



that sailed the high seas. These armed robbers sought to raid every ship they came across. None was safe when they were near.

The Bible teaches that there is a devil called Satan who is a robber and a thief, who "goes about like a roaring lion seeking whom he may devour." (1 Peter 5:8) But when the pirate threatens, we need not be afraid. 


