The Quick Light Bread recipe came from Christine Baker about a month ago. They enjoy it so much she keeps a container made up in the refrigerator all the time.

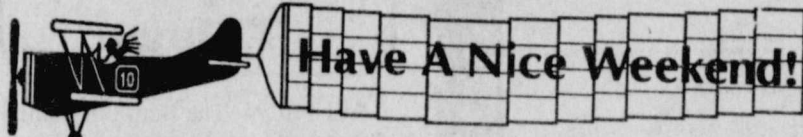
The Frozen Slaw recipe came from Eulalia Roach of Paris about a month ago. Betty says this is especially good for covered lunches, etc.

Cream Cheese Cake
By Betty Ramsey

1 box Duncan Hines cake mix (golden butter)
8 oz. cream cheese
2 tbs. butter
1/2 cup hot water
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup oil
4 eggs

Cream together cream cheese, butter and hot water. Add cake mix, sugar and oil. Mix well, add eggs one at a time, mixing well after each one. Spray cake pan (use a bundt pan). Bake at 320 degrees for 1 hour.

Coconut-Pineapple Pie

3 eggs
1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
1 1/2 cups sugar
3 tablespoons all purpose flour
1 cup crushed pineapple, drained
1 cup flaked coconut
1 unbaked 9" pastry shell

Beat eggs until thick and lemon colored. Stir in next 5 ingredients, mixing well. Pour mixture into pastry shell. Bake at 350 for 50 minutes or until filling is set. Yield: 19" pie.

Frozen Slaw

1 tsp. salt
1 cup cabbage and sprinkle salt over cabbage and let stand for 1 hour. Squeeze out juice from cabbage and add:
3 ribs chopped celery
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
Mix together:
1/2 cup water
2 cups sugar
1 cup white vinegar
1 tsp. celery seed
1 tsp. mustard seed

Bring to boil for one minute and let cool. Pour over cabbage and freeze. This salad will be crisp and fresh when defrosted. Serves 6-8.

Quick Light Bread

1 cup lukewarm water
1 pkg. Active yeast
1/2 cup Crisco oil
1/2 cup sugar
1 tablespoon salt
1 cup lukewarm water
6 cups all purpose sifted flour

Using the first cup of water, sprinkle yeast in water, take 1 tablespoon of sugar out of the 1/2 cup measurement and sprinkle on top of the yeast. Set aside.

In large bowl, mix the remaining 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 cup oil, tablespoon salt and the other cup of lukewarm water. Add yeast mixture and gradually add sifted flour. Pour on lightly floured board and knead well. Put in large greased bowl and let rise, punch down and pinch off rolls and put in a greased pan. Let rise 2-3 hours and bake. Keep the remainder of dough in sealed container in the refrigerator and use as needed.

Banana Pudding

1 large pkg. Jello instant Pudding Mix (mixed according to recipe on box)
1 can Eagle Brand milk
1-9 oz. container Cool Whip, folded into this mixture.

Layer with 6-7 bananas, layer vanilla wafers with the bananas. Save enough bananas and vanilla wafers to decorate top.

Cobbler

Filling:
1 can apples or other fruit
1 cup sugar
3/4 cup water
cinnamon as desired

Mix above together and bring to boil.

Crust:
1 cup sugar
1 cup flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1 egg
1 stick margarine

Cream sugar, margarine and egg. Add flour and baking powder (mixed together). Spoon crust mixture over fruit mixture and bake until brown.

Locals Learn The Gift of Giving

On Monday, May 18, George Thomas, pastor of First Baptist Church, Alice Ann White, Kay Byndas, Rose Mary Swinford, Linda

Eilers and Margaret Ortiz of Clarksville left for Inner City Houston on a mission trip.

The purpose of the trip was to help Mildred McWhorter, who is a mis-

sionary in Inner City Houston. Miss McWhorter has been a missionary in Houston for thirty-four years. She is in charge of four missions. She sees to it that food and clothes are distributed weekly to those in need, she also helps the illiterate learn to read, as well as a daily bible study is done at each mission. Two of the missions are on the east side of Houston which are the Mason Mission and Joy Mission and the other two are on the north side are the Flecher Mission and Gano Mission.

Miss McWhorter told the group from First Baptist it cost approximately \$275,000 a year to run the four missions. She is fast to let you know that she does it with donations from individuals and companies. It was amazing to watch all the donations coming in each day, truck loads of food, clothes, diapers and etc. arriving all during the day. All the supplies from individuals and companies are delivered to the Gano Mission and then delivered to the other missions on different days of the week.

While in Houston we stayed at the Gano Mission. We helped Miss McWhorter bag flour for the needy. One day we had to bag a thousand pounds of flour into quart size zip lock bags; also we bagged 100 pounds of doughnut mix, 50 pounds of pancake mix, and 50 pounds of rice. We then had to label each bag. Another day we helped give out 544 bags of groceries at the Flecher Mission, unload the truck of perishable food, bag up approximately 150 chicken prepared for the freezer. The next day we had to wash about 500 jars then empty gallons jugs of Picante sauce, mustard, and soy sauce into the smaller jars and label them. On Thursday, we went to the Joy Mission where we helped the four and five year olds with their bible stories, crafts and served snacks. We also had lunch with all the workers at Joy Mission.

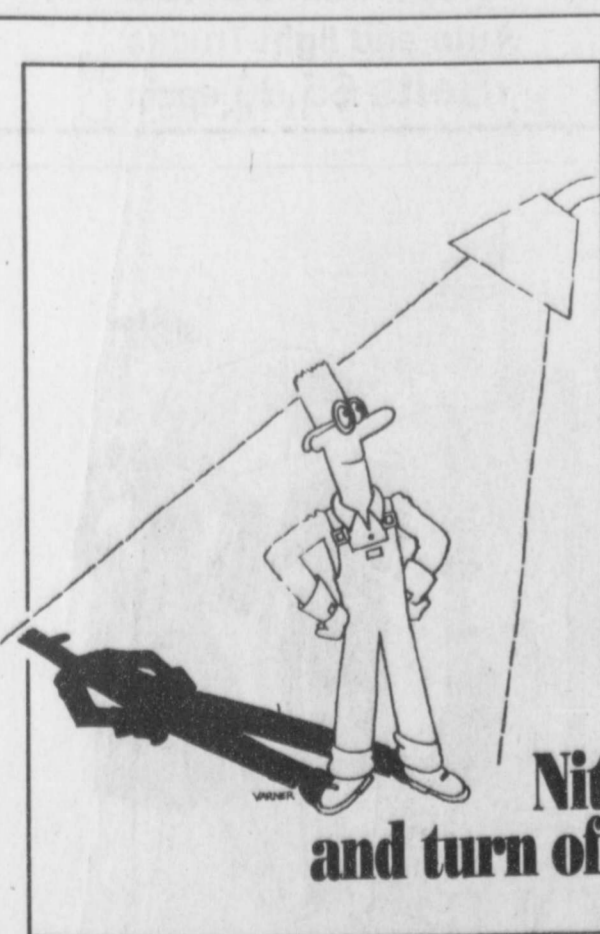

SBA Accepting For Loans

The U.S. Small Business Administration is now accepting applications for Economic Injury Disaster Loans from agriculturally dependent small businesses that have sustained economic injury as a result of the freeze and heavy rains which occurred between September 1 and December 31, 1991. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible for these SBA loans. The counties eligible for economic injury loans assistance are: Bowie, Clay, Cooke, Fannin, Grayson, Lamar, Montague, Red River, Wichita and Wilbarger.

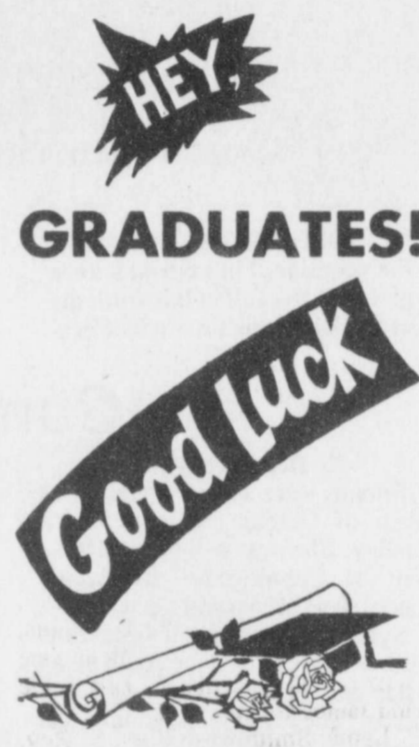
To the extent that farmers and ranchers are no longer able to purchase goods and services at normal levels because of disaster-related agriculture loss, small business which depend on these producers may have experienced an economic injury. A small business normally able to meet its bills and pay its operating expenses, but cannot do so now as a direct result of the disaster, may be eligible for economic injury loans. They do not cover physical losses. Filing deadline is October 28, 1992. Businesses seeking additional information should call the SBA toll-free number, 1-800-473-0477.

The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should parent or legal guardian have questions, please contact the above noted field office staff.

Keeping Healthy

Lazy Eye Must Be Treated Early

What is commonly called a "lazy eye"—and what your doctor calls "amblyopia"—is a visual defect which may develop in young children and which must be treated while the child is still young.

You should be suspicious if your child rubs his or her eyes excessively, closes or covers one eye, tilts the head or thrusts it forward when looking at something, frowns or blinks frequently, stumbles over small objects, or has difficulty playing games which require good vision at a distance.

All children's eyes should be examined by the time the child is three or four years old. This is particularly important if the child was born prematurely or if other members of the family have amblyopia, nearsightedness or astigmatism.

Since the development of vision in a child is virtually complete by six or seven, treatment must not be delayed. After age seven, it is not likely that treatment of amblyopia will result in good binocular vision.
