This made me begin to notice just how dirty my hands were after cooking a meal. I cleaned my fingernails after cooking and was disgusted at the "grunge" that I found there!

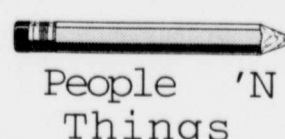
Of course, after running my yard equipment I knew I was nasty...but I've discovered that "working clean" (such as on the computers) is NOT clean!

## Talco-Bogata CISD Holds Special Meeting

The Talco-Board CISD Board of Trustees held a special called meeting Wednesday, July 6.

At this meeting the trustees adopted a resolution agreeing to the selling of a Talco property that had been acquired due to back taxes and held by the City of Talco.

The resignation of the High School Principal, Ray Miller, was accepted by the board. He has accepted the Superintendent's position at

Aspermont, Texas.

The Board also accepted the recommendation of the Superintendent to hire Pasty Moles as a teacher on the Talco campus.

The remainder of the meeting was dedicated to the procedure for filling the vacant high school principal position.

The next meeting of the Board will be on July 14, 1994 at 7:30 p.m.

## Martha Deming Named Rural Scholar

Martha K. Deming, R.N.C., of Talco has been named one of fifteen new Outstanding Rural Scholars in the state of Texas by the Center for Rural Health Initiatives in Austin. She has been selected as an exceptional student from a statewide pool of applicants studying to become rural health professionals.

Ms. Deming is sponsored by Titus County Memorial Hospital, Mt. Pleasant. The program is designed to help rural Texas communities "grow their own" health care professionals by providing matching funds to community sponsors of students pursuing health care professions.

Ms. Deming, already licensed as a registered nurse and a certified childbirth educator, will study for a Bach-

elors of Science in Nursing at the University of Texas in Arlington.

She currently serves as the Clinical Coordinator for the Obstetrics Department at Titus County Memorial Hospital, where she has been employed for 12 years. She has been the Obstetrics Nurse Manager for the past six years.

Scholars must agree to provide one year of service in health care to their sponsor's community for each year of education received. Deming qualified for the program because of her academic performance, her commitment to rural health care, and the hospital's commitment of financial support for her tuition, education and living expenses.

## Tx DOT Workshops Scheduled

The Texas Department of Transportation needs your help putting new faces on familiar places through the statewide transportation enhancement program.

"We need your help, and we'll help you with workshops on the monitoring process," said Bill Burnett, executive director for TxDOT. "Our second call for nominations began in May and ends August 16, and we're here to do what we can to make it a painless process."

The transportation enhancement program encompasses 10 wide ranging project categories, from old railway corridors. More than \$98 million in federal funds went to 112 projects across the state during the first nomination period.

"Community participation is key to this program's success," Burnett said. "That's why TxDot is holding

these information workshops across the state--to get your participation.

In the workshops, representatives from TxDot's Environmental Affairs Division will review program guidelines and offer advice on completing the project nomination form.

The workshop for the Atlanta District is scheduled for Thursday July 14 at 7 p.m. in room 26 of the TxDOT office located at the corner of Main Street (F.M. 249) and Park Street (F.M. 785) in Atlanta. The Atlanta District covers the following counties in Northeast Texas: Bowie, Camp, Cass, Harrison, Marion, Morris, Panola, Titus, and Upshur.

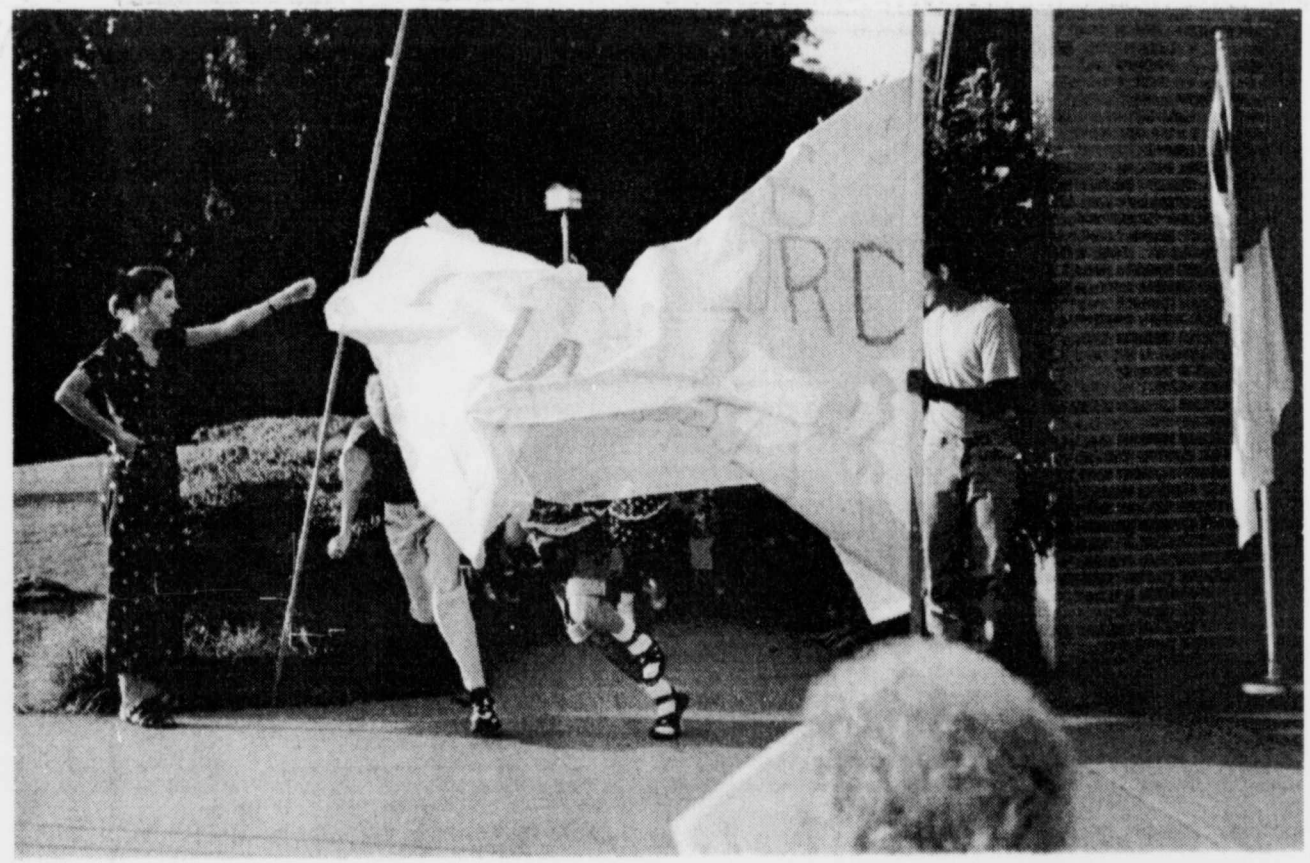

## Immunization Clinic Scheduled

The Texas Department of Health, Public Health Region 7 office, announced plans today for the continuation of a series of monthly immunization clinics for all children needing immunizations, who meet the required family income determination guidelines.

The clinic will be conducted at the Texas Department of Health, 1014 N. Jefferson, Mt. Pleasant.

Clinic hours will be from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Parents may call the clinic for an appointment for their child, (903)572-9877, or arrive on a walk-in basis.

The Health Department emphasizes that this clinic is available to all preschool and school age children who meet the family income guidelines, beginning at two months of

age. Immunizations offered include Measles/Mumps/Rubella, Oral Polio, Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis and Tetanus/diphtheria. The Haemophilus Influenzae type b vaccine is also available to medically eligible children between the ages of 2 months and 60 months. The pneumonia vaccine is available to all high risk patients meeting income guidelines. All children must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Parents are reminded to bring the child's immunization record and Social Security number if available. The Tetanus/diphtheria vaccine is available to medically eligible adults. Should the parent or legal guardian have questions, please contact the above noted field office staff.

Monday was a special day for her. She celebrated her 85th birthday and says that her birthday is very special to her. Her mother always told her that was her day and no one could take it away from her.

She has been married to Mr. Bonner for 65 years and they have three children. I tell everyone that my baby is starting high school this fall, well Mrs. Bonner says her babies will all be in their 60's in August and is so proud of every one of them.

Her oldest, Larry, lives in Sylvan and is married to Melonese. She has another son, M.H. and he is married to Martha. They live in Arlington. Her daughter Rita and her husband, Jack, live in Bedford.

She loves to have visitors and relatives come to see her because she loves to cook and this is her way of sharing with everyone.

They moved to Blossom in 1931 and both have seen many changes in the area, both when Blossom was in it's heyday and Blossom as it is now.

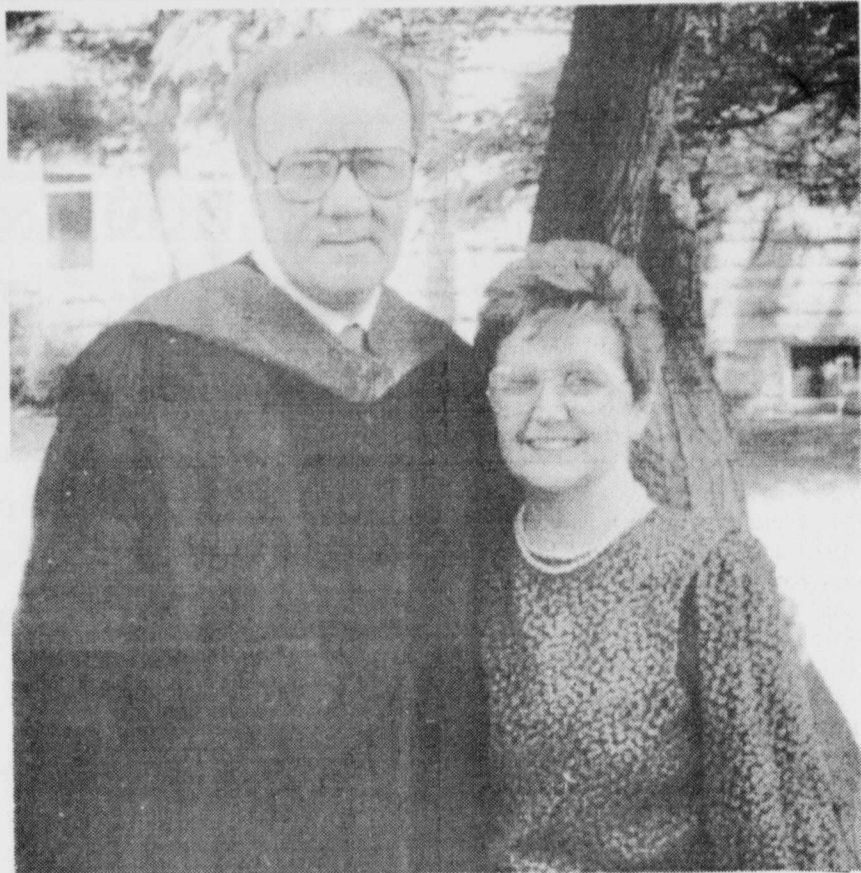

The next clinic will be held July 21, 1994.

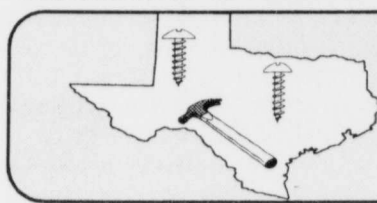
The clinic will be conducted from 9:00-11:30 and 1:00 to 2:30 p.m. at 1300 Highway 37 North, Clarksville, Texas.

Are you as amazed as I am that if O.J. Simpson's wife and friend had not been tragically murdered, that nobody would have ever been aware of spousal abuse, wife beating, intimidation, and all of the many abuses which seem to have come out of the closet in the last few weeks?

Folks, man's inhumanity to man (and woman) did not begin with a football superstar in California being a murder suspect. It began way back at the beginning of time. It has progressed from an occasional slap through the years to totally destroying families. Maybe some folks who think that they have the right to knock other people around are sick and maybe they did have bad upbringings, and maybe they should be pitied. But I happen to pity that person who is taking the abuse for the other person's childhood.

Battered Women's Shelters have existed for a long time. I now hear about them on television being touted as help for families almost as though they have just been discovered. Guess what- Most of them are full and the ones which are not are almost as dangerous as living on the street.

I understand that our Texas Attorney General has appointed a committee to work on the spousal abuse problem in Texas. Would you believe- he appointed 5 men. Now that was a stroke of genius.

Many people blame law enforcement officers for not stopping the problem long ago. Law enforcement

officers have to make a judgement call every time they are called to a home where domestic violence has taken place. Sometimes they will take the offender to jail and the spouse will beat them there with the bail money so the spouse or friend will not have to spend the night in jail. They (Officers) have many times been injured by the person they were trying to protect because they had a change of heart after they saw their spouse in hand cuffs. Wives (and husbands) who stay in abusive situations are ashamed and afraid. They are embarrassed to tell anyone that their home life is a disaster, and some fear for their life and for the life of their children.

In the past I used to cringe when I read in Dear Abby where she wanted someone to seek professional help or to join a support group.

Abby probably had the best advice ever. If you can't leave, or won't leave, get help. If a person doesn't have access to or can't afford professional help, a support group costs nothing and is anonymous.

Abuse did not start with Mrs. Simpson, and it will not end with Mrs. Simpson, but maybe her death will not be in vain if others will realize that they do not have to stay in abusive situations. Sometimes it is hard to remember that your feelings are not a bit more important than anybody else's feelings, but they are not any less important than anybody else's feelings either.

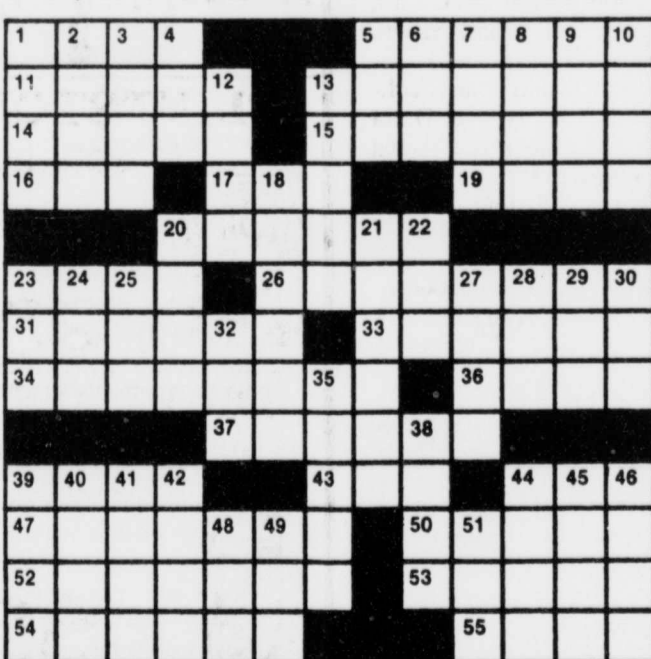

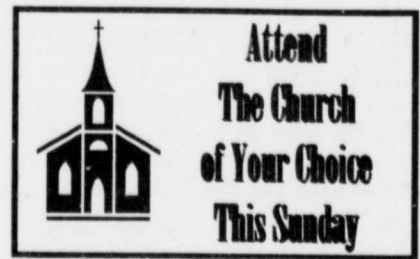
## Youth Enjoy VBS Telethon & Swimming

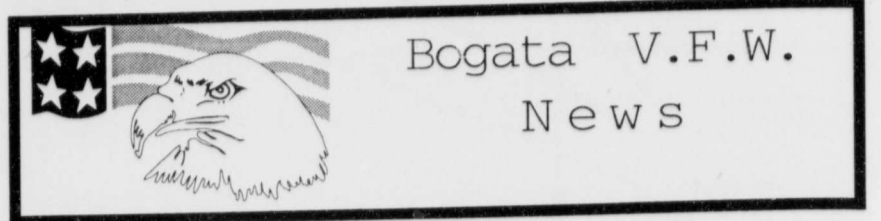
