I told him that was the reason I bought this particular brand of leather cleaner, because it kept the Jeep smelling nice and new (and takes care of the smell of cocker spaniel hair, which is usually scattered liberally around).

That set us wondering...just how do they get that new leather smell in a can? Which, naturally, brings me to some other scents-in-a-

Air fresheners...consider the scents they pack in there with the propane propellants! Rain shower fresh, pot-pourri, baby powder scented, sunflower scented (hey, I've sniffed a sunflower, wasn't impressed), apple & cinnamon, orchard fresh, sea breeze, the list goes on and on. And, they all smell really pleasant, and different from one another.

Consider the anti-bacterial desinfectants...how do they put the pleasant scent into them?

Perhaps one of the most commonly used scents is that of the lemon. Citrus smells abound in air fresheners. cleansers, car fresheners, oven cleaners, even perfumes.

Which takes us on to yet aspect another things...perfumes and colognes. Did you know that years ago some of the most expensive scents featured a very bizarre base...it was (I'm not making this up) whale vomit. And where do you think the original musk scents came from? Now that you are totally disgusted I'll ponder further...if they use that type of stuff, what other things do they blend together for those expensive scents we lavish about?

Do they fill a big room up with apple pies and then capture the air? I seriously doubt it, but can't you see a crew leaping about, swiping cans though the air and clapping the lids on them?

Oh, I know that much of the scents today are synthetically created, but they still must have to crush a lot of flowers to make those few drops of scented oil to go in spray cans and pump bottles.

I still think it's a neat trick to put the smell of a leather shop inside of a little spray can ...and I'd love to know the real story behind how it is done.







# Stakeholders hear proposals about four lanes through or around towns

At a stake holders meeting Tuesday night at the Rivercrest High School Auditorium in Johntown a capacity audience discussed a 137 million dollar project to build a four lane highway from Paris to Mt. Pleas-

Representatives of Dannenbaum Engineering Corporation first discussed the types of lanes to be built and the process of surveying areas along present U.S. 271. The new lanes proposed are to be built in the same style of surface that the present U.S. 271 is built of.

The project will be built in five phases.

The first phase will be advance planning and environmental study and development of the right of way. This could take from 2 to 2 1/2 years to complete.

Phase 2 will be the appraisal and catn take up to 2 years.

Phase 3 will involve funding for the project which was set at 137

million two years ago. Although some funding is available now for White Oak, Ripley and

Mustang Creek and Sulphur River bridges. Phase 4 will involve developing

contracts to build. Phase 5 will be the actual work on

the project. Projection of the start date for the project can be as long as five years

from now. The first phase of the project will start at Paris on the south side of the city with a six to seven million dollar interchange. The next section would projected cost of 9-11 million dol-

At Deport, Bogata and Talco relief routes around the cities are being studied. For an example, at Deport on the west side an area from north of County Road 15300 extending east and back south across FM 1149 on the east side of the city back to the existing U.S. 271. The south boundary starts at the the west side of the city and takes a turn to the south east crossing of FM 1501 and 1503 just south of Milton-Minter Road on east and south of the Old Deport Cemetery and turns back into the present U.S. 271 on toward Bogata.

According to Steve Ekstrom, the four lanes can be located anywhere

between these boundaries. At Bogata and Talco the areas from north to south of the cities form a loop on both north and south and come together on he east side to join the presently existing U.S. 271. Again, any area between the north and south boundaries could be where the four lane routing could actually be built.

According to Ekstrom, plans are to keep as much of the existing road in use as much as possible. If a relief route is used around any of the cities between Paris and Mt. Pleasant, the old part of US 271 will become a business U.S. 271 and will be state maintained.

The need for a four lane highway on US 271 is cited to relieve the traffic load on Interstate 45. Officials say that I-45 at the present time is

over loaded with traffic A question and answer session was held after a short recess. Many landowners were concerned about entrance, exits, crossings and bridges along the route.

Market values and distance of highways to property lines were discussed as well.

Many land and home owners didn't receive a right of entry from Dannenbaum Engineering Corp., Hayter Engineering, Inc. Hicks and Company and Aerial Data Service Inc., they said.

Forms were handed out to those present who did not receive one in the mail prior to the meeting. The forms are needed so that the surveyors can be built from Paris to Pattonville at a enter property in the proposed areas for a large X to be placed at approximately 1800 foot intervals. 

Lemon Squares l cup all-purpose flour

1/3 cup confectioner's sugar 1/3 cup butter or margarine l cup sugar

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour 1/2 teaspoon baking powder 1/4 teaspoon salt

3 egg whites-lightly beaten 1-1/2 teaspoons grated lemon rind 1/2 cup fresh lemon juice

1/4 teaspoon butter extract Combine I cup flour and 1/3 cup confectioner's sugar; cut in butter with pastry blender until mixture is crumbly. Press firmly into bottom of lightly greased 11x7 baking dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until lightly brown. Whish together granulated sugar and next 8 ingredients; pour over prepared crust. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes or until filling is set. Cool on wire rack. Cut into sdquares; sprinkle evenly with confectioner's sugar.

Chocolate Swirled Poundcake sticks butter or margarine

3 cups sugar 6 large eggs

4 cups all purpose flour 3/4 cup milk

l teaspoon vanilla extract 1/2 cup chocolate syrup

Beeat butter at medium speed with

an electric mixer 2 minutes or until creamy. Gradually add sugar, beating 5-7 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, beating just until yellow disappears. Add flour to mixture alternately with milk. Mix at low sped until blended after each addition. Stir in vanilla. Combine I cup batter and chocolate syrup, stirring until blended. Divide remaining batter in half; pour I half into prepared tube pan. Spoon half of chocolate batter on top; repeat layers. Gently swirl batter with knife. Bake at 325 degrees for I hour and 35 minutes.

Peanut Butter Tarts

I package refrigerated pie crusts I cup creamy peanut butter I cup confectioner's sugar 2/3 cup granulated sugar 1/3 cup cornstarch

1/8 teaspoon salt 3 egg yolks 1-1/2 cup milk

I cup half and half 3 tablespoons butter or margarine l teaspoon vanilla

Roll each piecrust into 1/8-inch thickness and cut each into 4 sections. Press each section into a 4-1/2-inch tart pan with removeable bottom. Roll a rolling pin over tops of sections to cut dough edges. Bake at 450 degrees for 8 minutes. Cool. Combine peanut butter and confectioners sugar. Spread evenly over tart shells. Combine granulated sugar, cornstarch and salt in medium pan, stirring well. Whisk in egg yolks, milk and half and half. Cook over medium heat whisking constantly, until thickened Remove mixture from heat and stir in butter and vanilla. Pour evenly into tart shells and chill. Top with whipped cream and chopped peanuts.

Cherry Cheesecake Bars 2 cups all-purpose flour 1-1/2 cup uncooked quick oats 3/4 cup firm; ly packed brown sugar 1/2 cup butter or margarine -8 ounce cream cheese-softened I can sweetened condensed milk 1/4 teaspoon almond extract I can cherry fruit filling

Line 13x9 pan with aluminum and lightly grease. Combine first 4 ingredients in a large bowl, stirring until mixture is crumbly. Reserve I cup mixture. Press remaining mixture onto bottom of prepared pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes. Beat cream cheese at medium speed with mixer I minute or until fluffy. Gradually add milk and almond extract, beating until smooth. Spread over crust and top with fruit filling Sprinkle reserved mixture on top and bake at 350 degrees for 45-50 minutes until golden brown. Cool and chill.


