Lorene Wooten, 72, of Mart, formerly of Red River County, died Friday, June 1 in a Marlin nursing home.



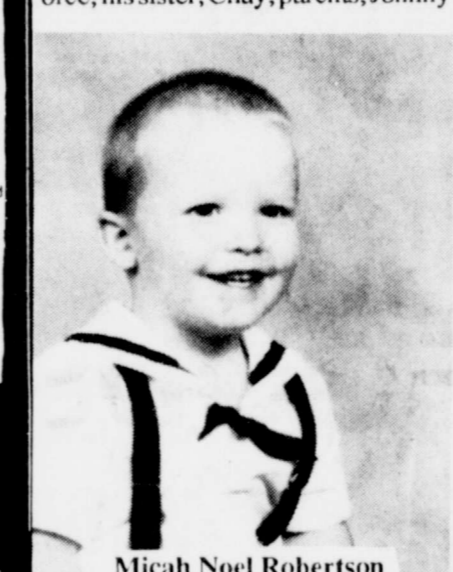


