But, the bill has been defeated, in fact, some time ago, and it is not necessary to send letters to the FCC.







August day, yes, cool, we could look out the kitchen window and see the hummingbirds feeding at the feeder as they fought over their territory. 

Good to eat plain or use glaze below and pour on when hot Glaze: 1 cup powdered sugar 3 tablespoons margarine 2 tablespoons lemon juice Raisin Pie l cup of raisins cooked in small amount of water. Dissolve 1/4 teaspoon soda

in /l/2 cup of buttermilk and add 3 tablespoons of butter. Then add: 1 cup sugar 2 tablespoon(mixed in sugar) l teaspoon lemon juice

Pour into an unbaked pie shell and top

teaspoon vanilla

1/4 teaspoon salt 2 tablespoons butter 1 cup crunchy peanut butter(or smooth) 1/2 cup finely chopped roasted peanuts (these are optional) 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Combine milk, corn syrup and salt in a small dutch oven. Cook over low heat, stiring constantly, until sugar is dissolved. Continue to cook, without stirring,

just until mixture reaches softball stage(234 degrees). Remove from heat and add butter(do not stir). Cool mixture to lukewarm(110 degrees). Add remaining ingredients and beat with a wooden spoon until fudge is thick and begins to lose it's gloss(2-3 minutes).

Pour fudge into a buttered 8-inch square pan. Mark warm fudge into 1inch squares. Cool and cut. Yield is about 5 dozen squares.

This notice concerns 1994 property tax rates for Talco-Bogata school district. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the school district used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's *rollback* tax rate is the highest tax rate the school district can set before it must hold a rollback election. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes and state funds by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of propety value.
