After I told my little story two people pulled out twenty dollar bills and handed them to me to use for the project. One of these people I know quite well, the other I've never seen before!

Several people have gone through their children's clothes to bring good, nearly new clothing to me for a family. Another family has purchased dolls for Santa to bring, while yet another family is providing new shoes. Gift certificates for food are forthcoming for several families.

Each and every person I have spoken with says exactly what I said - "we have so much". And we do. It doesn't mean there aren't bills to pay, and debts to deal with. It doesn't mean there aren't family problems and worries to keep us all awake at night. But it does mean that on Christmas Day we can sit down with family or friends to a hearty meal. We can watch our children, or grandchildren, nieces or nephews tear into their packages and exclaim in delight at what "Santa" brought. And we can give (I hope) several moments to pondering the true meaning of Christmas, the original gift of love that prompts the celebration, and how wonderful it is.

## Santa(s) are alive and well in Detroit

When you think of Christmas, you think of smiling children's faces aglow with the wonder of Santa Claus. Visions of the toys and goodies that have been hoped for each year. Each child has his own version of what Santa should look, be and act like. But if you ask David Winkley of Detroit, his version of Santa, it will be a very wide variety of answers. You see David is no child, but he does have a fixation for Santa! Over 2300 of them in fact.

David and Donna Winkley moved to Detroit in August, where Donna took up the post of Elementary Principal in the Detroit ISD school system. They have two children. A son Shel is 11 and in the 5th grade and Samantha is a sophomore and 15 years old. David started his addiction some eight years ago with a Santa he and Donna rather fancied. From there it mushroomed. You see, they not only collect Santa's, they collect eagles, angels, cups, saucers, music boxes, all types of stained glass (complete villages I might add) and a variety of other items. I commented to David that he must be a mover's nightmare and received a hearty laugh.

They purchased the Nelson place in Detroit as much for the workshop out back as anything. It has been renovated with shelves, free standing and along the walls to accommodate this massive collection of Santa's. As you enter the shop, you are greeted by a lifesize replica talking Santa that welcomes all visitors to their home and wishes them a joyous Christmas. He is complete with his wish list for the children. Overhead, lining one wall is Donna's doll collection and across the room is the Family Christmas Tree, accompanied by, none other than another three foot Santa. There are also Santas riding a reindeer, riding a polar bear and in a sleigh with Rudolph and a small Santa Train Station. Keep in mind that these are not miniatures, they are well over a foot tall and can be set in motion.

Through the door into the workshop, you are greeted to the musical collection of various types of Santas playing a variety of Christmas music. They are all set on timers and play carols at different increments with the music constantly changing.

To the right is a complete farm village along with a Coca-Cola village and the complete scene from Night Before Christmas. David says that this depicts his family on Christmas Eve. Each member is represented, including grandfather, chil-

dren and parents, even the mouse (or family of mice having their own Christmas celebration). The North Pole Village is complete down to the smallest detail, with once again many one-of-a-kind and retired pieces. Lining the wall above the villages is a row of Santas from the famous Polish artist Pipka. These are a special numbered series and many are one of a kind. Above this shelf, begins the collection of Santa plates. They go around two walls and add a striking touch to the villages.

Next to the villages are small Santa figurines from Emmitt (the clown, not the football star), to cowboy Santa's, old world Santa's, to many from foreign countries and any type you can imagine. On a standing shelf is his collection of (keep in mind that most of these are over 1-1/2 feet tall) animated Santa's doing a little bit of everything. Feeding the reindeer, playing golf, sleeping, reading, eating, playing musical instruments and a variety of many more, all in motion.

In one corner, there is a lifelike Santa playing the piano, or should I say the "choir director", S. Claus. As the music begins, you look to your right and there are Santa's after Santa's lined up as if they are ready to sing carols on Christmas Eve. Any type you can imagine. Many of these are over one to two foot tall. It is as if they are on risers in a church choir raising their voices in exhalation. Another standing shelf displays two foot Santas adorned in wonderful, colorful Christmas attire. Many of these are handmade by renown artists such as Lynn Haney, Stone Soup, Timeless, Sierra Art and Donna, just to name a few. Once again, many of these are numbered and one-of-a-kind.

David related the stories about the many time at the "negotiating table", bargaining for these prized possessions. Many of these were in local restaurants, small shops and places that only buyers would know of. He would not even begin to account for the number of gallons of iced tea and cokes that he has consumed while bargaining for an item and said that four hours was a short time for him to negotiate a sale, if it was a certain piece that he wanted. He stated that the bargaining was the best part of the purchase. I believe, just from talking to him, that he was a "horse-trader" in a former life!

Adorning the side wall across the room is another assortment of animated Santa's, including a Santa bust with a wreath of mistletoe, a Santa in

a gold-embossed robe with gold adornments and staff.

Below on the floor and surrounding shelf is another group of animated Santas bathing, soaking his tired feet and much more. Lining the walls as you go out is his collection of numbered and limited editions of Santa's. He also has Santas lined up by country and dated, a collection of gold and white Santas, mercury Santa's, and Santas depicting any activity related to the holiday season.

David plans to leave these on permanent display in his "workshop" for others to enjoy. Before moving to Detroit, they were packed and re-packed each year for the holiday season only. They would begin around 7:00 a.m. after Thanksgiving and begin the unpacking and by Tuesday of the following week, the kids were thinking that they really were not sure about this Santa thing. Putting them away was another matter entirely. David says that he would start on or about the 10th of January and the last one would be packed by the end of March!

Their vacations consist of checking out Christmas shops wherever they go and they travel extensively. The kids know if they want to take an extra break, just find mom and dad a Christmas shop! Some of their favorite's are Christmas Cottage in Melbourne, Florida, Rudolph's in Baton Rouge, Louisiana and of course, the North Pole in Oklahoma, City. He has pieces from all over the United States and as far away as Russia, Norway, Poland and many other foreign countries.

Along with the Family tree, they have the Formal Tree in the Formal Living Room inside the house and a small Christmas Tree is on a table and is used on Christmas Eve to add the ornaments that are bought and placed each year and never used again until the children are out on their own. Then they are given the ornaments and can be used in their homes for their families.

Several of the classes from Detroit and Blossom have visited Mr. Winkley and his Santas. David extends a hearty welcome to anyone who wishes to view his collection and we thank him very much for his hospitality.

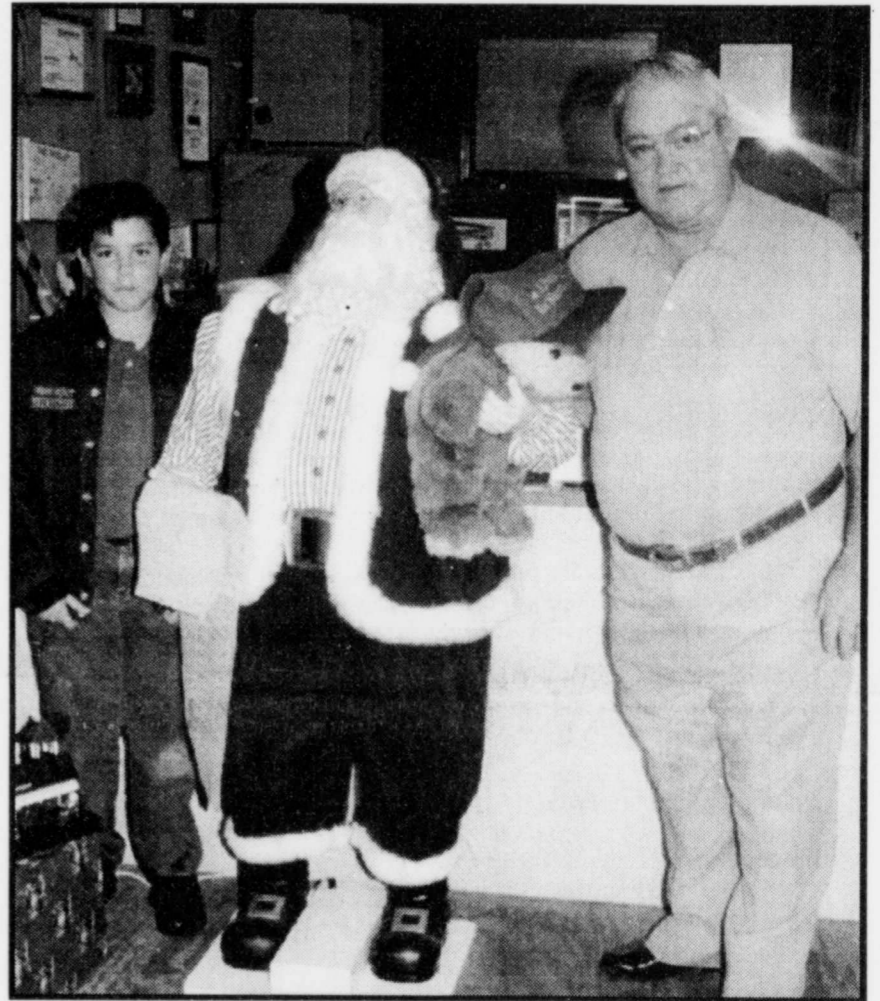

Things have been a little confused here at the papers. We had planned on using the ladies who hold an annual cookie swap as featured cooks this week, but didn't quite have room for all their recipes. Here are their Cooky Recipes, tried and tested and delicious. More recipes and a story will follow in the new year.

**CHOCOLATE MALTED COOKIES**  
Patsy Norrell

- 1 Cup butter flavored shortening
  - 1 1/4 cup packed brown sugar
  - 1/2 cup malted milk powder
  - 2 Tbl. chocolate syrup
  - 1 Tbl. vanilla
  - 1 Egg
  - 2 cups all purpose flour
  - 1 tsp. baking soda
  - 1/2 tsp. salt
  - 1 1/2 cups semisweet chocolate chunks
  - 1 cup (6 oz.) milk chocolate chips
- In mixing bowl combine first five ingredients, beat 1 minutes, add egg. Combine flour, soda, salt. Gradually add to creamed mixture, mixing well after each addition.
- Stir in chocolate chunks and chips. Shape into balls, place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets. Bake at 375 degrees for 12-14 minutes or until golden brown, yields 2 1/2 dozen.

**CHEWY PECAN COOKIES**  
Ann Lee

- 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
  - 1 cup sugar
  - 3/4 cup packed brown sugar
  - 3 eggs
  - 1/4 cup milk
  - 1 tsp. vanilla extract
  - 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
  - 1 Tbl. ground cinnamon
  - 1 tsp. salt
  - 1 tsp. pumpkin pie or apple pie spice
  - 2 cups quick-cooking oats
  - 2 cups raisins
  - 1 1/2 cups chopped pecans
- In a large mixing bowl, beat butter, sugars, eggs, milk & vanilla. Combine dry ingredients; add to creamed mixture & mix well. Stir in oats, raisins and nuts; mix well. Drop by Tablespoonsfuls onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until light golden brown. Remove from baking sheets to cool on wire racks. Yields 5-6 dozen

**ALMOND BARK COOKIES**

- 2 pounds almond bark
  - 2 cups dry roasted peanuts
  - 3 cups Rice Krispies
  - 1 cup chunky peanut butter
  - 2 cups mini-marshmallows
- Melt almond bark in 200 degree oven. Stir in peanut butter until smooth. Add the rest of the ingredients and mix well. Drop by spoonful on waxed paper.

**Frozen Dessert Chastiti Nation**

- 8 ounce cream cheese
- 3/4 cup sugar
- Cool Whip
- 15 ounce can pineapple
- 10 ounce frozen strawberries
- 2 mashed bananas
- 1/4 cup nuts(optional)

Beat cream cheese and sugar until creamy. Add 1 cup Cool Whip. Mix well. Mix pineapple, bananas, strawberries and nuts into your cream cheese mixture. Put into 8 x 12 pan and freeze. Cut into bars and serve.

**Christmas Wreaths Trista Benson**

- 1/2 cup unsalted butter
- 4 cups corn flakes
- 3 cups marshmallows
- 1/2 teaspoon green food coloring
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 teaspoons red hot's

Melt butter and marshmallows, stirring constantly for approximately 6 minutes or until all marshmallows are melted. Remove from heat and add coloring and corn flakes. Stir until melted. Grease fingers and form mixture into wreaths on waxed paper. Decorate immediately with red hot's. Serve and enjoy.

**Chocolate Revel Bars Brittany Bailey**

- 1 cup margarine
- 2-1/2 cups flour
- 2 cups packed brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 4 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3 cups rolled oats
- 1 can sweetened condensed milk
- 1-1/2 cups chocolate chips
- 2 tablespoons margarine
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts or pecans

In mixing bowl, beat margarine with mixer til softened. Add half of flour, the brown sugar, eggs, 2 teaspoons vanilla and baking soda. Beat til thoroughly combined. Then beat and stir in remaining flour. Stir in oats. Set oat mixture aside. In medium saucepan, heat milk, cocolate pieces and 2 tablespoons butter til chocolate is melted. Remove from heat and stir in walnuts and remaining vanilla. For crust, pat 2/3 of oat mixture into ungreased 15x10x1 inch pan. Then spread chocolate mixture on top of crust. Drop remaining oat mixture by teaspoonsful on top of chocolate layer. Bake in a 350 oven for 25 minutes or till top is lightly golden brown. Cool in pan on wire rack.

**Cherry Cream Cheese Pie Matt Oliver**

- 1 prepared graham cracker crust
- 1 package cream cheese
- 1 can sweetened milk
- 1/3 cup lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 can prepared pie filling

Let cheese stand at room temperature. Beat cheese until fluffy and gradually add milk. Stir well until mixed. Add

lemon juice, vanilla and stir well. Chill for three hours and garnish with pie filling.

**Pumpkin Pie John Merrill**

- 2 eggs
- 1 can Pumpkin Pie mix
- 1 can evaporated milk

Preheat oven to 425 degrees and in a large bowl slightly beat eggs. Add pumpkin and milk and mix thoroughly. Pour into 9 inch unbaked pie shell and bake for 15 minutes and reduce heat to 350 and bake for additional 50 minutes.

**Chocolate Pecan Bars David Smith**

- 3/4 cup flour
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/3 cup butter
- 2 tablespoons water
- 12 ounces chocolate chips
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease 9 inch square baking pan. Mix together flour and baking soda. In small saucepan, combine sugar, butter and water. Bring to a boil over medium heat and remove immediately. Stir in 1 cup morsels and vanilla until chocolate is melted and mixture is smooth. Transfer mixture to medium bowl. Cool completely. Stir in eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition. Gradually stir in flour mixture until smooth. Stir remaining chocolate and nuts into batter. Pour into prepared pan. Bake until toothpick inserted comes out clean.

**Chocolate-Pecan Fudge Andi Gillie**

- 1/2 cup butter
- 3/4 cup unsweetened chocolate
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 4 cups confectioners sugar
- 1-1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

Microwave butter in 2 quart bowl, on high for 1-1/2 minutes or until melted. Add cocoa; stir until smooth. Stir in sugar and vanilla; blend well (mixture will be dry and crumbly). Stir in milk and microwave on high 30-60 seconds or until mixture is hot. Stir until smooth; add chopped pecans. Pour into dish and garnish with pecan halves and cool.

**No-Bake Cookies Eric Lovelless**

- 2 cups sugar
- 1/3 cup cocoa
- 1/2 cup peanut butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 cups oats
- 1/2 cup milk
- 1 stick butter

Cook sugar, cocoa, butter and milk slowly until sugar is melted. Boil for 5 minutes and remove and add peanut butter, stirring until melted. Add oats, mixing well and drop by spoonful on waxed paper.

**ORANGE SLICE COOKIES**  
Dot Nichols

- 1 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1 pound orange slice candy
- 1/2 cup rolled oats
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 2 cups sifted flour
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 cup flour
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Cream sugar, shortening, eggs until light and fluffy. /Sift 2 cups flour with soda and salt. Blend into creamed mixture. Dice orange slice candy. Mix with 1/2 cup flour and add candy mixture to first mixture. Stir in chopped nuts and oats. Roll into 1 inch balls. Place on greased cookie sheet and press with fork. Bake at 325 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes. Makes 6 doz.

**BOCKY'S BOO BOOS**  
Bocky's Boo Boos

- 2 cups brown sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup shortening
- 4 cups flour
- 1 tsp. slat
- 1/2 tsp soda

Mix well, use hands if necessary. Work in pecans, walnuts, cherries, milk chocolate chips, coconut and brazil nuts (a good handful of each) Chill dough for better handling. Drop onto greased cookie sheets and bake at 350 degrees until lightly browned. Check after 5 to 7 minutes. Remove from oven while centers are soft. Do not overbake. Add whatever you like the name "boo boos" comes from a mess up on date pinwheels!

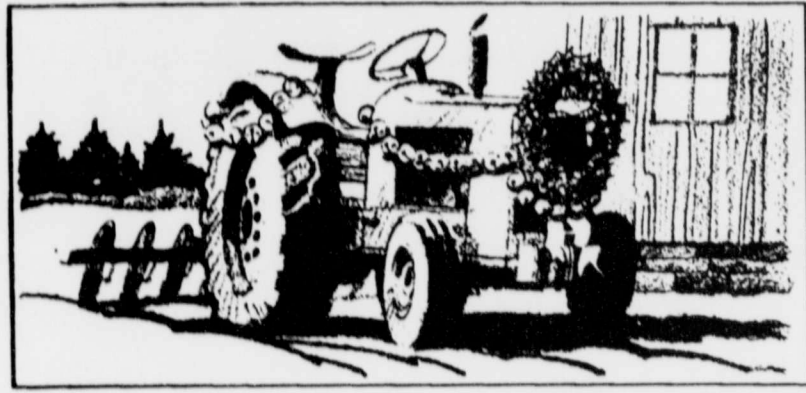

Honorable Mention-Memories of Christmas

This Christmas will be very different for our family. Mamaw and Papaw died just nine weeks apart this past summer, and they were a very big part of our Christmas. Mamaw and I were the only ones in the family who would start Christmas shopping on Labor Day, finding just the "perfect" gift for everyone. I am going to miss Mamaw calling me repeatedly to verify sizes and to confer about what we have purchased.

I remember the Christmas parade downtown each year. They used to have it on a weekday afternoon. It seems like the weather was colder than, or maybe they just had the parade later in December. Mamaw and Papaw would park downtown early in the afternoon to be sure we had a good spot from which to watch the parade. Some years my brother and I would march in the parade as a Girl Scout or Boy Scout. I remember one year I had the mumps on both sides of my neck and had to miss school a whole week. I was so upset about missing the parade, that my mother bundled me up so tightly that I could hardly move and made me sit in the car, but at least I got to see the parade.

One of my oldest and fondest Christmas memories is all of the family piling into the car to drive around town and look at Christmas lights. We had certain streets and houses that we had to drive by each year. I remember one year, Papaw couldn't go with us because of the shift he was working (so they said). I recall my brother and I being so excited because we actually saw Rudolph's red nose blinking as he led Santa's sleigh through the sky. While we were gone, Santa came and left our presents. I got the "Baby Peaches" doll I had picked out of the worn out Christmas catalog and my brother got the varoom motor he had asked for.

Mother and Daddy would go to their office Christmas parties and my brother and I would stay with Mamaw and Papaw. Mamaw was personal friends with Santa and Mrs. Claus, and she would call them on the telephone and let us talk to them. That was just amazing to us that Mamaw knew Santa's phone number and she could just call him up. While we were staying with them, Mamaw would always guess what we had bought her for Christmas. And she was usually right. Boy, was she good! Papaw would play "Rudolph, the Red Nosed Reindeer" and the Chipmunk Christmas album for us as loud as we wanted, and he would dance around and say, "Ho, ho, ho!" Mamaw always had divinity and fudge for us to eat, and as many cokes as we wanted.

Church was always important to our family, especially at Christmas. Mamaw would help direct and make costumes for the children's Christmas program. We were usually a shepherd, or angel or an animal. Although our family enjoyed exchanging gifts and always went all out, we didn't lose sight of the true meaning of Christmas.

On Christmas Eve, we would gather at Mamaw's house. When we would get out of the car, it would be so cold, and it "smelled" like Christmas in the air. When we got all of the presents under the tree, you could hardly see the living room floor. The grown ups would make us eat first before we could open gifts. Papaw would get in the middle of the floor and let the grandkids help him pass out the presents, while he Ho-ho-ho'd.

I can only remember one or two Christmases when we had snow, so we had to build a snowman and make snow ice cream. Christmas Day we would travel to my Granny Pat's who lived in the country. To me the trip was truly like the song "Over the River and Through the Woods to Grandmother's House we go." All of our cousins and aunts and uncles would be there. There sure was a bunch of us.

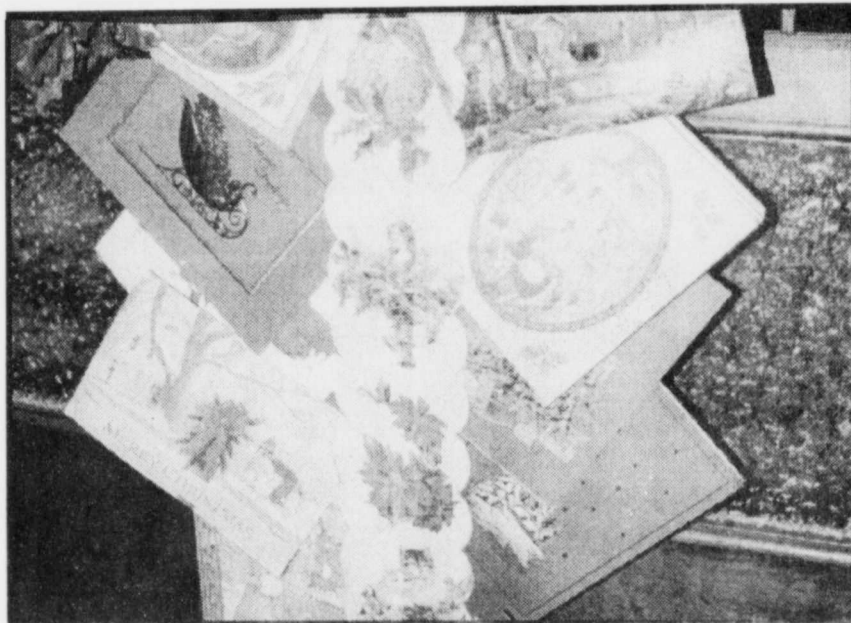
I remember one Christmas I heard "Santa" bringing our new bicycles from the storage room into the house. I think my brother and I got our parents out of bed at 3:30 A.M. that Christmas. They had just barely laid down.

No, Christmas won't ever be the same. But, I'm so glad I have these wonderful memories on which to reflect and tell my grandchildren. Christmas is still my favorite time of the year. I try to make it as special for my children as it was for me growing up. I catch myself this year picking up the phone to call Mamaw and confer with her about what to purchase for someone. I see something in the store and think, "That would be perfect to get for Mamaw." And then reality sets in.

This Christmas will be different - it won't be easy, but it will still be Christmas, and it will always be Jesus' birthday no matter what happens.

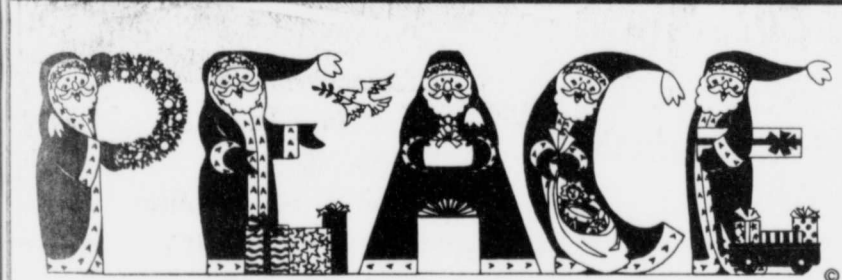

**First Place, Christmas Memories Contest, Memories of an Early 20th Century Christmas**

A few months ago we spent a lovely afternoon with two precious ladies - our mothers, Mrs. Lola Beatrice Fry Poindexter (age 94) and Mrs. Mary Magdalene Furgerson Scoggins (age 85). They came for lunch and after enjoying a nice meal together, Harley set up the video camera and we spent a very memorable time with them sharing life experiences with us.

The memories they shared were both exciting and frightening. We heard stories of a winter spent in a tent while a home was being built by the father, of times when food was scarce, illnesses and accidents that took family members, but their most memorable moments were of Christmases past.

Both women agreed that the gifts and treats they received were very similar. Usually they received a doll that had a cloth saw dust filled body with a porcelain head and hands. Sometimes it even had porcelain feet. Each received a stocking containing one orange, one apple, a few nuts, a few pieces of hard candy and sometimes a banana. This was the only time during the year that they had fruit that was not home grown.

Mother Poindexter shared special memories of Christmas Eve when all the families gathered at the grandparents' home. The most exciting time was when her grandfather would pop a very large dishpan full of popcorn, as all the grandchildren watched. He would fill a wire basket with the corn and pop it over the fireplace coals. One basket at a time was dumped into the dishpan as wide-eyed children watched. Grandfather would not let anyone have a bite until the pan was running over. During this time her grandmother would be parching peanuts. The delicious aromas filled the house and eager hungry children could hardly wait! When permission was finally given to eat, they devoured the treats with joy!

Mom Scoggins described a typical Christmas dinner- A turkey with all the trimmings was the centerpiece. Sometimes a baked ham would also grace the table. The vegetables would all be home grown and home canned. Homemade delicacies such as pies and cakes were also on the menu. This special menu was a far cry from their everyday meals consisting primarily of beans and potatoes.

The childhood of these ladies was spent during a time when there were virtually no cars. There also was no radio, no TV, no telephone, no electricity. Can you imagine!

How many of us would be happy and content with a Christmas such as these? How blessed we are.

**Rivercrest Rebels participate at North Hopkins**

The Rivercrest Rebels traveled to North Hopkins for tournament action

Dec. 12-14. In the Rebels first game of the tourney, they defeated the Clarksville Junior Varsity team with a score of 61-39, running their record up to 10-0 and setting up a tough contest for Friday morning vs the Quitman Bulldogs in the second round. Post, Broderick Fulbright was the brightest spot in the win with 25 points.

The Quitman Bulldogs used their inside muscle and strong shooting to upset the undefeated Rivercrest Rebels in the second round of the North Hopkins tournament. The loss was the first of the season for the state ranked Rebels.

# Stories On The Bogata Telephone Exchange

 This time you are going to be taken back to many years ago and get a view of the way the telephone system was then. One reason this is a prominent memory of persons who were teenagers in the 40's, is many of our homes did not have a telephone. That's right, no phone, no car phone, no cellular phone and no cordless phone. If you were fortunate enough to have a phone, it was probably on a party line, and that was definitely not private!

The Bogata Exchange was privately owned by Guy Smelser. His first wife, Cattie, who died in 1947, was an aunt of mine and that gave me the privilege of being around the working part of the business. My friends and I would play operator out in the old storage house. Two operators I remember most were Pansy Bonds and Fayette King (Clifton). There was an old switchboard and a lot of old telephones there.

My mother was Thelma Harper Davis, a sister of Cattie's. When cleaning out some of her things we found this picture of Guy and Cattie when they first married, about 1917, at the switchboard. We believe this was at the Talco office, which was where he was in 1917. Guy had on his climbing gear, as he did his own installations and repairs. Era Smelser still owns the Talco lot. The telephone office had a single bed for the night operator to use, as there were not a lot of night calls. The operator who most will remember is Myrtle Speir. She was the night operator. I can still remember her answering, "Num Plz." You might ask for John Doe and she would tell you he had just gone to town. Or, you might ask for a number and she would tell you that they were out in the garden. If you were on a party line, all numbers on the line would ring when you got a call. There would be one, two, three or more rings for each number and when it rang three rings you would know who was getting the call. There was one person who was on a party line that I called frequently who would pick up the phone to listen. You could always tell when she was listening because you could hear her ticking clock. When a person who did not have a phone got a long distance call, there would be a charge for a messenger. If I was available I would get on my bike and go tell the party there would be a call back at a certain time, and I would get the messenger fee. Myrtle Speir would go around and collect for the telephone service. She did this by walking around town. One source of information says she remembers Myrtle going to Cattie's funeral and walking back to the office to work afterward. This was in January and the funeral was at the Church of Christ (old location) and the office in the same location it is now.

The numbers were not seven digits for a long time. The Smelser number was 25, and some of the locals can probably recall their old numbers.

One of the early employees, Kenneth Jeffery, recalled that the system went to dial (from Operator assisted calls) in 1957, and the numbers were four digits. He said there were no phones in the Pine Branch area when he went to work in 1955. Earlier employees were Byrd Davis and Billy Whiskers. Earlier operators including Myrtle Speir were Louella Chesshir (Swaim), Nina Ward Chesshir (Hudson), Ruth King and Lois Barns (McRae). Several young men got their start in the telephone business here in Bogata and some are already retired. The old Bogata Telephone Company was sold to Continental Telephone of Texas and memories are all that remain of the old style. GTE still has their operations from the same corner lot on 271.

### More Telephone History By Frances Mayes Rozell

The first telephone service in Bogata was installed in 1903. It consisted of one small switchboard. The first telephone operator was Maude Coffield. She only worked during the day. The office was closed at six o'clock. It is not known who put in this switchboard. A few years later John Farris installed a large switchboard in his home on the corner of Howison and 3rd. Street across the street from the Pike house. It was later moved to downtown. It was located upstairs in the old Bank Building along with Charley Rodger's business office and Dr. Roach's office. Myrtle Speir was the operator. Mr. C.P. Pearson owned the business many years. He lived on the corner of Main and 5th Streets. Mr. Pearson sold to a Mr. Ledbetter who later sold to Guy Smelser. Guy built a new office on the corner of 271 and Howison Street.

Myrtle had worked as an operator in Rosalie for four or five years. Her father, William B. Speir, operated a blacksmith shop there. Myrtle had around 300 customers when she moved to the Bogata office, however the number declined steadily until World War II. The number of telephones increased to 430 by the year 1965 when Myrtle retired after 35 years from her manual switchboard. Taken from a newspaper article written about Myrtle at the time of her retiring: a co-worker patiently explained how to dial a number to several inquiring customers-Myrtle said, "You'll never learn it." They all laughed.

Guy Smelser was born December 23, 1898. He and Cattie moved to Bogata in the early 30's. Guy's mother, from Cookville, Texas, came to live in a little house just behind them. After her death, Guy moved the house up on the street front between his house and the telephone office. Irene Humphrey Garrett later had her beauty shop there. Irene's husband, Gene Garrett, was Guy's nephew. He lived with Guy and Cattie awhile and coached with Dixon Hatcher, the Bogata Football Team. (that's another story). Irene now lives in Carthage.

Sam Barnard's mother was Maggie Harper Barnard. She was a sister of Cattie's. Sam and his sister, Sally, stayed with Guy and Cattie a lot. Sam stayed six months at one time and went to school here while his parents were away. Even though they had no children of their own, Guy and Cattie always had children around. They were good friends of William and Frances Rozell. Neil remembers, when he was a little boy, he was with Guy and Cattie a lot and that Cattie gave him a pair of her lace up cowboy boots.

Cattie died in 1947 and is buried in the Bogata Cemetery.

Tommy Smelser's mother, Martha, married Guy and he and his brother, Teddy, and sister, Elizabeth (Ibby) came to live in Bogata. Tommy had had a very successful career in the telephone business also. He has been at the last two Homecomings and enjoyed his Bogata friends. He said he'll never miss another one. We hope he doesn't. Martha worked at the switchboard some. People didn't use their numbers much, even though this was early 50's. Everyone just rang Myrtle - told her who they wanted. Mary Margaret Barnard Vaughan worked one summer about this time. She remembers Martha being at the switchboard when a lady rang and asked rang and asked for the store. Martha thought, "Who is this what store?" Myrtle would have known. She didn't need numbers.

Mary Margaret worked the following summer two weeks at night so Myrtle could take a vacation. She of course got to sleep on Myrtle's famous cot. She remembers answering a call and realizing a little later she had not been good and awake-she said she guesses she connected to the right party-they started talking. She said Myrtle probably did calls in her sleep automatically all the time. Mary Margaret remembers different people would ring her at the switchboard and say, "I'm going over to visit so and so for a while. If I get any important calls". This was the time of the crank phone of course. You just turned the crank on the side of the telephone and it rang the office.

Molee Huddleston came to work about this time and became operator and manager, after Myrtle Speir retired. Some others who worked for Guy's telephone business were: Charlie Lewis, Donnie Strain, Billy Edwards, Booker T. Williams, Junior Blair, Whoopie Randolph and Tommy Smelser. Guy married Era Screws Patterson in 1968. He died in 1980.

Era still lives in the same home. She is active in the Church of Christ and feels lucky to have her family around her.

Guy was a wonderful friend and he served Bogata every way he could.

The year was 1981 in the month of December. For about the first two weeks of that month my time after school was spent at McCuiston Hospital. Because of cancer my Grandma Salter was isolated there to battle this disease. Everyday, my mother and I spent long dreadful hours with Grandma...I doning my homework and she sitting with her.

On one of these visits the realization came to me of the rapidly approaching Christmas Holidays. I loved Christmas shopping, which reminded me of the gift I had yet to purchase for Grandma. I bought Granddaddy's gift the week before with mother. Mother must have accidentally forgotten about Grandma.

I fantasized about Grandma coming home and having another wonderful Christmas with us. This year's gift would be the best one yet! I began making a list of things, in my mind, that I could buy her. After fifteen minutes of pondering I decided that clothes would be wonderful since Grandma had spent the past month in a gown. I couldn't wait to go shopping at Wal Mart!

As my mother stepped off the elevator I ran towards her and excitedly told her that we needed to buy Grandma a present. For some reason, maybe because of my excitement, mother's swollen red eyes or her withdrawn look was oblivious to me. I was too focused on buying Grandma a gift, which she would open at our family Christmas. Mother apparently saw the determination on my face, so she weakly smiled and said "okay".

Excitement filled my heart as we travelled to Wal-mart. When we arrived, I told Momma that I wanted to buy Grandma some clothes. Mother, in the nicest way she could, told me no. I quickly rattled off things from my "mental" list...a gown or maybe perfume. All of these suggestions were not suitable. My mother explained that Grandma could only wear hospital gowns and a perfume scent would make Grandma vomit.

However, I was determined to purchase some type of gift. Looking back as an adult, I can see the love Mother had for me that day. She was so tired and she couldn't force herself to tell me the truth about Grandma. Finally, I chose a tall white bottle of Aviance lotion. The lotion contained no scent; therefore my mother agreed to buy it.

When we returned home I immediately wrapped the lotion and placed it under the tree beside Granddaddy's. I couldn't wait for Christmas.

The next day, which was December 18, I was sent to my Granny Fowler's to spend the night. Grandma's condition had worsened. I never worried, because I would see her Christmas Eve. I'm my Granny Fowler knew Grandma's fate, but like my mother, she couldn't tell me.

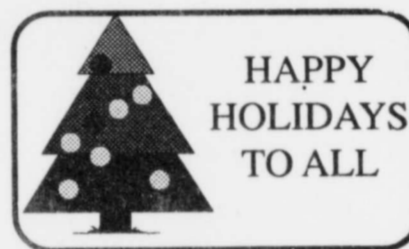

"This is the new Baptist Church building," were the words spoken by Headman Imenda of Ngandowe Village to Fred and a team of Baptist volunteers from Florida and local Baptist leaders in July 1996. One day earlier the combined team had led bible studies and worship services there when 51 people accepted Christ as Savior. We learned that they were very eager to have their own church and agreed to begin Bible studies and worship services that week, but said they had no Bibles nor materials to guide them. Fred agreed to return the next day to bring Bibles, study materials and hymnals.

Joy enjoys a Children's Bible Club which meets in our home each Monday afternoon. About 12 boys and girls are singing songs about Jesus, learning Bible stories and that God loves each of them. Before they leave they like to have a glass of ice-cold water before starting their 1/2 mile walk home in this hot weather.

When we returned the next day, Imenda asked if we would like to see inside the new church building. We agreed and went inside with about 30 villagers. As we stood there admiring the neat work with the poles, grass and mud, we were impressed. Then, Imenda said, "This is the new Baptist Church building." We were overwhelmed and asked how this could be. He explained that for 10 long years they had been promised by another denomination that their leaders would come and help them to start their own church. Finally, in desperation, the villagers decided to build a building, hoping that God would lead someone to come and help them. The, he said, "We feel God has sent you here."

With only 11 months remaining before we say good bye to Zambia after 27 1/2 years, we are already having difficulty thinking of leaving the people in Zambia. We will be in the missionary residence of First Baptist Church, Temple, TX for several months beginning in October 1997.

The above story represents many wonderful and exciting things that the Lord is doing here. We now have 10 Baptist churches and nine fellowships. More than 600 have been saved this year including the 328 who came to the Lord during the ministry of the Volunteer Team from Gainesville, FL. Now, our greatest challenge is to help our churches to train and nurture those new members. Please pray for them.

Kathy Susan Johnson was sentenced to 42 years in prison for the aggravated sexual assault of her daughter. Judge John F. Miller pronounced sentence Wednesday, December 4, 1996. County Attorney, Jack Herrington reported that Ms. Johnson was a participant in the rape of her 13 year old daughter. This is the first case of its kind where a mother was convicted of aiding in a rape. Eaphern Smith is also charged with aggravated sexual assault and his case will be tried sometime after the first of the year. Ms. Johnson will have to spend at least 21 years of her sentence day for day before she can ever be considered for parole. Herrington said that these kinds of offenses must be punished severely. Lives of children are permanently damaged by these acts. We will continue to take a hard line against sex offenders. This past year has seen a rise in sexual offenses against children filed in our office. I think public awareness has helped in getting people to come forward and report these crimes.

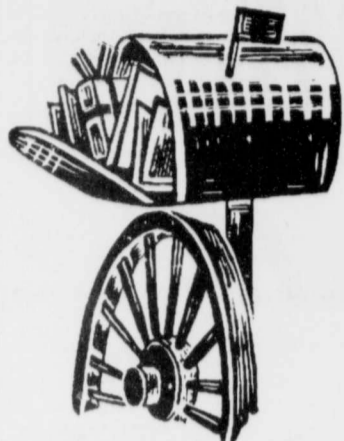

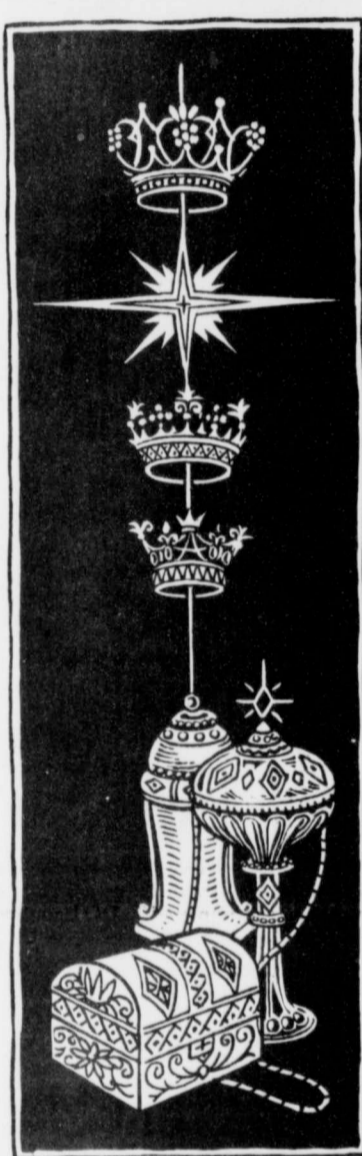
