Talco-Bogata CISD Attends To Business

The Talco-Bogata Board of Trustees met Monday night. In open forum a letter was read appealing to the board to revise the practice of selling raffle tickets or chances by the school, school organizations, students and parents in order to raise money for support of activities. The author felt this practice taught children to gamble.

The board approved the consensus agenda which included minutes of meetings, the financial report, cafeteria report, tax report and payment of the bills.

Chris Arnold representing Oakerson, Arnold and Walker of Mt. Pleasant presented the 1992-93, Audit Report to the Board and the members accepted and approved the report unanimously.

The date of the December meeting

was discussed and set for Dec. 9, 1993 to avoid a conflict with the school holiday.

Principal Ray Miller reported to the Board of a pending visit to the Mansfield, Tx. ISD to look into alternative scheduling called Block scheduling. A principal and teacher from each campus will participate in this study.

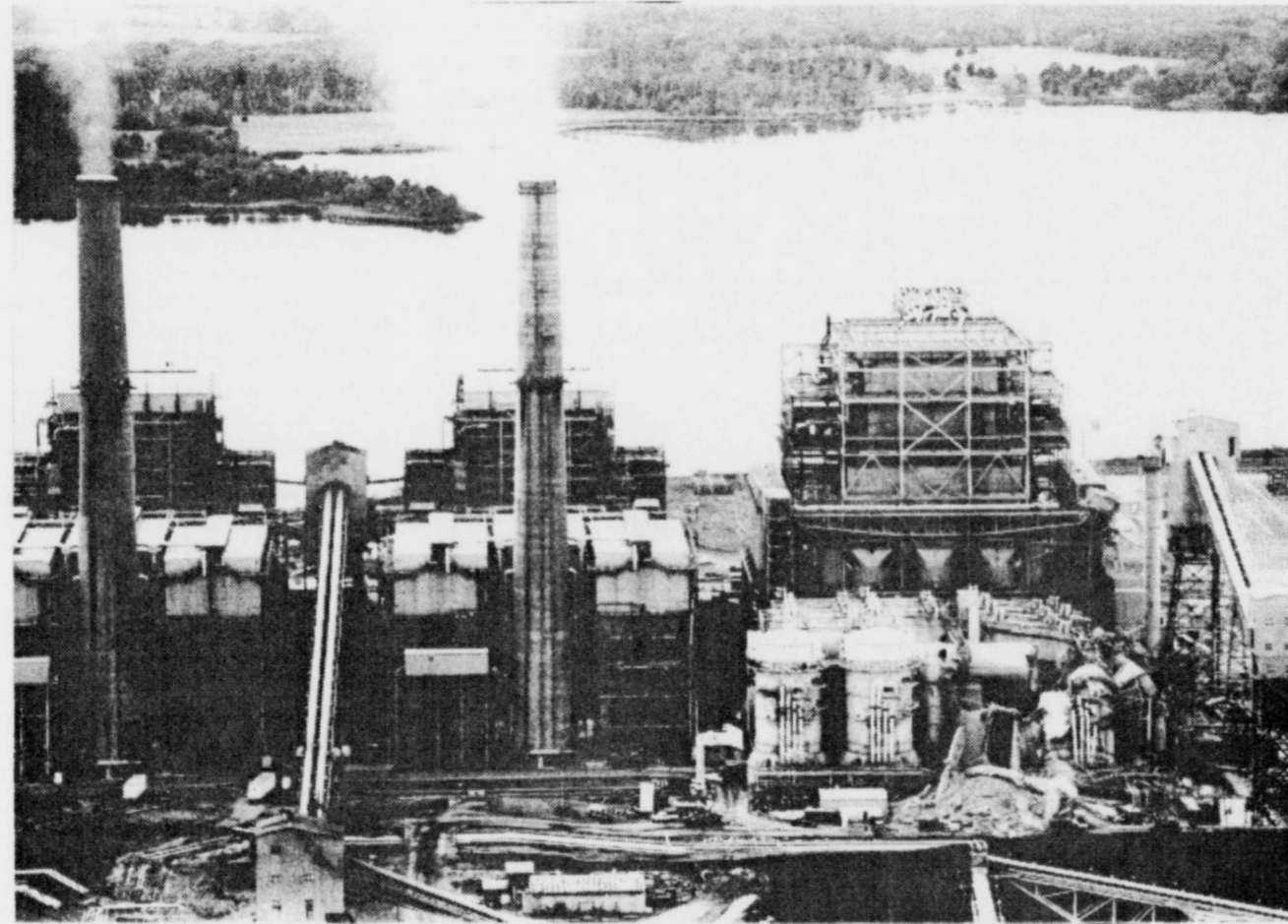
The repairs recommended on the Agriculture Building were approved. The low quote was accepted from Harrison, Walker and Harper of Pris for \$8,701. A brief report was given concerning the progress of the Rivercrest bleacher project. The Board then approved an amendment to the 93-94 budget to offset the \$17,500 cost for the bleacher project.

Reports were given by Johnny Gable and Jimmy Lee concerning

scheduled use of the computer labs recently installed at Talco and Bogata Jr. highs.

Superintendent Freddy Wade gave a report on a recent study concerning solutions for the deficit in the food services budget. Action approved to alleviate cafeteria losses was to reduce the number of employees on the two campuses that had deficits and to study other causes and eliminate the losses in total.

The Board went into executive session for the purpose of evaluating personnel on each campus with the campus principals. Upon returning to the open session, the board took action to accept the resignation of Glenda Corbell, who was employed as a teacher's aide at Bogata School. The Board adjourned at 12:30 A.M.

According to reports from Texas Parks and Wildlife Lt. Skip McBride, Jonathan and his cousin, Chase Collins had been squirrel hunting Sunday close to the Holt home.

Reports indicate that the two boys sat down with their guns. One shotgun, apparently across the Collins boy's lap accidentally discharged.

Chase Collins ran to the Holt home and summoned family. The child's body was carried home and authorities summoned.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday, Nov. 17.

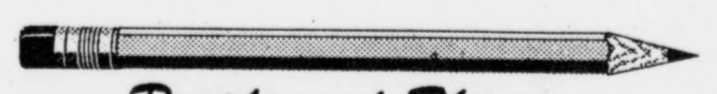
Capital Murder Indictments Handed Down In Lennox Case

Red River County Attorney Jack Herrington reported that on Tuesday, November 16, 1993 the Grand Jury returned four capital murder indictments and one criminal conspiracy to commit murder indictment in the death of Martha Lennox on October 29th.

Indicted for capital murder were Ricky Dean Bell, age 23 of Clarksville; Willie Earl Pondexter, Jr. age 19 of Idabel Oklahoma; James Lee Henderson, age 20 of Idabel Oklahoma and Deon Lashun Williams age 16, a juvenile certified as an adult.

Williams was certified as an adult in Red River County Juvenile Court on Wednesday, Nov. 10 at a hearing which issued a discretionary transfer

Indicted for criminal conspiracy to commit murder by the Grand Jury was James Earl Bell, age 22. County Attorney Jack Herrington said "the laws have changed and there are only two penalties for capital murder now...life or death. A life sentence carries a minimum 40 calendar year sentence with no parole or time off for good behavior."

Mexican Casserole by Rachel Ward

Mix together:
1 can cream of mushroom soup
1 can Rotel Tomatoes with green chilies
1 can Ranch Style Beans
Brown: 1 lb. Hamburger meat & 1 onion chopped fine
1 Grated cheese
Corn Tortillas quartered

In 11X13 pyrex container, layer meat, tortillas, onions, and cheese twice. Put soup mixture over meat and onions each time and top with cheese. Baked at 350 degrees until bubbly.

Divinity

1 1/2 cup sugar
1/3 cup water
1 pint marshmallow cream
1/2 cup chopped pecans
pinch of salt

Combine sugar water, and salt in saucepan. Boil until it forms a hard ball in cold water. Pour boiling mixture over marshmallow cream and stir by hand with large tablespoon until it forms peaks. Add pecans and drop on wax paper. Make about 1 1/2 lbs.

Macaroni and Cheese

1/2-1 cup macaroni dry
1 lb. velveeta cheese
1 small can pet milk
1-2 Tablespoons squeeze butter
salt and pepper to taste

Boil Macaroni until it is soft. Drain and pour into casserole dish. Stir in 1 small can Pet milk, 1 lb. velveeta cheese, cubed, and 1-2 Tablespoons squeeze butter.

Microwave until cheese melts. Cook 2 minutes at a time.

Broccoli Casserole

1/2 stick butter
1 box chopped broccoli
1 chopped onion
1 8 oz. jar hot jalapena cheese whiz
Tobasco sauce to taste
1 1/2 cups rice
celery seed to taste or fresh celery 1/2 cup

Cook broccoli as directed on box and drain. Cook rice as directed. Mix all ingredients and bake in 9X13 pan (sprayed with Pam so it won't stick) at 350 degrees until bubbly.

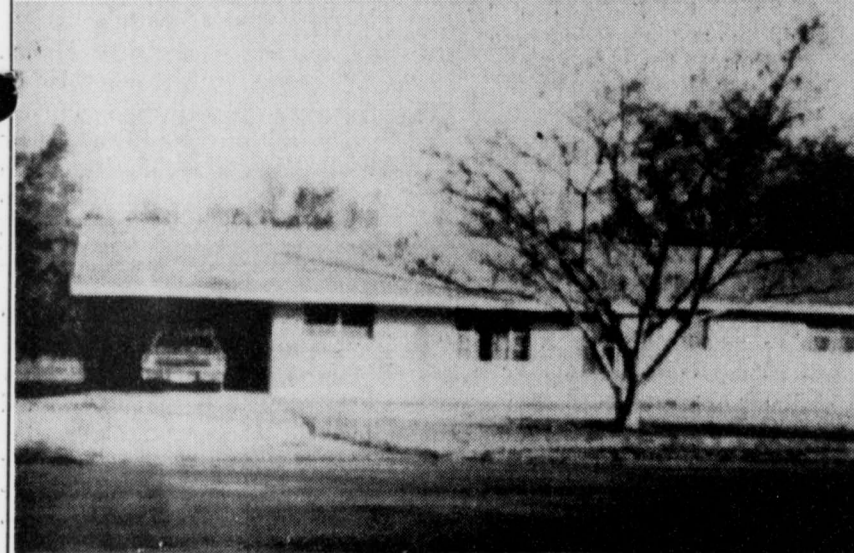

Jr. High Lady Rebels Open Season

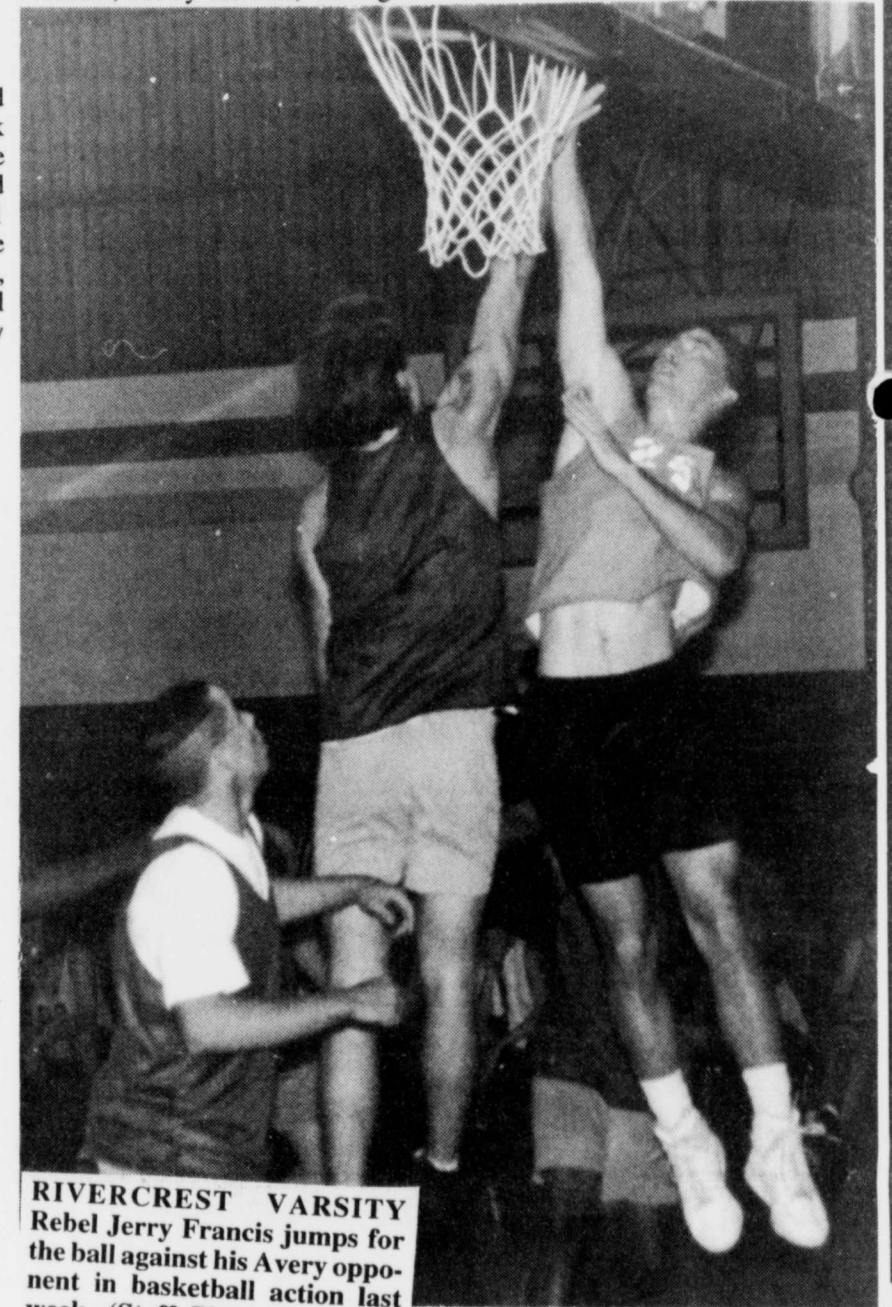
The Talco-Bogata Jr. High Lady Rebels' 7th and 8th grade teams hosted Blossom Monday November 15 for their opening game of the basketball season.
