## Talco exes to honor 50 year class of 1952

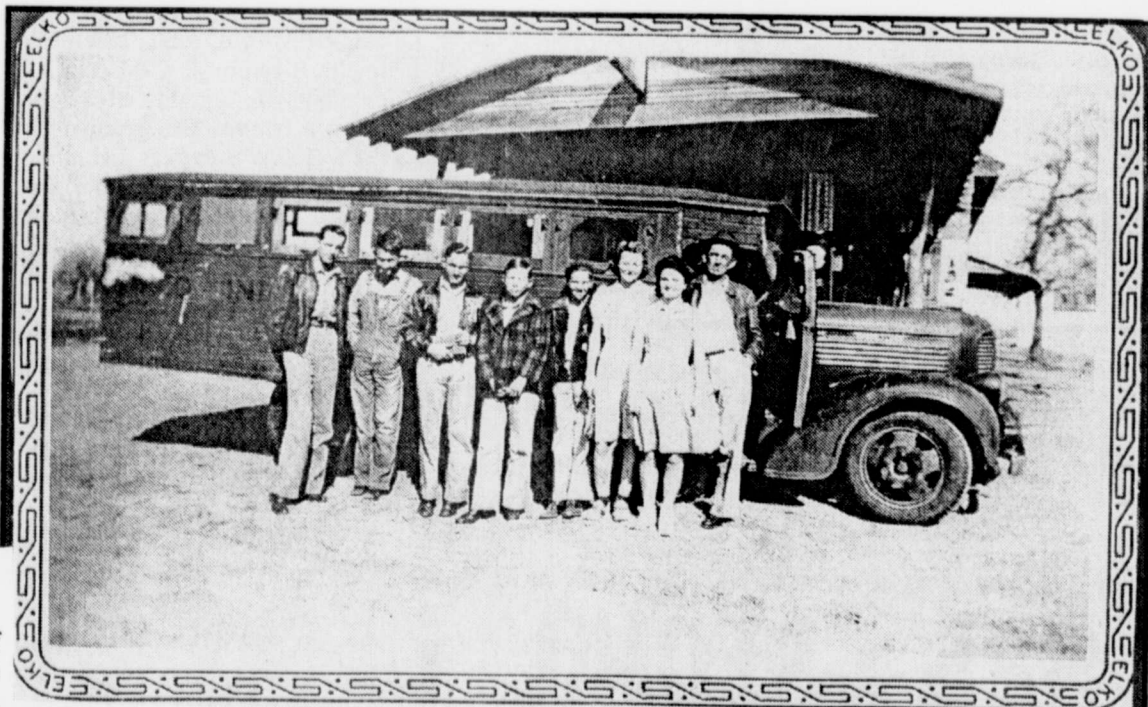

**Cornbread Squares**

- 2 cans whole kernel corn-undrained-15-1/4 ounce
- 2 cans cream style corn-14-3/4 ounce
- 2 cups sour cream
- 1 cup butter or margarine-melted
- 2 packages cornbread muffin mix-8-1/2 ounces each
- 3 eggs

In large mixing bowl, combine all ingredients and beat until combined. Pour into two greased 13x9x 2 baking dishes. Bake at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool for 15 minutes and serve warm. Yield 24 servings.

**Confetti Cabbage Slaw**

- 10 pounds cabbage-shredded
  - 2 tablespoons salt
  - 6 cups vinegar
  - 1 cup cider vinegar
  - 1-1/2 cups water
  - 2 tablespoon mustard seed
  - 2 tablespoon celery seed
  - 1 bunch celery-chopped
  - 4 medium carrots-shredded
  - 1 medium sweet red pepper-diced
  - 1 medium green pepper-diced
- In large bowl, combine cabbage and salt and let stand for 2 hours. In large saucepan, combine sugar, water, vinegar, mustard seed and celery seed. Bring to boil over medium heat and stir until sugar is dissolved. Remove from heat and cool completely. Drain cabbage if desired and add remaining vegetables and add dressing and toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours or freeze for up to 3 months. Serve with slotted spoon. Yields 50-60 servings.

**Toffee- Chip Cookies**

- 1 cup butter or margarine-softened
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 eggs
- 3-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 3 cups crisp rice cereal
- 1 cup quick cooking oats
- 1 cup flaked coconut
- 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup English toffee bits or almond briclé chips

In large mixing bowl, cream butter, oil, sugars and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine flour, cream of tartar, baking soda and salt. Add to the creamed mixture. Stir in remaining ingredients and drop by table-spoonful 2 inches apart onto greased baking sheet. Bake at 350 degrees for 10-12 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to wire rack to cool. Yield 12 dozen.

**Brunswick Stew**

- 4 large onions-halved and thinly sliced
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1 broiler/fryer-cutup (3-4 pounds)
- 2 quarts water
- 2 cans crushed tomatoes-28 oz. each
- 1-3/4 cups catsup
- 1 can tomato paste-6 ounce
- 10-3/4 ounce can condensed tomato soup-undiluted
- 2 medium jalapeno peppers-seed and chopped
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon hot pepper sauce
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1 pound fully cooked ham
- 2 lb. ground beef-cooked and drained
- 16 oz package frozen cut green beans
- 16 ounce package frozen beans
- 16 ounce package frozen corn
- 6 cups hot mashed potatoes-prepare without milk and butter

In large stockpot saute onions in butter until tender. Add chicken and water. Bring to boil and reduce heat and cover to simmer for 1 hour. Remove chicken and debone and dice. Skim fat from broth and return chicken to broth. Add next 14 ingredients and bring to boil. Reduce heat and cover to simmer for 1 hour or until vegetables are tender. Stir in potatoes and heat through. Yield about 8 quarts for a little over 25 servings. When cutting or seeding the jalapeno peppers use rubber gloves to protect your hands and avoid touching your face.

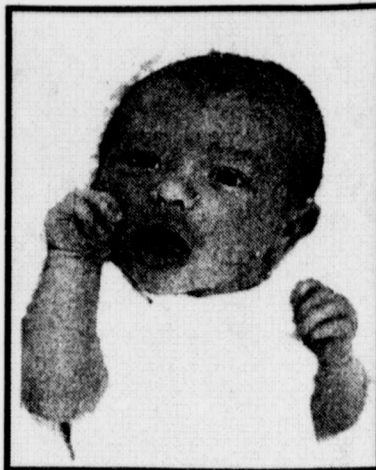
Some people spend their extra hours making other SMILE! That's what Mary Ellen Kain of Bogata did Friday.

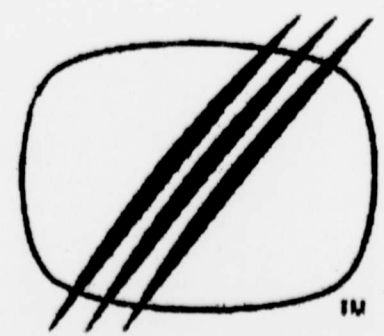

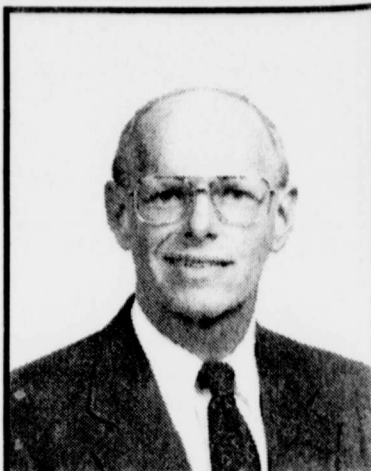
