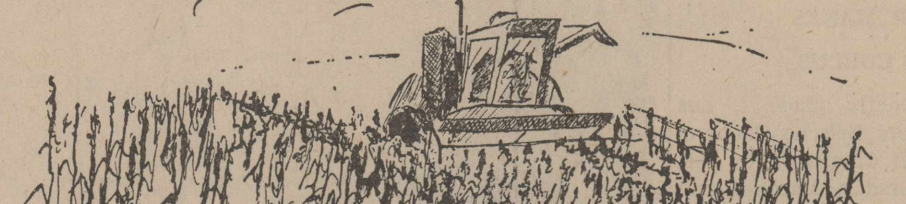

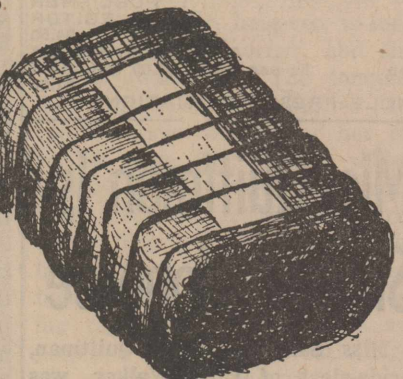

## Report Needed On Wheat Grazed Past March 20

Your local ASCS Office cannot stress strongly enough that wheat to be grazed passed March 20 should be certified prior to that date. This should be done even though you may take cattle off later and harvest the crop as grain.

Should you report wheat being grazed after March 20th, later change your mind and decide to harvest the crop as grain, then you must come back to the office and revise your acreage report.

When you come to report your wheat acreage be sure that you have measured each field separately. Each field has to be certified separately.

The group arrived home at about 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, March 9.

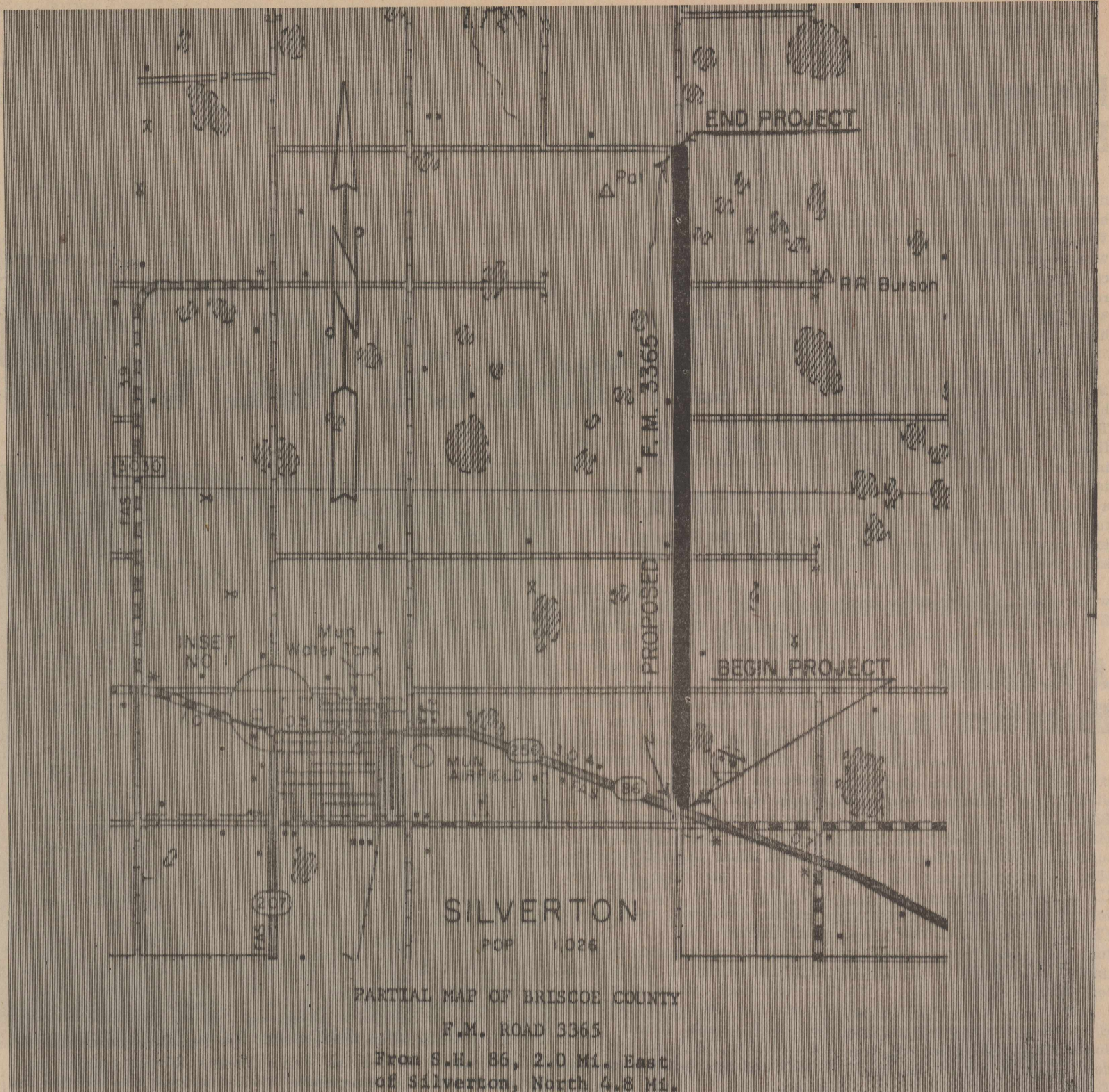
