**Annual Meeting Held In Tulia**

The 27th annual meeting of members of Mid-Plains Rural Telephone Cooperative, Inc. was held Friday, April 4, at the Tulia High School Auditorium.

Members were told that the recent refund of capital credits was the result of a favorable toll agreement between the co-op and Southwestern Bell Telephone Company. The refunds totaled \$154,425.00 and were the accumulated margins from the co-op's beginning in 1950 through the year 1976. Pending legislation in the United States House of Representatives could change the

method of division of toll revenues, and settlements as now exist would not be possible under the proposed new law.

Several awards for length of service were presented to employees and directors of the Cooperative. Patsy Clark was given a five year pin. Don Knutson and Wendi Roberts received ten year pins. Joe Rice and Walter Anderson were given 20 year pins, and Jim Norris was awarded a 25 year pin. Three directors, all members of the original Board of Incorporators of Mid-Plains, were given 30 year pins. They were Bruce Fields, Victor Harman and Bayard Sadler.

Four directors were elected to three year terms. Joe Wieck of Umbarger was re-elected to his seventh term. Earl Reynolds of Cleeta was re-elected to his fifth

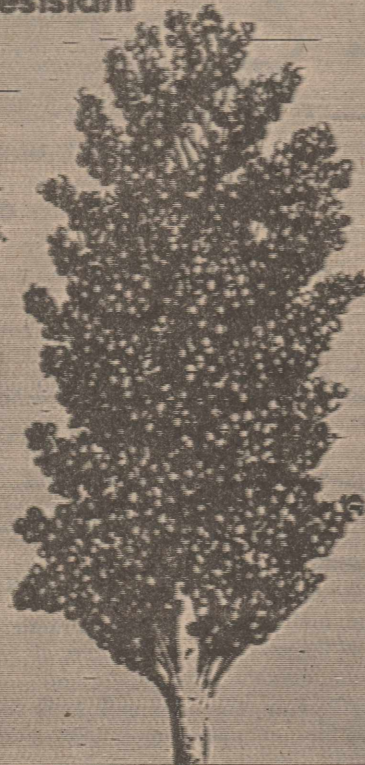

Club members need to wear comfortable shoes and clothing suitable for hiking.

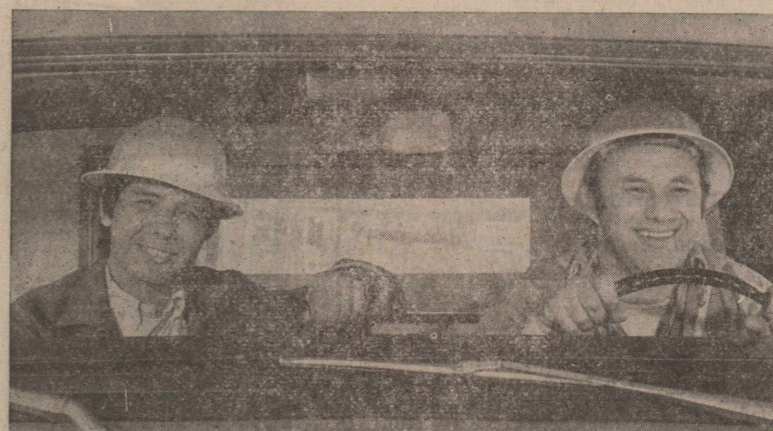
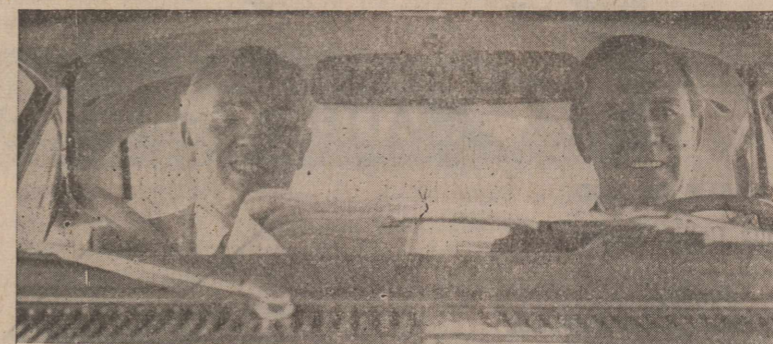

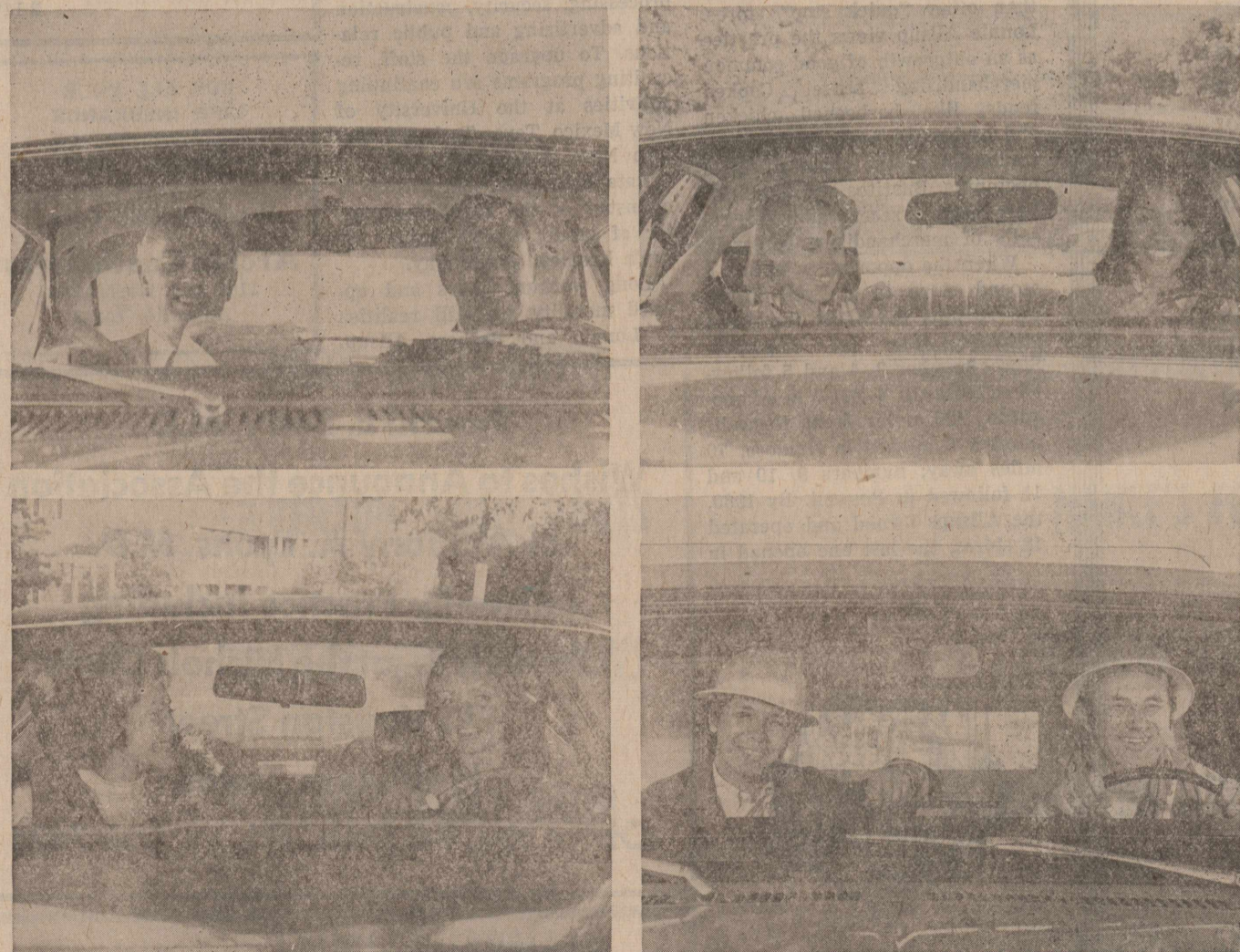

Increases in the cost of living are foremost in everyone's thoughts. Prices are continually going up as people search for the means to make ends meet. Your local Social Security office is trying to help by expanding services available over the phone.

Currently, most of our calls deal with general information such as office hours, where to write for birth certificates, or what Medicare covers. You can report any changes by phone; ask for an estimate of the amount of your retirement or disability benefit; or report lost benefit checks. In Silverton, and the rest of Briscoe County, these and many other services can be obtained by calling our new toll-free number: 1-800-392-1603.

You can also file a claim for benefits over the telephone. This includes claims for retirement and survivors benefits for widow, widowers and children. We can also assist you in filing for disability benefits over the phone. We ask you the questions and complete the application. We then

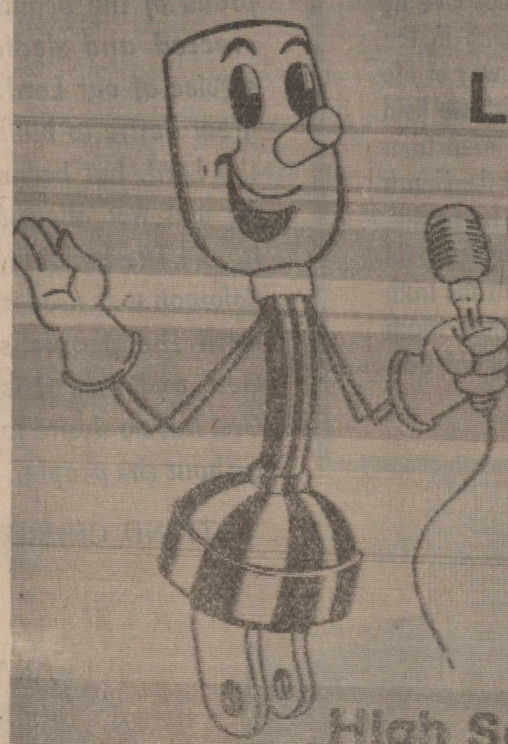

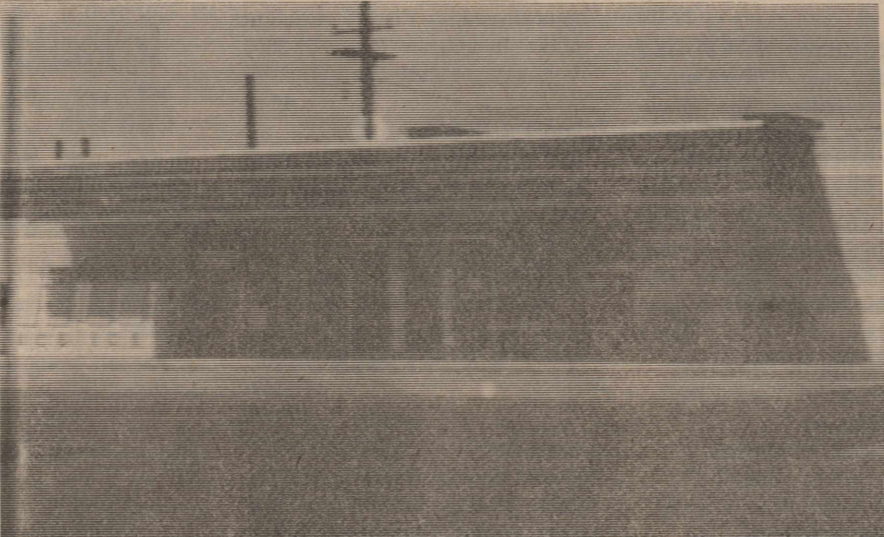
