Community Birthday Calendars Arrive

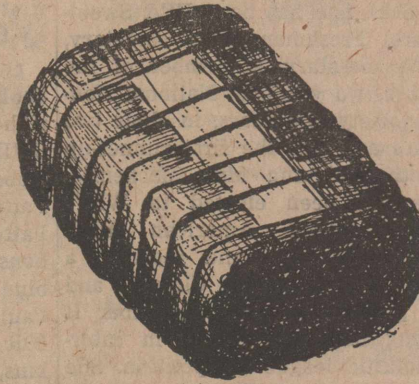
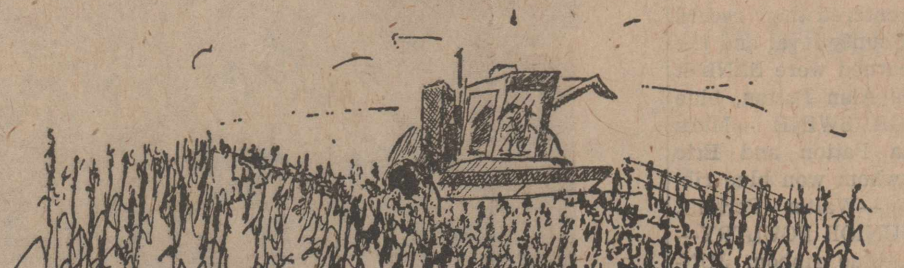
The Community Birthday Calendars have arrived and may be picked up at the high school building during the Homecoming activities on Saturday.

The 84th anniversary of the organization of Briscoe County will be celebrated during the annual Silverton Young Farmers Rodeo August 12-13-14.

Activities will begin with a western parade through downtown Silverton at 4:00 p.m. August 12. Trophies will be awarded to the best riding clubs in the parade, and cash prizes will be awarded for the best floats. In addition, a bicycle parade will be held for the youngsters, with cash prizes for the cleverest bicycle decoration. The parade will form on south Main Street, and the bicycle parade will form just off Main Street at the old Silverton Hotel. Entries in the bicycle parade will need to stop by the Briscoe County News for an entry number before parade time.

Ginny Lee Winchell of KVII-TV in Amarillo is to be here for the parade and barbecue representing the television station.

The parade will be followed by a free barbecue in the City Park. Serving begins at 5:00 p.m.

There will be three performances of the Silverton Young Farmers Rodeo, beginning August 12-13-14 at 8:00 p.m. The first 30 contestants per event will be accepted. The rodeo secretary, Fred Strange. Rodeo books open at 8:00 a.m. August 9 and close at 8:00 p.m. August 10. The rodeo secretary may be contacted at 806 823-2253. Entrants must be 18 years old or have parents' release, and entry fee money must be in before Thursday's performance.

The rodeo events and entry fees are: Tie Down Calf Roping, \$27.00; Heading and Heeling, \$27.00; Ladies Barrel Race, \$27.00; Bareback Bronc Riding, \$27.00; Bull Riding, \$27.00; Kids Break-Away Roping, \$5.00; Saddle Bronc Riding, \$27.00. There will be a calf scramble each performance. Stock will be furnished by C Bar T Rodeo Company of Lubbock. Admission will be \$2.50 for adults and \$1.00 for children.

Dances will be held nightly beginning at 9:00 o'clock on the concrete slab. Music will be by Windy Wood's band.

Construction Contract Let For Paving Project

Highway construction contracts let in July by the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission include work in Briscoe County.

District Engineer Lewis White of Childress announced that a contract was awarded to Earthmovers, Inc. of Amarillo for the construction of F. M. Road 3365. Low bid was \$193,534.27.

The project is for grading, structures, base and surfacing on Farm to Market Road 3365 extending from State Highway 86, 2.0 miles east of Silverton, northward a distance of 4.9 miles.

Construction of this Farm to Market road will require an estimated 120 working days to complete, and work will be under the supervision of Everett H. Monroe, engineering technician in Clarendon.

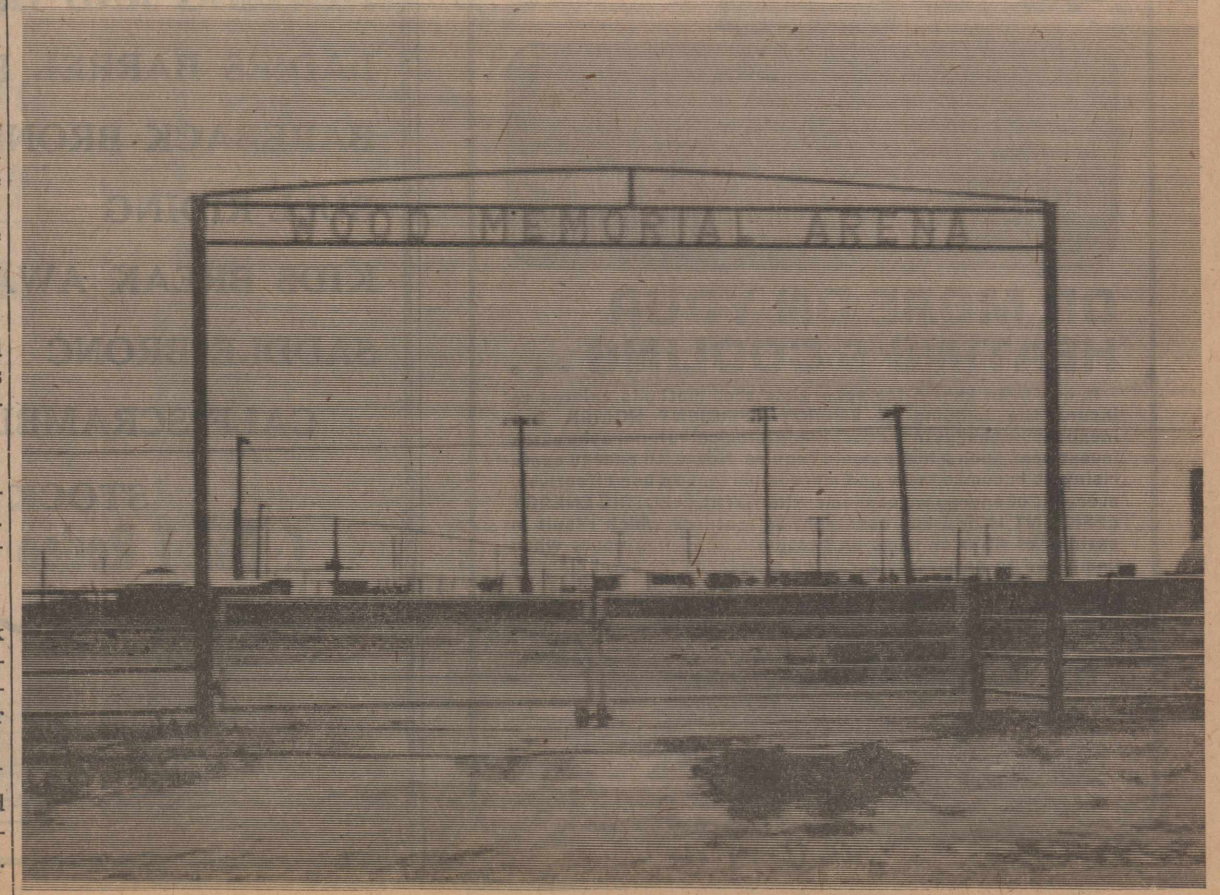
