This company had turpentined 50,000 acres of virgin pine imber, then timbered the land and left it in waste, and were offering the cut over land for sale at \$5 per acre. They were taxed about \$100 a square mile on their holdings after they had taken a fortune off of it. The tax was \$3 a square mile. The Publicity
Tax was SIX CENTS A SQUARE MILE. They simply wanted to be nasty. The court denied the injunc-The tax assessor assessed the land at \$5 per acre, the land company raised the roof to the sky, and began to unload. Much of the land went into the hands of small possessors who cleared it and planted many hundreds of acres. Today land that went begging at 5 per acre is being sold at \$100 to \$200 per acre and the land company now praises the Publicity Tax.
