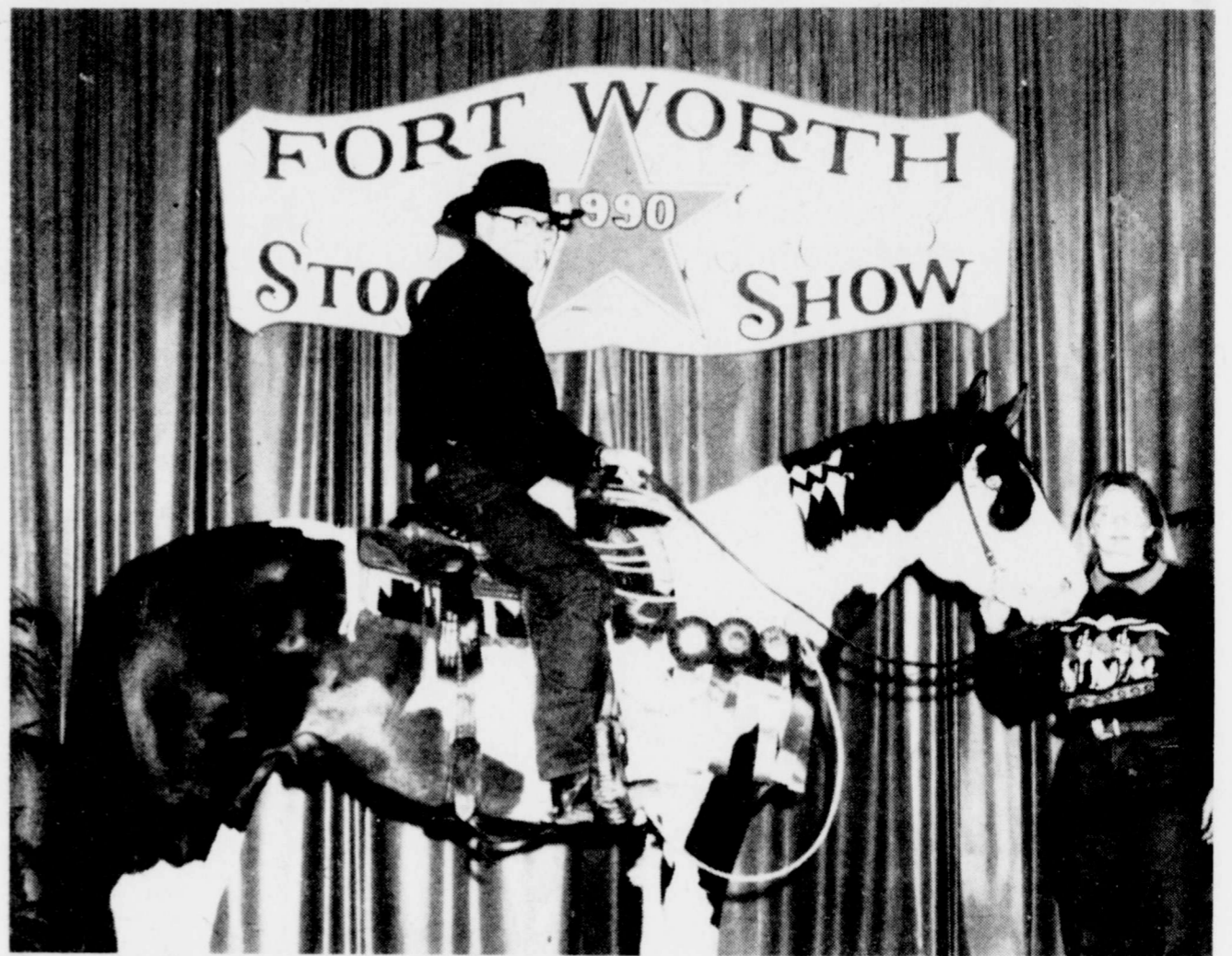
There will be a "people's choice" award, where visitors can purchase a tasting cup and try various chilis from the cooks. The most popular of those will receive the people's choice award.

World Show in Ft. Worth, which is the national competition. There were over a hundred participants in Mears' division then.

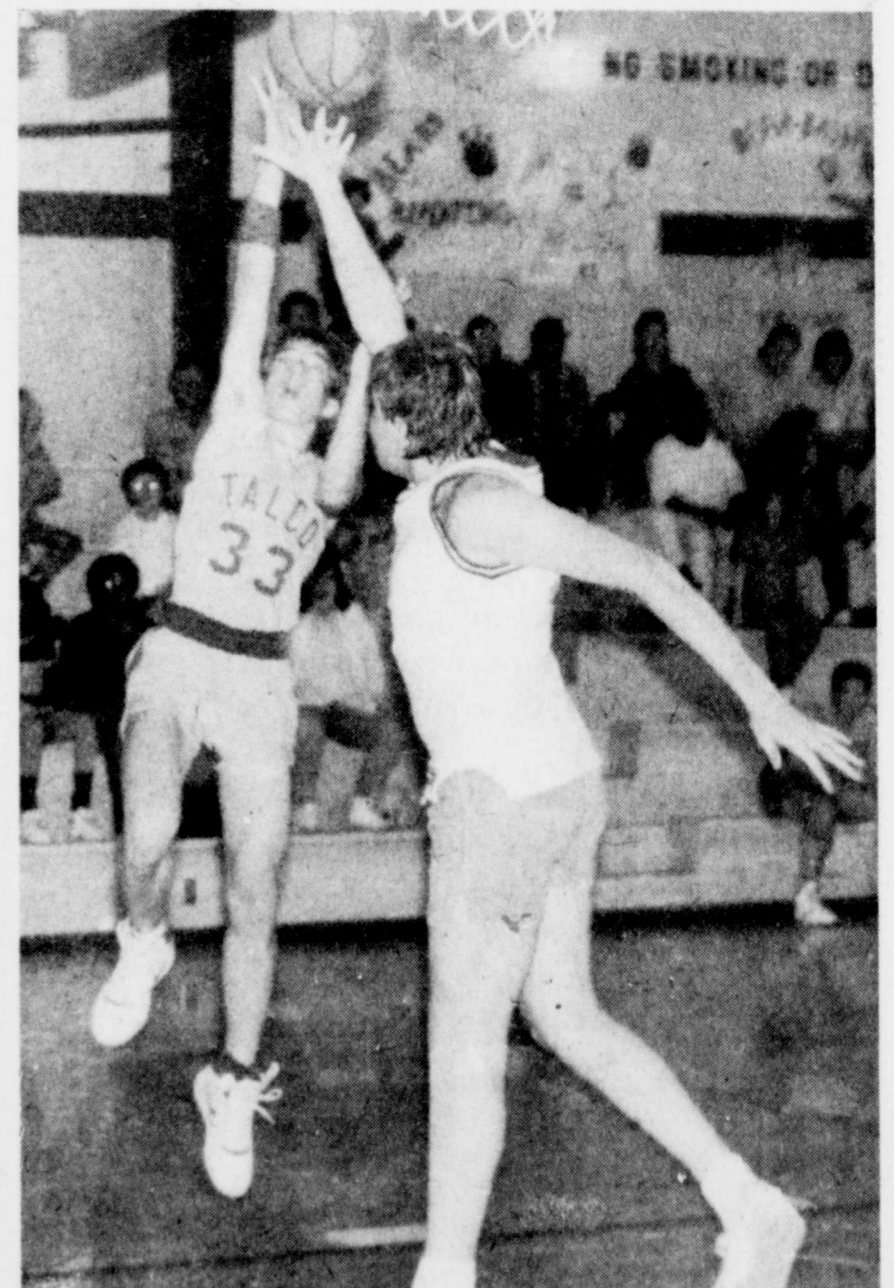
They will be at the World Show again this fall.

Rebels, Rebelettes Enjoy One Win, Suffer One Loss

The Rebelettes have made the final turn and headed for home as they go into the last week of their season. The Rebels have two weeks left in regular play and good possibility of play-off action. Both teams enjoyed a win and suffered a loss last week.

The Rebels avenged an earlier season loss to Leonard with a rugged 55-49 victory. The Rebels called on junior guard, Galen Logan, to key the win. Logan hit a 3-pointer at the third quarter buzzer, to give his team a 38-31 lead. That play worked so well that Logan repeated it twice in the first minute of the fourth period to make the score 44-33. Logan continued his torrid streak to score the first 10 points of the stanza, advancing his team's lead to 48-36. Logan led the Rebel scorers with 15 points. Good ball movement and accuracy from the charity stripe allowed the Rebels to hold on for the win. Jason Pogue finished the game with 12 points, while Kevin House, Donald Combs and Jeremy Abshier had 8 apiece.

On Friday night, the Rebels faced a rejuvenated Cooper Bulldog team, who provided the most intense competition for the season. It was a heart-breaking loss for the men from Johntown, as Cooper defeated them 36-35, in a game which saw the air taken out of the ball in a slowdown affair.

The Rebel loss pushed them into a tie for second place with Wolfe City, each having three losses, one game behind Chisum. The Rebels are in great position for the stretch run, since they face both teams at Rivercrest.

The Cooper game was a see-saw battle, with neither squad attaining

more than a 3-point lead. Ronald Simmons scored four first quarter points to bring the Rebels within 3. The Rebels managed to knot the halftime score at 18 all, as all six Rebel players who saw action managed to score in the first half. After Bam Morris, who led Cooper with 13 points, opened the third quarter, Rebel Kevin House repeated his opening game shot, a lean-in jumper from the free throw line. House finished with 8 points, one behind leader Donald Combs, who gave the Rebs a slim lead with a tip-in at 6:30 of the third. The Dogs Morris and Byron Bonds reacted for a 25-22 lead, but Rebel senior Jeremy Abshier, who would play a crucial role into the final seconds, scored the next six points to give the Rebs a 28-25 lead.

In the fourth quarter, Combs again tied the score at 33 all with 4:09 to play. After the Rebels stalled for over a minute, House scored what would prove to be the final Rebel points to post a 25-23 lead. But Cooper's Stacy Miller hit a pair of free throws, and after turnovers by both units, Morris hit the front end of a one-and-one with 1:26 to provide the point that would be the margin of victory.

Jason Pogue, who also had five blocked shots in the game, rebounded the second foul shot, Abshier drove to the basket but was hammered by Bonds, creating a two-shot free throw opportunity. Calmly, the Rebel arched the ball toward the hoop, only to see it devilishly rim out. After a time-out, Abshier again stepped to the foul line, eyed the basket, and lofted the orb, which plinked off the front of the iron, aborting any Rebel opportunity for victory.

The Rebelettes encountered tenth ranked Leonard, seeking the win which would enhance their playoff hopes. But it was not to be as the Rebelettes could not hit early, allowing the Tigerettes to build a 15-0 lead in the first six minutes. That proved to be the margin of victory as Leonard defeated the Rebelettes 62-47. The loss virtually ended aspirations of advancement to post-season play, since it was the fens third district loss.

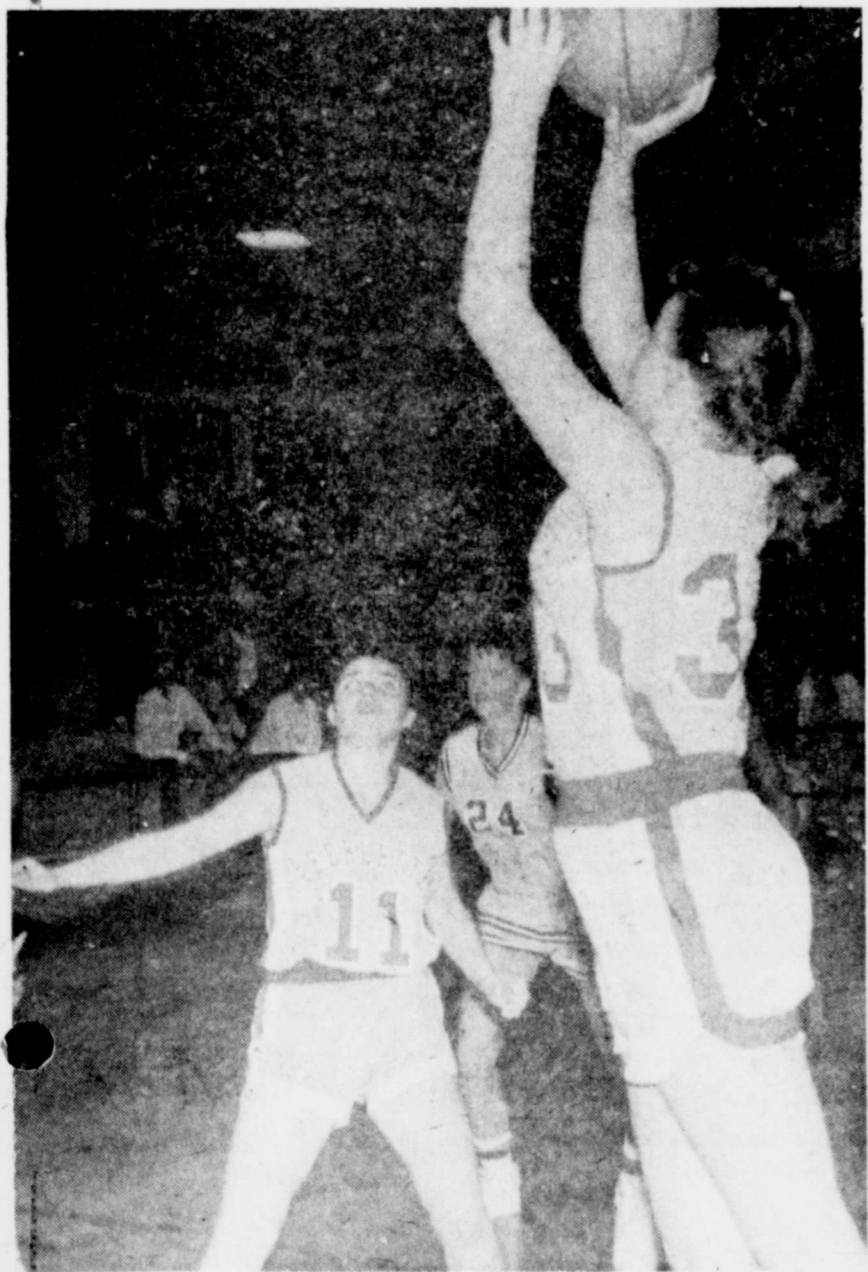

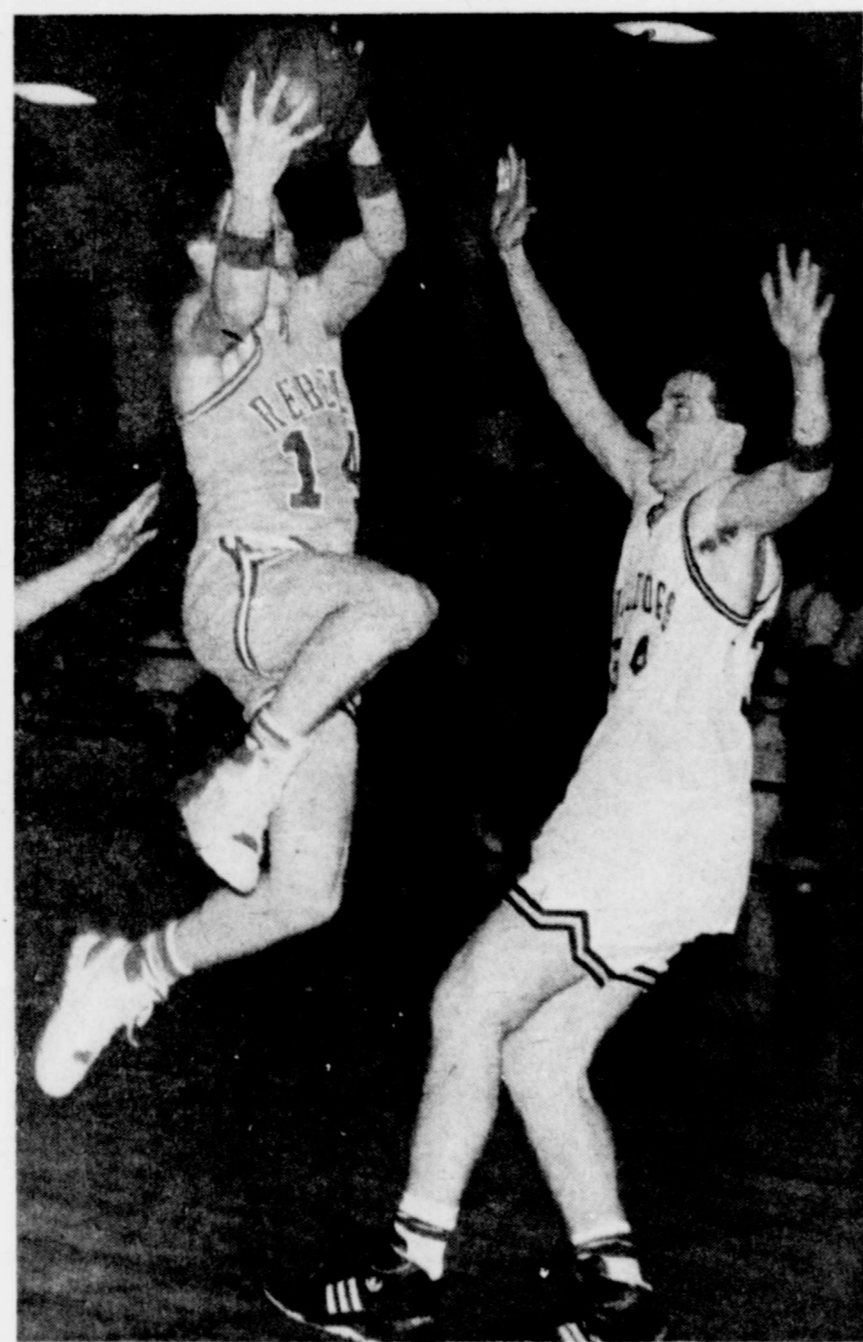

JEREMY ABSHIER flies in for a shot against the Cooper Bulldogs last week. The Rebels suffered a heart-

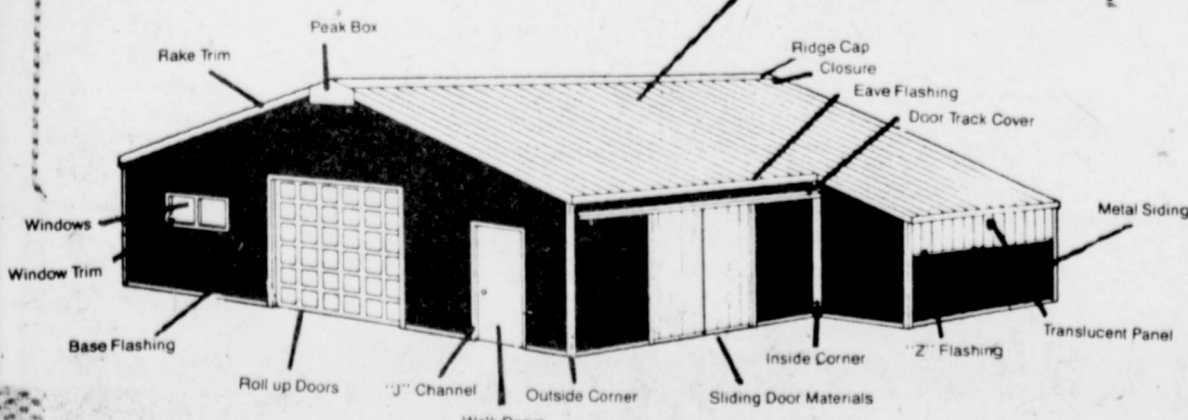

The junior high's final games will be played against Chapel Hill at Talco on Monday, February 12. Everyone is invited to come out and support the local youth.

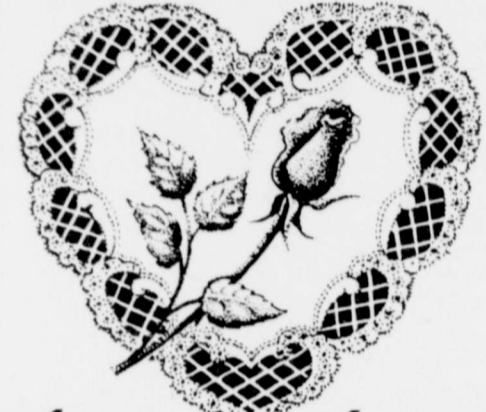

 1 pkg. (3 ozs.) strawberry flavor gelatin
 1 cup boiling water

 2 tsp. lemon juice
 2 egg whites
 ¼ cup sugar
 1 cup cold whipping cream

In small bowl, beat egg whites until foamy. Gradually add sugar; beat until stiff peaks form. Using same beaters, whip cream until stiff. Reserving 1 cup for garnish, fold remaining whipped cream into strawberry mixture. Fold in egg whites. Spoon into crust, mounding high above rim. Chill until set, about 4 hours. Garnish with reserved whipped cream and additional strawberries, if desired.
