After I told my little story two people pulled out twenty dollar bills and handed them to me to use for the project. One of these people I know quite well, the other I've never seen before!

Several people have gone through their children's clothes to bring good, nearly new clothing to me for a family. Another family has purchased dolls for Santa to bring, while yet another family is providing new shoes. Gift certificates for food are forthcoming for several families.

Each and every person I have spoken with says exactly what I said -"we have so much". And we do. It doesn't mean there aren't bills to pay, and debts to deal with. It doesn't mean there aren't family problems and worries to keep us all awake at night. But it does mean that on Christmas Day we can sit down with family or friends to a hearty meal. We can watch our children, or grandchildren, nieces or nephews tear into their packages and exclaim in delight at what "Santa" brought. And we can give (I hope) several moments to pondering the true meaning of Christmas, the original gift of love that prompts the celebration, and how wonderful it is.

Did we do much good? I don't know. Did we solve any big problems? Of course not. All we do know is that we feel better as we enjoy our bountiful holiday. I don't suppose we gave very much to those who received our offerings. But we gave ourselves a priceless gift.... the joy of giving.



But if you ask David Winkley of Detroit, his version of Santa, it will be a very wide variety of answers. You see David is no child, but he does have a fixation for Santa! Over 2300 of them in fact.

David and Donna Winkley moved to Detroit in August, where Donna took up the post of Elementary Principal in the Detroit ISD school system. They have two children. A son Shel is 11 and in the 5th grade and Samantha is a sophomore and 15 years old. David started his addiction some eight years ago with a Santa he and Donna rather fancied. From there it mushroomed. You see, they not only collect Santa's, they collect eagles, angels, cups, saucers, music boxes, all types of stained glass(complete villages I might add) and a variety of other items. I commented to David that he must be a mover's nightmare and received a hearty laugh.

They purchased the Nelson place in Detroit as much for the workshop out back as anything. It has been renovated with shelves, free standing and along the walls to accomodate this massive collection of Santa's. As you enter the shop, you are greeted by a lifesize replica talking Santa that welcomes all visitors to their home and wishes them a joyous Christmas. He is complete with his wish list for the children. Overhead, lining one wall is Donna's doll collection and across the room is the Family Christmas Tree, accompanied by, none other than another three foot Santa. There are also Santas ridng a reindeer, riding a polar bear and in a sleigh with Rudolph and a small Santa Train Station. Keep in mind that these are not miniatures, they are well over a foot tall and can be set in motion.

Through the door into the workshop, you are greeted to the musical collection of various types of Santas playing a variety of Christmas music. They are all set on timers and play carols at different increments with the music constantly changing.

To the right is a complete farm village along with a Coca-Cola village and the complete scene from Night Before Christmas. David says that this depicts his family on Christmas Eve. Each member is represented, including grandfather, chil-

Christmas celebration). The North Pole Village is complete down to the smallest detail, with once again many one-of -a-kind and retired pieces. Lining the wall above the villages is a row of Santas from the famous Polish artist Pipka. These a a special numbered series and many are one of a kind. Above this shelf, begins the collection of Santa plates. They go around two walls and add a striking touch to the villages.

Next to the villages are small Santa figurines from Emmitt(the clown, not the football star), to cowboy Santa's, old world Santa's, to many from foreign countries and any type you can imagine.

On a standing shelve is his collection of (keep in mind that most of these are over 1-1/2 feet tall) animated Santa's doing a little bit of everything. Feeding the reindeer, playing golf, sleeping, reading, eating, playing musical instruments and a variety of many more, all in motion.

In one corner, there is a lifelike Santa playing the piano, or should I say the "choir director", S. Claus. As the music begins, you look to your right and there are Santa's after Santa's lined up as if they are ready to sing carols on Christmas Eve. Any type you can imagine. Many of these are over one to two foot tall. It is as if they are on risers in a church choir raising their voices in exhaltation. Another standing shelf displays two foot Santas adorned in wonderful, colorful Christmas attire. Many of these are handmade by renown artists such as Lynn Haney, Stone Soup, Timeless, Sierra Art and Donna, just to name a few. Once again, many of these are numbered and one-of-a-kind.

David related the stories about the many time at the "negotiating table", bargaining for these prized possessions. Many of these were in local restaurants, small shops and places that only buyers would know of. He would not even begin to account for the number of gallons of iced tea and cokes that he has consumed while bargaining for an item and said that four hours was a short time for him to negotiate a sale, if it was a certain piece that he wanted. This Christmas will be different- - it won't be easy, but it will still be 'hristmas, and it will always be Jesus' birthday no matter what happens.



Bland entered the contest sporting a 14-1 season record compared to the Rebels 11-1.


The Rebels quickly pinned loss number two on Bland, which is a state ranked and one of the strongest class A teams around.



Stories On The Bogata Telephone Exchange By Mary Kathryn (Davis) Cotten One of the early employees, Kenneth Sam Barnard's mother was Maggie

This time you are going to be taken back to many years ago and get a view of the way the telephone system was then. One reason this is a prominent memory of persons who were teenagers in the 40's, is many of our homes did not have a telephone. That's right, no phone, no car phone, no cellular phone and no cordless phone. If you were fortunate enough to have a phone, it was probably on a party line, and that was definitely not private!

The Bogata Exchange was privately owned by Guy Smelser. His first wife, Cattie, who died in 1947, was an aunt of mine ant that gave me the privilege of being around the working part of the business. My friends and I would play operator out in the old storage house. Two operators I remember most were Pansy Bonds and Fayette King (Clifton). There was an old switchboard and a lot of old telephones there.

My mother was Thelma Harper Davis, a sister of Cattie's. When cleaning out some of her things we found this picture of Guy and Cattie when they first married, about 1917, at the switchboard. We believe this was at the Talco office, which was where he was in 1917. Guy had on his climbing gear, as he did his own installations and repairs. Era Smelser still owns the Talco lot. The telephone office had a single bed for the night operator to use, as there were not a lot of night calls. The operator who most will remember is Myrtle Speir. She was the night operator. I can still remember her answering, "Num Plz." You might ask for John Doe and she would tell you he had just gone to town. Or, you might ask for a number and she would tell you that they were out in the garden. If you were on a party line, all numbers on the line would ring when you got a call. There would be one, two, three or more rings for each number and when it rang three rings you would know who was getting the call. There was one person who was on a party line that I called frequently who would pick up the phone to listen. You could always tell then she was listening because you could hear her ticking clock. When a person who did not have a phone got a long distance call, there would be a charge for a messenger. If I was available I would get on my bike and go tell the party there would be a call back at a certain time, and I would get the messenger fee. Myrtle Speir would go around and collect for the telephone service. She did this by walking around town. One source of information says she remembers Myrtle going to Cattie's funeral and walking back to the office to work afterward. This was in January and

Jeffery, recalled that the system went to dial (from Operator assisted calls) in 1957, and the numbers were four digits. He said there were no phones in the Pine Branch area when he went to work in 1955. Earlier employees were Byrd Davis and Billy Whiskers. Earlier operators including Myrtle Speir were Louella Chesshir (Śwaim), Nina Ward Chesshir (Hudson), Ruth King and Lois Barns (McRae). Several young men got their start in the telephone business here in Bogata and some are already retired. The old Bogata Telephone Company was sold to Continental Telephone of Texas and memories are all that remain of the old style. GTE still has their operations from the same corner

lot on 271. **More Telephone History By Frances Mayes Rozell**

The first telephone service in Bogata was installed in 1903. It consisted of one small switchboard. The first telephone operator was Maude Cofield. She only worked during the day. The office was closed at six o'clock. It is not known who put in this switchboard. A few years later John Farris installed a large switchboard in his home on the corner of Howison and 3rd. Street across the street from the Pike house. It was later moved to downtown. It was located upstairs in the old Bank Building along with Charley Rodger's business office and Dr. Roach's office. Myrtle Speir was the operator. Mr. C.P. Pearson owned the business many years. He lived on the corner of Main and 5th Streets. Mr. Pearson sold to a Mr. Ledbetter who later sold to Guy Smelser. Guy built a new office on the corner of 271 and Howison Street.

Myrtle had worked as an operator in Rosalie for four or five years. Her father, William B. Speir, operated a blacksmith shop there. Myrtle had around 300 customers when she moved to the Bogata office, however the number declined steadily until World War II. The number of telephones increased to 430 by the year 1965 when Myrtle retired after 35 years from her manual switchboard. Taken from a newspaper article written about Myrtle at the time of her retiring: a co-worker patiently explained how to dial a number to several inquiring customers-Myrtle said,"You'll never learn it." They all laughed.

Guy Smelser was born December 23, 1898. He and Cattie moved to Bogata in the early 30's. Guy's mother, from Cookville, Texas, came to live in a little house just behind them. After her death, Guy moved the house up on the street front between his house and the telephone office. Irene Humphrey Garrett later had her beauty shop there. Irene's husband, Gene Garrett, was Guy's nephew. He lived with Guy and Cattie awhile and coached with Dixon Hatcher, the was 25, and some of the locals can Bogata Football Team.(that's another

Harper Barnard. She was a sister of Cattie's. Sam and his sister, Sally, stayed with Guy and Cattie a lot. Sam stayed six months at one time and went to school here while his parents were away. Even though they had no children of their own, Guy and Cattie always had children around. They were good friends of William and Frances Rozell. Neil remembers, when he was a little boy, he was with Guy and Cattie a lot and that Cattie gave him a pair of her lace up cowboy boots.

Cattie died in 1947 and is buried in the Bogata Cemetery.

Tommy Smelser's mother, Martha, married Guy and he and his brother, Teddy, and sister, Elizabeth (Ibby) came to live in Bogata. Tommy had had a very successful career in the telephone business also. He has been at the last two Homecomings and enjoyed his Bogata friends. He said he'll never miss another one. We hope he doesn't. Martha worked at the switchboard some. People didn't use their numbers much, even though this was early 50's. Everyone just rang Myrtle - told her who they wanted. Mary Margaret Barnard Vaughan worked one summer about this time. She remembers Martha being at the switchboard when a lady rang and asked rang and asked for the store. Martha thought, "Who is thiswhat store?" Myrtle would have known. She didn't need numbers.

Mary Margaret worked the following summer two weeks at night so Myrtle could take a vacation. She of course got to sleep on Myrtle's ;famous cot. She remembers answering a call and realizing a little later she had not been good and awakeshe said she guesses she connected to the right party-they started talking. She said Myrtle probably did calls in her sleep automatically all the time. Mary Margaret remembers different people would ring her at the switchboard and say," I'm going over to visit so and so for a while. If I get any important calls". This was the time of the crank phone of course. You just turned the crank on the side of the telephone and it rang the office.

Molee Huddleston came to work about this time and became operator and manager, after Myrtle Speir retired. Some others who worked for Guy's telephone business were: Charlie Lewis, Donnie Strain, Billy Edwards, Booker T. Williams, Junior Blair, Whoopie Randolph and Tommy Smelser. Guv married Era Screws Patterson in 1968. He died in 1980.

Era still lives in the same home. She is active in the Church of Christ and feels lucky to have her family around her.


