A friend was remembering when her young son became ill and had to be put into the hospital with pneumonia.

After spending the day with him she said "now sweet heart, I'm going to go home for a little while. I need to see about your sister and daddy, and the nurses will be right here for you".

She noticed that his face became terror stricken, pale and his eyes filled with tears.

"What's the matter honey?" she asked.

"Mommy, I want you to be here when I die" he quavered. "Why would you think you're going to die, you're going to be just fine" she replied.

The terrified little boy looked his mother in the face and said in all seriousness "But mommy, you're always telling me if I don't put on my coat when I go out in the cold I'm going to die of pneumonia!".

In a flash she realized that she was always telling him that...and that he would catch his death of pneumonia running around on cold floors in bare feet. It took a while to convince the poor child that he wasn't going to die.

In another instance a friend was telling about a little girl who listened to adult conversation when a neighbor died.

Fondly, someone shook their head and said "Poor thing, I guess she just talked herself to death".

It took days before they began noticing the child wasn't talking except to answer direct questions. Finally, they asked her why and she said

"I'm gonna save my words...I don't want to die".

I know a young man who was became distressed whenever he heard the Alabama song "There's an old flame burning in your eye" because he thought it was describing someone whose eye was literally being consumed by fire!

The stories sound amusing...but the terror these children went through is very real to them.

So around little ones we should take the extra time it takes to explain and help them understand the real meaning of something...it may save them much anguish.

Talco-Bogata CISD Approve Audit

The Talco-Bogata CISD Board of Trustees approved the 1993-94 Audit report as presented by Lanny Walker of Oakerson, Arnold and Walker in their Monday, Nov. 14 Board Meeting.

The consensus agenda was discussed briefly and then passed unanimously. The Trustees were presented and voted to accept the 1994 Tax Roll which indicated a taxable value of \$77,213,034.

The Board read two letters from the Red River Appraisal District. The first letter was notification of the ex-

piring term of Board Director Alvin "Scooter" Parish. Mr. Parish will not seek another term. Replacements were discussed by the board. Selection of a replacement will take place during the December meeting. The second letter was notifying the Board of the need for nominees for the Red River Appraisal Review Board. Nominees for the Appraisal Review Board will be finalized at the December meeting.

The Trustees voted to sell delinquent tax property Lot 1 and Lot 2 of

Block 37 in Talco for \$2,514.26; passed a policy on Gun Free Schools in order to meet a December 1st deadline; discussed the Open Forum Policy, Superintendent's evaluation schedule, and the Rivercrest sewer plant without any action.

The board approved the hiring of a part time aide to assist with transportation and food purchasing. The meeting adjourned at 10:05 p.m.

The next scheduled meeting is set for Tuesday, December 13, 1994 at 7:00p.m.

tions. Donors, who must be at least 17 years of age, will receive a free T-shirt.

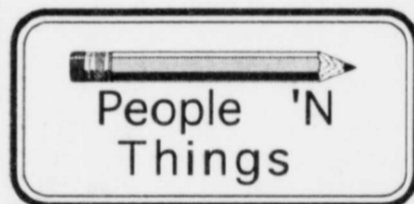

Donald Thomas Dies In Austin

Donald Thomas, for whom Bogata's Thomas Park is named, died Friday, November 17 from complications from a stroke.

A long article in the Austin American Statesman recapped the career of the seventy-four year old Thomas.

He was born June 10, 1920, in Bogata. His father, a traveling salesman, lost his job in 1929 and died a year later. Thomas, who was ten years old then, went to work in a drugstore to help his mother support the family through the depression.

According to the article, Thomas left home with \$6 and attended Baylor University. He was one of just three students who graduated with law degrees from the University of Texas in 1944.

A medical condition kept Donald Thomas from the military and he signed on with the prestigious Austin law firm of Looney and Moorhead.

He was an attorney for the Lyndon Baines Johnson family for over fifty years, and was chief executive of a company that oversaw the Johnson family's business entities from 1977 until he retired in 1990.

The article says "Thomas, whose country lawyer demeanor belied a wizardry in business and financial matters, also served on the board of directors of several Austin banks.

He was known for urging the lending of money to small businessmen and the disenfranchised when "other bankers wouldn't give them a chance".

"Many, many people couldn't have gotten a loan if not for him in the early days of Bank of the Hills," Carolyn Curtis, assistant vice-president for development in the University of

Texas said in a 1991 interview.

In a statement released through her assistant, Lady Bird Johnson, the article reports, said "Our family is saddened by the loss of our friend of so many years, Donald Thomas. We loved and admired him and will remember fondly the happiness our family shared with Don and his family before his long illness overtook him."

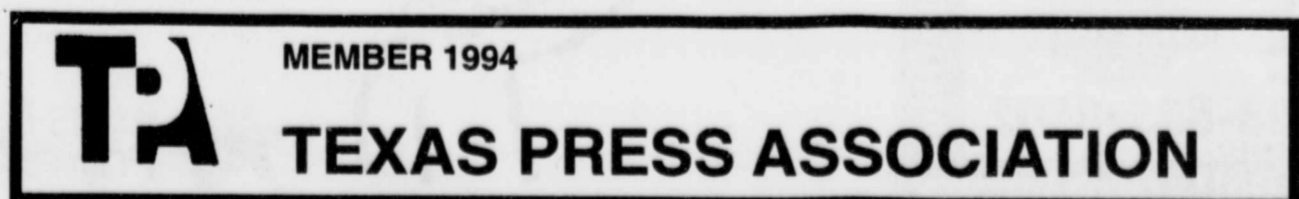
Thomas was a "poor country boy who made good but never forgot his meagre beginnings. In August of 1990 Thomas donated the land for a park in Bogata. He helped secure a grant from Texas Parks and Wildlife in which the Texas Parks and Wildlife would give \$45,400 provided the city of Bogata could match these funds.

A lot of the city's matching funds was done by means of donated labor, time and machinery. Thomas then donated \$7,000 to help some more with the park. Today Thomas Park, which was dedicated April 19, 1993, is a shining example of what a small community park should be with trees, a pavilion, ball fields, walking track, playground equipment and a beautiful location.

Donald Thomas is survived by his wife, Jane Holt Thomas; children Donald Scott Thomas, Jr.; Deborah Thomas Lackey and Frederick Holt Thomas; brother Julian Byng Thomas and several grandchildren.

Funeral services were 2:00 p.m. Monday, November 14 in the Weed-Corley-Fish Chapel. Burial was at Austin Memorial Park.

This weeks recipes come from the Kindergarten classes at Deport and Blossom. Mrs. Lyon's students, Blake Connot, Jordan Walker, Candace Burchinal and Haeley McHam. Mrs. Bailey's featured cooks are Ashley Burchinal, Zachery Ebbs, Tony Movan and Taylor Gillie. From Deport in Mrs. Watson's class we have Kaylee Graham, Justin Miller, Amanda Matthews and Ashley Mitchell. In Mrs. Freeman's class we have Lacie Cole, Ashley Waggoner, Josh Helms and Matt McCool.

It was so strange, but the majority of the students chose a very small number for the temperature, cooking the turkey at 6 degrees. Each one of them was interviewed by themselves. They usually will repeat what they hear from everyone else and this is

- Ashley Burchinal Turkey**
Ashley is the 6 year old daughter of Cindy and Jim Burchinal of Blossom. Ashley said to set the oven for 6 degrees and grease the pan real good. Put the turkey in and cook for 5 minutes. Then take the plastic off and eat it.
 - Zachery Ebbs Turkey**
Zachery Ebb's 5 years old and is the son of Amy and J.W. Ebbs of Blossom. He would start his turkey by putting salt and pepper on it and put it in the oven at 6 degrees for 6 minutes. Serve with hot sauce.
 - Tony Movan Turkey**
Tony is the 5 year old son of Paula Movan. Tony starts with taking out the inside and put it in the oven. Then wash your hands and set the oven for 50 degrees for 60 minutes. Serve with cole slaw and mashed potatoes.
 - Taylor Gillie Turkey**
Taylor is 5 and the daughter of Kevin and Tammy Gillie of Blossom. Taylor would wash her hands first and place the turkey in the oven for 1 hour at 6 degrees. Take it out and serve it on a tray. Eat it with a fork with hot rolls and green beans.
 - Blake Connot Turkey**
Blake is the daughter of Stephanie and Mike Connot of Blossom. Blake starts with skinning the turkey and cooking it for 8 minutes at 19 degrees. Take it out of the oven and eat with a knife and fork and bar-b-que and french fries.
 - Jordan Walker Turkey**
Jordan is the 6 year old son of Paul and Donna Walker of Blossom. Jordan said that with his mom's help, he would shoot it and put it in a pan at 6 degrees for 16 hours. Take it out and eat it with your hands with lots of ketchup and basgetti (spaghetti) and mashed potatoes and a biscuit.
 - Candace Burchinal Turkey**
Candace is the 5 year old daughter of Rhonda and Richard Burchinal of Blossom. First of all Candace would go shopping and buy some meat and put everything like mashed potatoes, meat and biscuits. Mix it up and put in 60 degree oven for 20 minutes. Take out and check to see if it is done and eat with a plate, spoon and fork. Oh and don't forget to eat with dressing.
 - Haeley McHam Turkey**
Haeley is the 5 year old daughter of Shiela and Donnie McHam of Blossom. She starts with a turkey that has been salted with dressing and put it in the oven at 8 degrees for 6 minutes. Put on table with more dressing and eat with broccoli and ketchup.
 - Lacie Todd Turkey**
Lacie is the 5 year old daughter of Mendy and Todd Cole of Cunningham and starts with a clean turkey. Put it in the stove at 20 degrees for 5 minutes. Eat it with salad and bacon.
 - Ashley Waggoner Turkey**
Ashley is the 5 year old daughter of Kyle and Kathy Dixon of Deport and says that you cook it in the microwave for 1 minute. Eat it with salad, potatoes and carrots.
 - Josh Helms Turkey**
Josh is the 5 year old son of April and Steve Helms of Deport. Cut it up, salt it and put it in oven at 10 degrees for 5 minutes. Eat it with a fork with sausage and eggs.
 - Matt McCool Turkey**
Matt is the son of Cathy and Tony McCool of Deport. He starts with flour, eggs, milk and sugar. Put it on turkey, put in oven for 20 hours and 2 degrees. Take it out and eat with a fork with green beans and corn and ice cream for dessert.
 - Kaylee Graham Turkey**
Kaylee is the 5 year old daughter of Lee Ann Ragan of Deport and Calvin Graham of Blossom. Kaylee said to clean the turkey with water and salt it and put in a pan. Cook it for 7 minutes at 70 degrees. Eat it.
 - Justin Miller Turkey**
Justin is the 5 year old son of Christie and Clay Miller of Deport. Cut up the turkey and cook it in a pan at 7 degrees for 10 minutes and eat with a fork and ketchup.
 - Amanda Matthews Turkey**
Amanda is the 5 year old daughter of Barry and Helen Matthews of Deport. Amanda starts with a turkey and puts him in the oven for 10 hours at 4 degrees. Take it out and eat with potatoes and french fries.
 - Ashley Mitchell Turkey**
Ashley is the 5 year old daughter of Daryn and Valerie Mitchell of Deport. Ashley is very inventive. She would decorate her turkey with jelly beans and icing, making eyes, nose and a mouth with buttons and a candy bowtie. Then she puts it in the oven at 50 degrees for 30 minutes and eat with corn and chips.

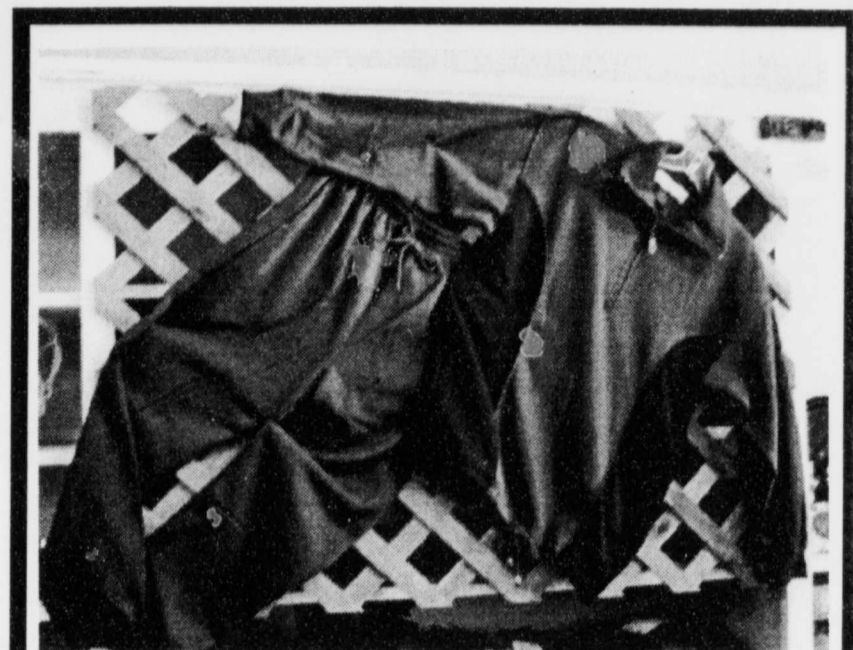

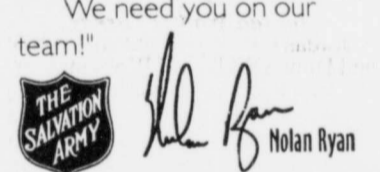

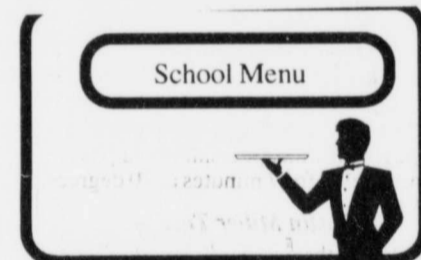

Postal Service Around The World

Forty percent of the world's mail volume is delivered right here in the United States by the U.S. Postal Service. But did you know that your local post office also provides international mail service to virtually every foreign country?
Letters, postcards, printed matter, small packets, Aerogrammes, parcel post and International Mail Express can be sent internationally at a reasonable price.
All categories of international mail, other than Express Mail, are sent using airmail or surface mail. In addition, INTELPOST (International Electronic Post) is available at many larger post offices. INTELPOST is an international facsimile message service available between the U.S. and more than 40 foreign countries. Through INTELPOST, a black and white image of each document is printed and delivered in the foreign country on the same day or next day depending on which delivery options are selected at the time of purchase.
To find out the type of international service you need, pick up the free international postal rates and fees publication at any post office. It contains all the general mailing information needed to send your important items to most foreign countries.

Proper packaging and addressing is just as important for international mail as it is for domestic.
Securely packaged parcels using strong, cushioned containers prevent damage and loss of contents. Pressure-sensitive reinforced tape is recommended for closing and sealing parcel openings and seams. Never use wrapping paper, string or twine. Otherwise, your international parcel may get damaged when handled by modern mail processing equipment.
The foreign country's name, in capital letters, should appear on the last line of your parcel's main address block; your return address should appear in the upper, left-hand corner of one side of the parcel; and complete address information should be included on a slip of paper inside the parcel.
Even though almost half of the world's mail is intended for mailing and delivery within the U.S., the Postal Service also stands ready to help with all your international mailing needs.
Whether you are sending a letter to a friend in Australia, a postcard to a relative in Ghana, or an International Express Mail article to business associate in Japan, the U.S. Postal Service delivers for you.
