I guess it's a little easier on the pocketbook than neutering because dog food can be bought a week at a time, but in the long run people spend more on food than on neutering. And, the problem of unwanted puppies and kittens is avoided with neutering.

Puppies and kittens are adorable, but sadly only a few will ever reach their first year because of illnesses that prey on the young, cars and the many other dangers that fill a small animal's world.

Out of a litter of five kittens only about one every makes that first birthday! The odds for a puppy aren't much higher. And those that do survive all too often are doomed to repeat the cycle of multiplication, endlessly overpopulating this world with unwanted pets!

But, if owners would neuter their pet or pets the population wouldn't be so overwhelming and the demand could more nearly meet the supply. As it is now the supplies are virtually endless and the demand for pets just cannot begin to cope with the overstock.

Please, if there is any way possible, have your dog or cat neutered, not only will you help in reducing the numbers of unwanted cats and dogs in this world, but you may find they make much more loving pets too! It is the responsible thing to do.

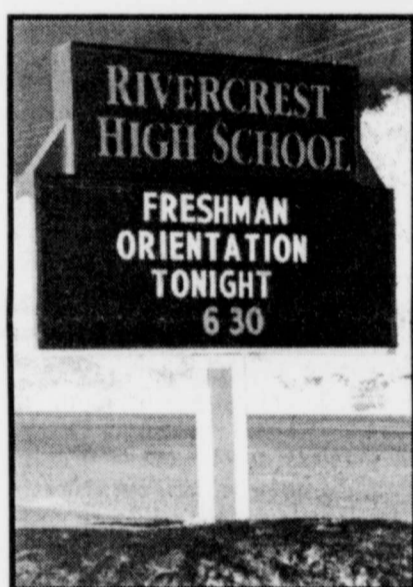

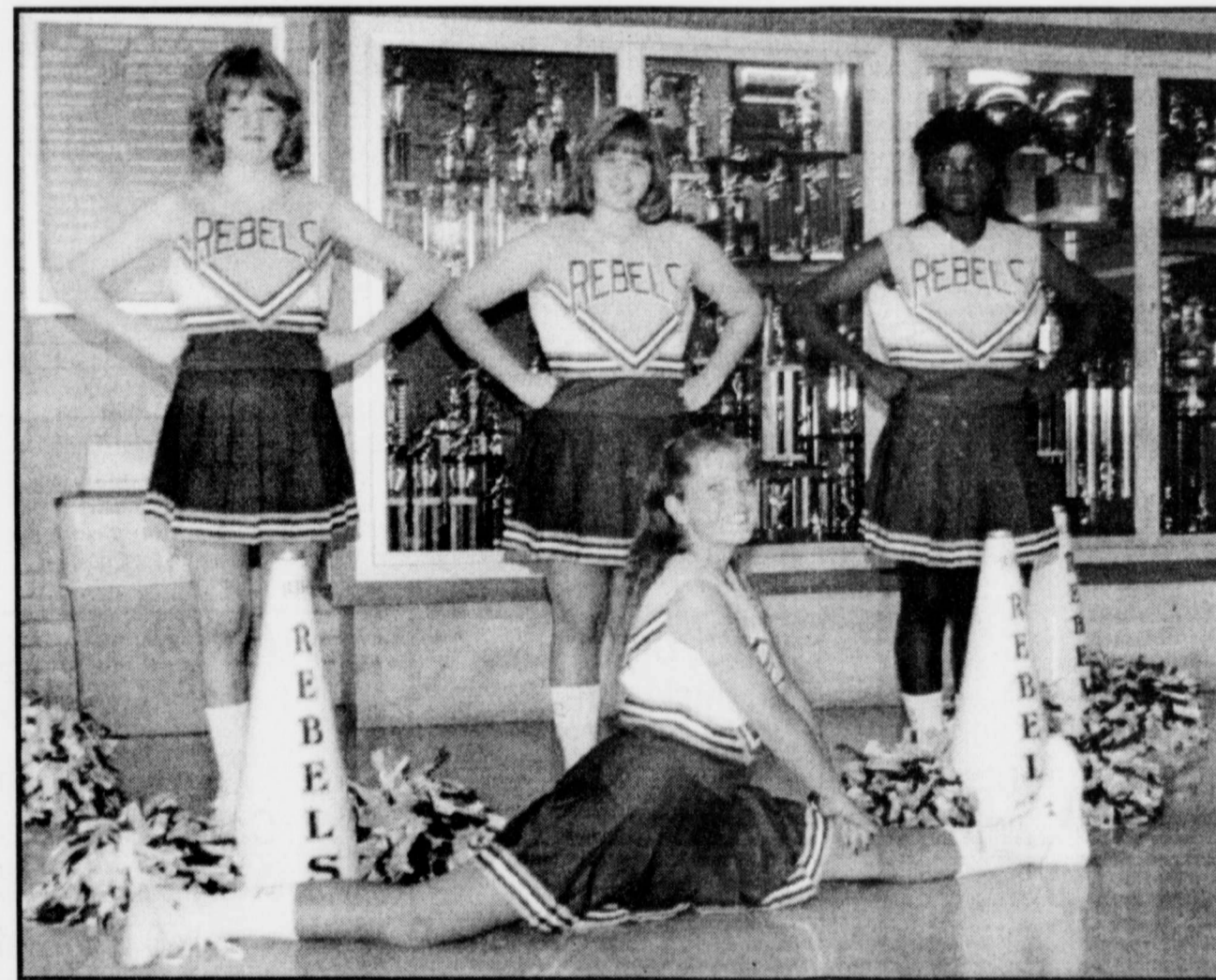


NEW MARQUEE- Rivercrest High School has installed a new marquee in front of the school. School announcements will be posted for the public. (Staff Photo Nancy Brown)

The Talco Baseball-Softball Association met Friday, Aug.2,1996 at the Talco City Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Vice President, Dale Grissom called the meeting to order. Secretary, Marta Rhoades read minutes from the previous meeting and they were approved. Treasurer, Judy Sloan reported all the bills for the year paid and a balance of \$246.05 in the groups account. There is still over \$200 out in candy money. Efforts will be made to collect this. The group had earned \$500 on Wal-Mart gift certificate sales, \$1000 on Firework sales and \$1524.00 on the Dixie Tournament to clear them for the year.

Old business was discussed. Judy Sloan reported not all of the uniforms and equipment have been turned in. Coaches will be contacted to help take care of this as soon as possible.

The next meeting was set of Oct. 3 at 7:00 p.m. at the Talco City Hall. The meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.

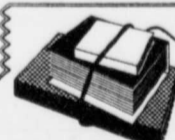
Others report on telemarketing problems

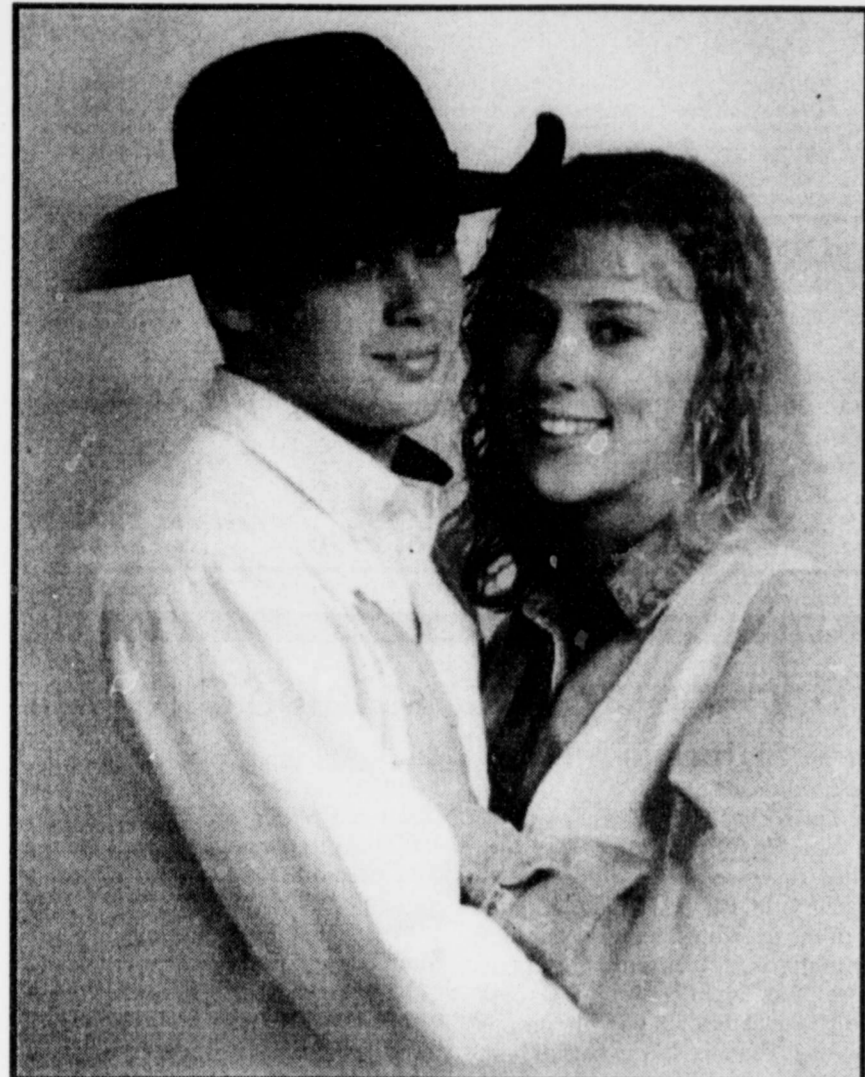

Pizza
Canadian bacon mushrooms pizza

Taco Salad

The speaker for this month is Mrs. Bertha Gable of Talco. She will present a program on the uses of various types of printed genealogy.

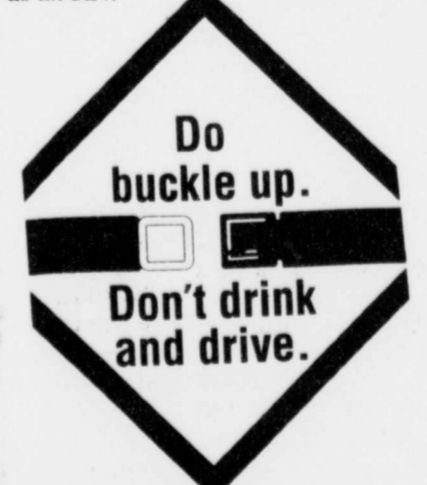
The program will include many examples of the familiar uses of this book.

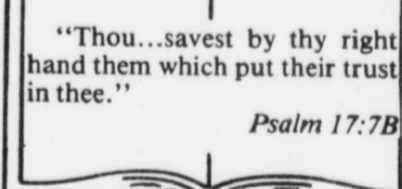

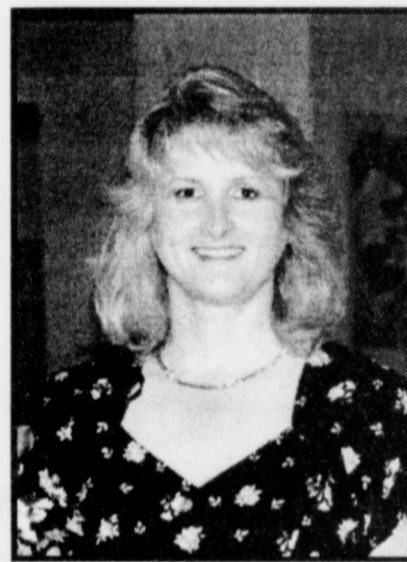

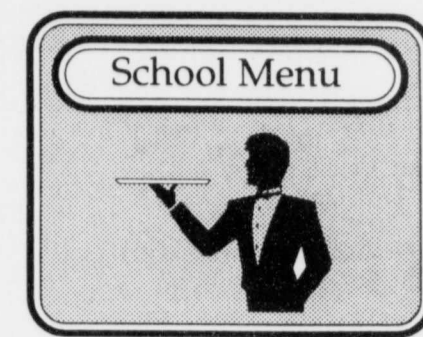
