MARILYN ELAINE PATRICK

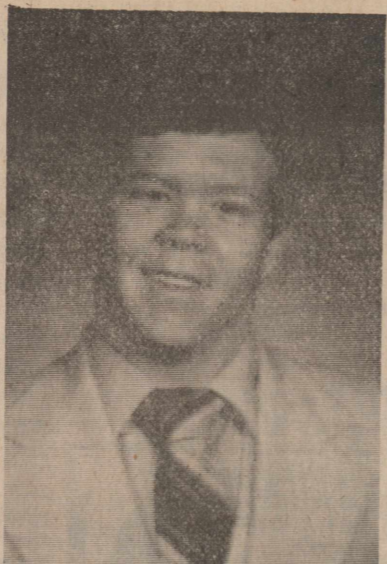

History Of The Reeves Post Office

 The Reeves Post Office, Briscoe County, Texas, was established on July 13, 1899, with Joseph H. Reeves serving as Postmaster. It was situated in the southwest quarter of Section 2 in the County of Briscoe, State of Texas.

Joseph Harvey Reeves served as Postmaster from July 13, 1899 until August 24, 1905, when James U. Strickland was appointed to replace him.

The post office was housed in the front room of the large two-story wood frame home of the J. H. Reeves family. The population served by the Reeves Post Office was 110.

This post office was one of the early-day post offices established in Briscoe County, which was created from Bexar District in 1876 and organized in 1892.

Some of the early Briscoe County pioneers served by this post office were the families of Jobe Bryant, Mack Watters, Ben Stephens, Thomas R. Wilson, D. G. Montague, Joe F. Kitchens, Dr. Vermillion, and the Pope, Fleming and Archer families.

"We used to get our mail at the Reeves Post Office," said Mrs. Clarice Douglas, daughter of J. C. Whiteley. "My sister still has some post cards that were postmarked by Reeves Post Office. She received them from a young man our parents did not approve of and she used to hide them behind the curtains over the windows in our home."

James U. Strickland served as Postmaster at Reeves, Briscoe County, Texas, from August 24, 1905, until it was discontinued on March 30, 1907, at which time

the mail was delivered to Silverton, Briscoe County, Texas.

The structure as it was originally built, was a two-story wood frame home. It was occupied by the Joseph Harvey Reeves family until it was sold on June 27, 1905, to James U. Strickland.

Forrest Leonard West bought the section of land and house (Reeves Post Office) in 1909 and planned to move his family from Dewey County, Oklahoma, into the home the following spring.

He rented the house to Nath Lawler, a young unmarried male school teacher, who was teaching at the Lakeview community rural school about a mile away. Although the cause of the fire is not known, the house was completely destroyed before Mr. West returned to Texas to occupy his property.

"Papa brought our whole family with him to Briscoe County to buy the land and house and I thought it was the most beautiful place that I had ever seen," said Mrs. Stella Davis, daughter of F. L. West. "We had lived in two-story houses before, but in this one you could walk out of the upstairs onto the second floor porch. At that time, we were living in a half-dugout in Oklahoma and you can imagine how disappointed we were to learn that our newly-acquired home had burned."

Although the structure that housed the Reeves Post Office no longer exists, a clump of trees, easily visible from State Highway 207, still marks the spot where the Reeves Post Office once stood. This location is

4-H ROUNDUP TO BE HELD JUNE 3-4

June is "Roundup" time in Texas—4-H Roundup, that is.

The 34th Annual Texas 4-H Roundup will be held at Texas A&M University June 3-4. More than 2,000 4-H members, volunteer leaders and coaches will invade the College Station campus for 40 action-packed hours of competition and fun.

Attending from Briscoe County will be Shane Reagan, Mitchell Martin, Walter Perkins and Briscoe County Extension Agent Earnest Kiker. They will represent Briscoe County in dairy judging.

Roundup is the culmination of competitive events which began at the local community level months earlier, says Kiker. Winners at county and district levels will be vying for top honors in the statewide competition.

4-H members 14 to 19 years of age will present method demonstrations and illustrated talks in 25 contest areas ranging from electricity to sheep. They will also use their skills in eight judging and evaluation events from meats identification to soils judging. And 4-H'ers will demonstrate their skills in marksmanship in the rifle contest, in speaking before groups in the public speaking contest, and in entertainment techniques in the share-the-fun contest.

Other events which are a part of Roundup include the State 4-H Food Show and the State 4-H Project Show. The food show allows members to exhibit food dishes which they have prepared and to answer questions about nutrition as posed by the judges. The project show involves hundreds of 4-H members in displays and exhibits depicting their particular project interest, from aerospace to crafts of all sorts.

One of the highlights of Roundup will be the awarding of Texas 4-H Foundation Scholarships. This year, 71 4-H members will receive college scholarships worth \$340,000, or an average of \$4,789 per recipient. These scholarships are made possible by friends of 4-H from business, industry and organizational representatives of the private sector.

Roundup will also spotlight the achievements of adults who serve as volunteers in the 4-H program. The Roundup Leaders' Luncheon on June 4 will honor 28 of the state's most outstanding 4-H volunteers. These are representatives of the more than 20,000 persons who serve as 4-H volunteers in Texas each year.

June is a busy month for the 4-H'ers as Roundup leads the way. It is fun, exciting and rewarding because at 4-H Roundup everyone is a winner, says Kiker.

SOCIAL SECURITY IN BRISCOE COUNTY BY JANICE ULMER

Social Security benefits will increase 14.3 percent in July. This is the official announcement made recently by Patricia Harris, Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments will also increase by the same percentage in July.

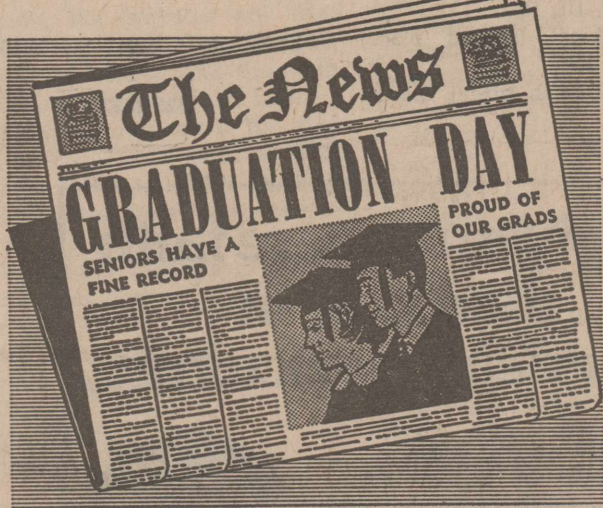
A retired worker without dependents now receiving an average Social Security payment of \$289 will get \$330 a month beginning July 3, 1980. An individual now receiving the maximum federal SSI benefit of \$208.20 will get \$238.00 and a couple now receiving \$312.30 will get \$357.00 beginning with the July 1 SSI check.

A provision of the Social Security Act guarantees an annual increase in Social Security and SSI checks any year in which the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increases 3% or more. The Bureau

of Labor Statistics calculated that the average CPI for the first three months of 1980 increased 14.3 percent over the CPI for the first three months of 1979.

The cost of supplemental medical insurance, Part B of Medicare, will increase to \$9.60 in July. This increase is due to the rising cost of health care. Part A, hospitalization insurance, will continue to be free for persons eligible for Social Security benefits.

The estimated fiscal year 1981 cost of the Social Security benefit increase to the trust funds will be \$16.8 billion. The SSI increase will cost an estimated \$570 million and will be paid from general funds of the U. S. Treasury. 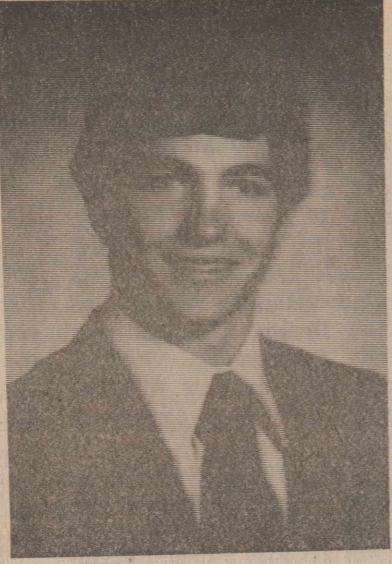

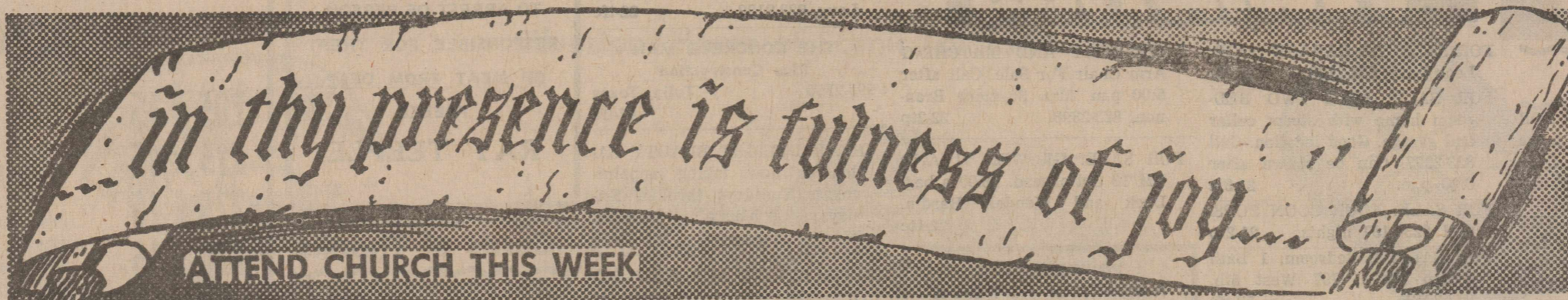
