Talco-Bogata CISD Board Irons Out Policy For Participation In Graduation Exercises

The Talco Bogata CISD Board of Trustees met on Thursday, August 19, 1993 in the board room at Rivercrest High School. After approving the consensus agenda, the transferring of \$11,000.00 from the maintenance fund to the transportation fund was approved, and the \$30,000.00 incentive award for the Talco Campus was added to the budget.

Bus drivers' pay schedule will be based on \$20.00 per day base for 50 miles or less, and 15 cents per mile over 50 miles. Fifteen cents per mile extra was approved for any driving on dirt roads.

The teacher evaluation procedure

for the 93-94 school term provides for one observation during the year, and at least 2 walk throughs by a supervisor in each semester.

When they came to the graduation exercise participation policy, the board made it a hard and fast rule that not only could a student not graduate without completing all local requirements, they also will not be allowed to walk across the stage if they have not completed all State of Texas requirements and all State Board of Education requirements. This subject came up in the spring when a student wanted to participate, and then finish the requirements at a later

date. Since there was not a hard and fast rule at the time, the student was allowed to do so but there will not be any question next spring as to who qualifies to participate in graduation.

The board was presented a list of delinquent taxes in the district, and heard a report of action from the Delinquent Tax Attorney. Local Tax exemptions will stay as is. A Budget hearing will be held August 31, at 7:30 P.M.

Resignations were accepted from Gayle Brown, a bus driver, and Judy Couch, a teacher's aid. Due to the time, the budget study was postponed until Monday the 23rd at 7:30 P.M.

All students are invited to attend these fellowships.

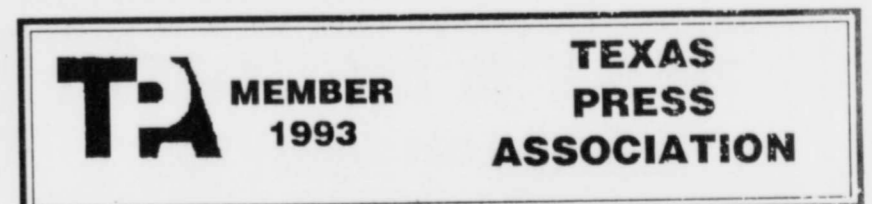
PTO Officers Plan First Meeting

The class with the highest percent of parents and teachers present will be awarded \$5.00 toward their class

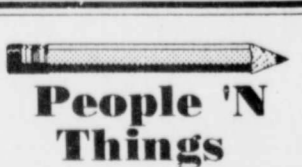
party money. A babysitter will be available at the cost of \$1.00 per child.

You'll all be happy to know that I have learned who Jane Davis is. She is Ruby Ross, and I have no idea where we got the name, Jane Davis. So if there is anyone still reading this column by now, Ruby Ross has already had her picture run. She was quilting at the Caring and Sharing group's get together at Woodland.

Mrs. Ross lives in Woodland. She attends the Methodist Church. She has 2 sons, Jimmy Melton, of Woodland and Dean Melton, of Tulsa. Mrs. Ross has 3 grandsons and 1 granddaughter. Quilting, traveling and painting are her hobbies. She is taking painting lessons in Paris and Detroit. She loves to cook vegetables. If she takes food to a dinner, she usually takes pies and cobblers. As with many of us, Mrs. Ross has a difficult time writing down a recipe, because she cooks with a dab of this and a dab of that.

Mrs. Ross taught school at Detroit Elementary for 35 years, in fact she retired from the Detroit School Dis-

trict.

The recipes that Mrs. Ross shared with us were; Squash Dressing, Raisin Dream Pie, Squash Relish, Cornbread Salad, and Broccoli Salad. The recipes were printed on August 5, under the name of Jane Davis. The recipes looked really good, and I know a lady who tried the Squash Dressing and found it to be very good.

Since we have already printed Mrs. Ross's recipes, we won't print them again, but rather will print recipes from another of the Woodland ladies, Mrs. Dixie Brown. Mrs. Brown's recipes include Pecan Pie, Onion Meat Loaf, and Sweet Potato Casserole.

I'm sure you have this all straight in your minds now, that is assuming you have not gotten tired of the confusion and quit me. If this is the case, please know that I miss you already, and will sincerely try to be more efficient in the future.

PECAN PIE
 by Dixie Brown
 3 eggs
 1 cup brown sugar
 1 cup white corn syrup
 1 tsp. vanilla
 1 tsp. butter flavoring
 1 heaping cup pecans
 1/3 cup margarine, melted
 Slightly beat eggs in medium size bowl. Blend in sugar and corn syrup and margarine. Add vanilla and butter flavoring. Arrange pecan halves on bottom of crust. Pour filling over them. Bake for 50 to 60 minutes in 350 degree oven until center is almost set but still soft. Do not over bake for filling will set as it cools. Cool on wire rack 1 hour before cutting.

ONION MEAT LOAF
 1 cup soft bread crumbs
 1 egg, slightly beaten
 3/4 cup minced onion
 1 tsp. salt
 1/8 tsp. black pepper
 1 Tbsp chopped parsley
 1/2 cup grated carrots
 1 1/2 lb. ground beef
 2 (6 oz.) cans tomato juice

2 strips bacon
 Combine bread crumbs, egg, onion, salt, pepper, parsley, and carrots. Add meat, mixing lightly. Gradually add about 1/2 of the tomato juice, using just enough to hold the mixture together. Mix together lightly, but well. Shape into a loaf, and put in a shallow baking dish. Pour remaining tomato juice over top. Lay bacon strips on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 to 50 minutes or until loaf is well browned and done in the middle.

SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE
 3 cups sweet potatoes cooked and mashed
 1 cup sugar
 2 eggs
 1/2 tsp. vanilla
 1/2 cup milk
 1/2 tsp. salt
 1/2 stick oleo
 Mix all ingredients well and pour into lightly greased casserole. Cover with the following topping: 1 cup brown sugar, 1/3 cup flour, 1 cup pecans, and 1/3 stick melted oleo. The topping ingredients should be mixed together and spread over the top of the potato mixture. Bake 35 minutes at 350 degrees.

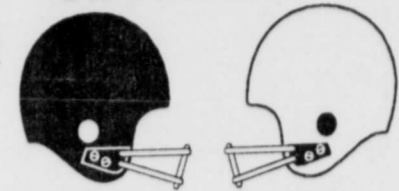
