Teenager killed in shooting in Eden

WINTERS- An teenage girl was killed in a shooting in Eden, Texas on Saturday, January 17, 2015. The Concho County Sheriff's Office identified the victim as Lucero Rubio, 18-years-of-age, of Eden, Texas. According to a brief statement issued by the Sheriff's office, Rubio was killed at approximately 6:30 p.m. at a local residence during a shooting.

Chief Deputy Brent Frazier, said that the Concho. County Sheriff's Office is investigating the incident. Rubio sustained a gunshot wound while at a private residence. Rubio was transported to the Concho County Medical Center in Eden, where she was later pronounced dead.

The cause of the shooting is still under investigation. No arrests have been made at this time and the Texas Rangers are assisting in the investigation.



AgriLife sets new round of area Farm Bill meetings

Additional funding announced for energy research centers

WINTERS ENTERPRISE

LUBBOCK - The Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service's South Plains district is offering another round of farm bill meetings starting Jan. 22, said an AgriLife Extension staffer.

"The meetings, all with the same curriculum, are designed to help producers finalize their farm bill decisions," said Dr. Jackie Smith, AgriLife Extension economist at Lubbock.

Smith said the meetings are a collaborative effort of AgriLife Extension, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Farm Service Agency and area commodity groups. All meetings

are free and open to the public.

"By February 27, the first two decisions producers must make have to be submitted to their local county FSA office," Smith said. "These two decisions are the base reallocation and the yield update for covered commodities. Then by March 28, producers need to make their selection on whether they will participate in the Agricultural Risk Coverage (ARC) or Price Loss Coverage (PLC) for covered commodities.'

Smith said at each upcoming meeting, the designated county FSA director will discuss the sign-up process. Smith will

provide assistance in the decision making process and Shawn Wade from Plains Cotton Growers will discuss the new insurance components of the 2014 farm bill. Additional meet-





Q: How do 'El Niño' and 'La Niña' change our weather?

A: Both El Niño and La Niña events are more likely to affect the seasonal temperature and precipitation patterns during the winter than in any other season, says Brent McRoberts of Texas A&M. "In general, a La Niña period means drier weather patterns for Texas, whereas El Niño is more likely to bring wetter weather during the cold season. There have been numerous studies done on how El Niño and La Niña affect weather patterns in other seasons, and this includes hurricanes and their intensity. Some research indicates that the types of hurricanes that affect Texas are more common during La Niña periods than during neutral or El Niño periods."




