# February Sales Tax Rebates Break Records

"Texas cities and counties will enjoy a tidy post-Christmas bonus, because this month's total local sales tax rebates are the largest in the state's history," Stat eComptroller John Sharp said today.

The Comptroller's office today mailed checks totaling \$177.4 million to cities and counties across Texas that collect the local sales tax.

"February's total rebates are always large because they include sales taxes collected by annual, quarterly and monthly taxpayers, but these broke by \$19.5 million the old record set in February of 1989," Sharp said. 'That's an increase of 12.4%.

Reports filed by monthly taxpayers reflect sales made in December.

"Christmas retail sales may not have been as bright as some folks had hoped, but the state's economy still looks good when compared to the nation as a whole," Sharp said.

Local sales tax rebate checks to cities increased 11.5% over last February's payment sof almost \$144 million for a total of \$160.5 million.

Locally, Bogata received \$4,962.36 for a 19.46% increase. Clarksville received \$29,014,76 for a 1.47% increase while Detroit received \$1,854.92 for an 11.65% increase.

Mt. Pleasant received \$150,593.88. for a 5.01% increase.

Talco received \$2,572.75 for a 4.67% decrease from the 1990 February payment.

Blossom received \$4,415,28 for a 26.18% increase.

Deport received \$2,919.64 for a 14.47% decrease over the 1990 payment for the same period.

Paris received \$357,424.65 for a 6.77% increase.

Checks to counties totaled \$16.9 million, up 23% from last February's checks of \$13.7 million. The hefty increase is largely due to more counties now collecting sales tax than did at this time last year.

Houston received the state's largest check of \$26.8 million. Dallas received the state's second largest payment of \$15.7 million and San Antonio received \$8.9 million and Austin received \$6.4 million.

Merchants collect the state and local sales taxes and send them to the Comptroller's office with their tax returns. The state retains its share and rebates cities and counties their local portion of the sales tax each month.

All city and county sales taxes must be approved by area voters. Most areas put the money in their General Fund and use it for local operations like fire fighting, maintaining roads and law enforcement.

Bob Harrell of Jennings brought in a clipping concerning his uncle (his mother's brother).

Chester W. Byars, who died March 25, 1989, had a large part of developing the Patriot Missiles being used defend Israel and Saudi Arabia right

His widow, Bonnie M. Byars of Machipongo, Virginia says that it is so wonderful to know that he is still "helping to win the war" even though

he is dead. In a letter to the Harrell's she recalls that "Chet worked on the patriot from 1960 to 1967 when the largest government contract ever awarded to Raytheon Missile Systems was won. After that there was a lot of testing out at White Sands, N.M. and then it was put into production. I talked with one of the engineers last night, Art Franz, that

worked for Chet and he told me how excited everyone was about the Patriot's performance and they are busy building many more Patriots."

In a newspaper clipping about Chester W. Byars it is mentioned that he was born in Prosper, Texas, and was a member of the Cape Charles Coast Guard Auxiliary and a past commander of the Minuteman Power Squadron of Acton, Mass. He was a disabled veteran of World War II and served with the 9th Air Force, Third Army at the Battle of the Bulge. While with the Army at Ft. Bliss he was design engineer on the Hawk radar stystem. He retired from the military as lieutenant colonel in 1954. He

# Social Security Notes

Most Social Security and Supple- improvement as well. mental Security Income overpaypromptly reporting changes that aftheir checks. Failure to make a timely report can result in a penalty as well.

The single biggest cause of Social Security overpayments is beneficiaries not reporting, or under reporting, yearly earnings. Some benefits must be withheld if 1991 earnings will esxceed \$9,720 for those who are 65-69 years old, or \$7,080 for those under age 65. This report must be made directly to Social Security by any beneficiary under age 70 whose earnings will go over these limits.

There are special rules that apply to disability beneficiaries including disabled widows and disabled adult children, who work. For these people any work must be reported, regardless of the amount of earnings. We need to know about any medical

SSI recipients must report any ments results from beneficiaries not change in their income and resources, as well as any change in living arfect the amouth of, or entitlement to, rangements. As other income increases, the SSI check must decrease. There is a resource limit each year that must be carefully observed. A living arrangement change can also cause the SSI check to increase or

> Other events that must be reported by all beneficiaries are: death or marriage of the beneficiary; a change of address; and a beneficiary who is no longer in custody of his or her representative payee.

We send a booklet about even that must be reported along with evelone fit award letter. It is the beneficiary's responsibility to make these reports promptly in order to avoid overpayments and possible penalties.

You can make a report by calling your nearest Social Security Office.

Replacement of residence. At the time you filed your original return you may have expected to purchase a new home within two years of the sale of your old residence. Now you have the information about the replacement—or you know that you will not be replacing the home.

One thing you may not change after an original filing is filing status from a joint return to married filing separate returns if the due date for the original return has passed.

Generally, the amended return must be filed within three years after the date the original return was submitted or within two original return was submitted or within two years after the time the tax was paid (if the date is later). For most taxpayers, April 15, 1991, is the deadline for amending 1967 federal individual income

Unless you have experience preparing amended returns, you should seek professional assistance. Amending a return requires an understanding of the amendment process as well as an nderstanding of the original return.


