



The murder case of W. C. Holcomb. transferred from Stonewall County occupied the first part of the week in District court. Holcomb was charged with killing Mack Hart on the streets of Aspermont on March 3rd. He was found guilty by a jury and his punishment assessed at 5 years in the state penitentiary. Holcomb's son Jim was given 10 years in the same case at Aspermont last spring. Hart was shot while cranking his car. According to testimony produced in the trial, domestic trouble was the cause of the shooting.
