Reese takes early Torchlight lead

Wing team leads defending champs by single point after day one action

Reese kicked off the 1989 Torchlight Competition at Randolph AFB, Texas in overall first place Wednesday, one point ahead of last year's champ, Laughlin AFB, Texas.

Sheppard AFB, Texas; Columbus, AFB Miss.; Williams AFB Ariz.; Vance AFB, Okla.; and Mather AFB, Calif. followed in the footsteps of Reese as the 64th FTW

team led the way through the first day of competition.

The maintenance team events began at 7:30 a.m. Wednesday with the AFR 35-10 inspections. Reese received two discrepancies for a total of 38 out of 40 points. Tool kits and technical orders were then inspected and Reese was found with one discrepancy giving the T-37 team 64 of 65 points and the T-38 team received 65 points to power them into first place.

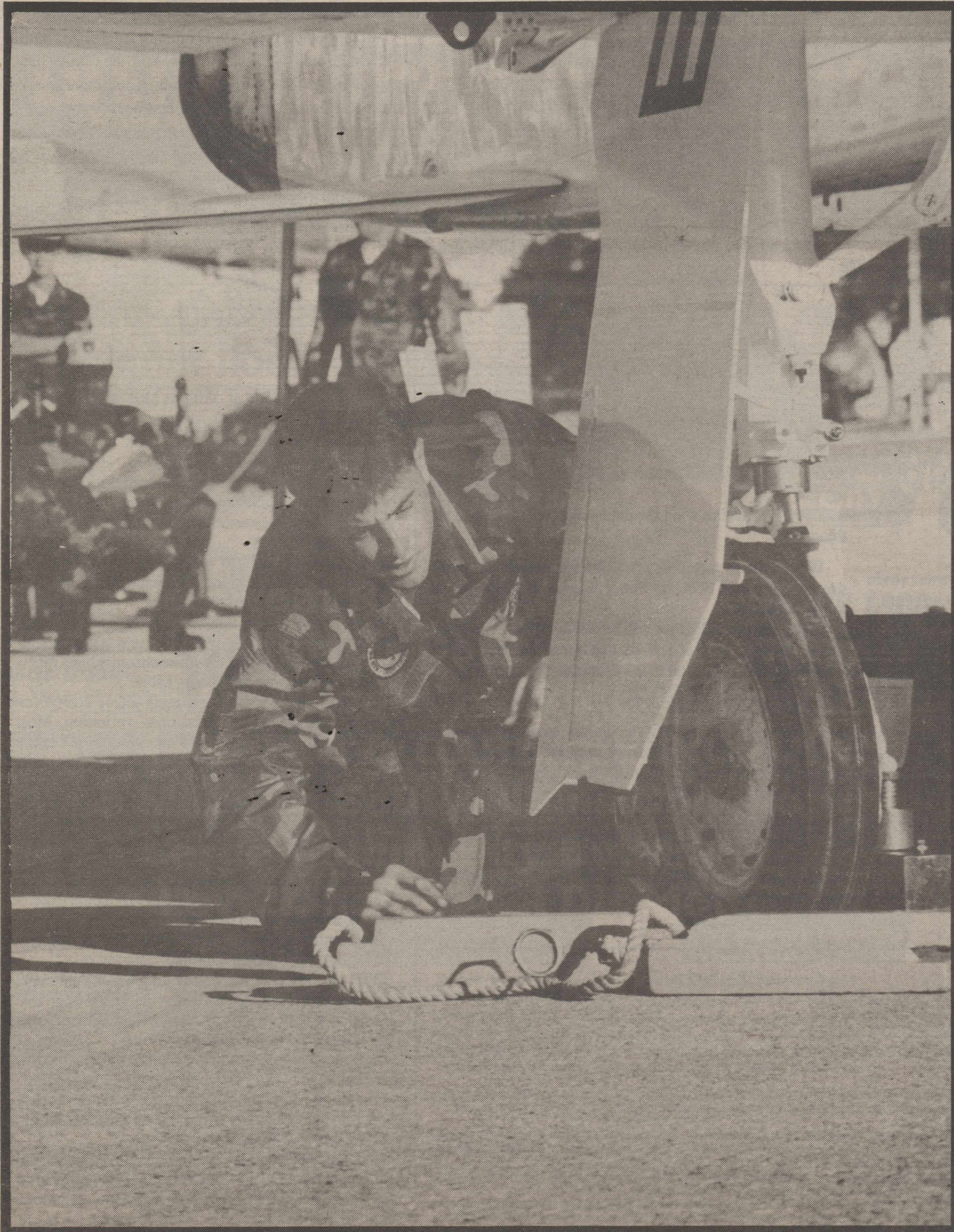
Immediately following the ap-

pearance checks were the T-37 and T-38 tire changes. The T-38 "B" Team of A1Cs Todd Korn and Ann Schofield neared a blowout when their jack failed to upright. The problem was soon alleviated with a new jack and the B-team clocked in at 4:11.46. The "A" Team, comprised of SSgt. Angela Schmit and Sgt. Shane O'Hearn clocked in at three minutes, ranking the T-38 team first in the rankings.

The T-37 "A" Team, comprised of SrA. Ray Paz and SSgt. Brian

Williams, and the "B" Team of SrA. Richard Angell and Sgt. Paul Quintana clocked in at 2:46.70 and 4:07.38, respectively. The T-37 maintenance teams ended today tied for second place. Once the opposing teams completed the tire changes it was time for Reese's jets to arrive. The T-37s made their entrance at 11:45 and 87 seconds; the set arrival time was 11:45 a.m. Reese's T-38s appeared at 12:29:59.36 just ahead of the 12:30 p.m. set time.

The day's competition concluded with the T-37 and T-38 aircraft conditioning and reliability judging in which the results of this event won't be known until Saturday. Thursday's schedule included the low-level sortie flights, maintenance pre-flight follow-ups and forms reviews and aircraft recoveries. Today, the teams compete in composite sorties, dummy pre-flights and aircraft recoveries. The Saturday engine changes will complete the competition.

Personnel office assisting maintainers

Contrary to popular belief, not all Reese maintainers are going to Cannon AFB, N.M. In fact, of the more than 600 maintenance personnel with firm assignments there are 83 moving up the road to work at Cannon. That works out to 14 percent and there were some unusual circumstances including base closures that put such a large need in one location. For the remaining maintainers, 85 percent got their first, second or third choice of available assignments and those available assignments were wide and varied. One hundred percent of the 31 married military couples received join-spouse assignments.

Even though the matching is done, the personnel office is

still working to satisfy the customer whenever possible. Although the cut-off date for volunteering for overseas and requesting swap assignments has passed, we are still working some of those options.

Also, it is still permissible to request retraining if the individual meets all eligibility requirements. Having an assignment is not disqualifying unless it's overseas. We are also still working a few humanitarian and exceptional family member requests and hope to maintain our current success rate.

Now, what can you do for us? This turbulence of moving the entire maintenance complex has added to our normal workload. In addition to the 600-plus assignments mentioned earlier, we have over 250 people in both the operations and

support arenas who have assignments and need processing.

As such, people should attend scheduled briefings and appointments or notify us in advance if there is a conflict.

This is especially important since we're doing mass briefings, and numerous no-shows defeat our purpose of reducing the one-on-one meetings.

The personnel community is working very hard to make these moves as smooth and as painless as possible. Reese's Consolidated Base Personnel Office believes in the motto, "The first word in personnel is person." To us, people are not just numbers; they're people that we want to help.

Defense secretary calls for continued vigilance in light of glasnost

The Pentagon has released its annual Soviet military assessment, and officials say that while East-West diplomatic trends are on the upswing, the Soviet Union still constitutes a major threat to American security.

"Soviet Military Power 1989," released by Secretary of Defense Dick Cheney at a Sept. 27 press briefing, is a blueprint of the changes — military, political and economic — underway in the Eastern Bloc.

"We now find a Soviet Union which retains enormous military power — the only nation still capable of threatening the very survival of the United States," Secretary Cheney said.

He noted several realities pertaining to the threat and said that while the talk of Moscow adopting a defensive military doctrine is a welcome change, the Soviets continue to upgrade their forces and capabilities.

"Even if the Soviets make good on their promise to carry out unilateral force reductions in Europe, the Soviet Union will remain the world's largest military power," Secretary Cheney said.

He called their continued efforts of modernizing their strategic nuclear forces the "most striking feature" of Soviet military power today.

As the United States is still grappling with the selection of, and funding for, a road-mobile nuclear missile system, the Soviets are continuing to field fifth-generation mobile ICBMs — about 170 SS-25 road-mobile missiles and some 18 rail-mobile SS-24s, the latter with 10 nuclear warheads.

Noting that Soviet ICBM systems are improving, Secretary Cheney also outlined breakthroughs in every leg of their strategic triad. They include deployment of the Blackjack bomber, comparable to the Air Force's B-1B, and equipping older Yankee-class ballistic missile submarines with sea-launched nuclear armed cruise missiles.

Since 1985, Soviet defense spending has actually increased an average of 3 percent in real terms. In comparison, America's defense spending has declined by more than 11 percent during the same period.

"Consequently, the Soviet Union still confronts the United

States and its allies with very large, modern, conventional ground, sea and air forces, and with formidable strategic and theater nuclear forces," Secretary Cheney said.

The secretary's remarks come on the heels of the announcement made by Soviet President Gorbachev, promising to reduce Soviet defense expenditures more than 14 percent over the next two years.

Until the Soviets reduce their military strength to significantly lower levels, Secretary Cheney said, the United States must continue to support its allies through collective security efforts based on a strong military deterrence.

"The greatly improved East-West political climate offers prospects for a stable and lasting peace, but experience teaches us that we must remain prepared," he said.

Conserving energy is habit-forming

"Save energy...shower with a friend." This bumper sticker slogan has a degree of validity to it although most showers in today's apartments and homes are too small for this practice. Nevertheless, efforts to conserve America's natural resources require a cooperative effort in order to succeed.

Most habits are hard to break. Like tobacco use, the wasteful use of utilities requires drastic changes in attitudes and lifestyle patterns.

As the availability of natural resources becomes critically short and utility prices continue to rise at an alarming rate, it is apparent that the entire citizenry must renew efforts to reduce wasteful energy habits.

An alternative to wasting energy is, of course, an extremely radical and dreaded one—rationing. Most Americans would agree that this option isn't for them.

Curtailing electrical energy usage during certain times of the day should not be difficult for most people. - Opened doors and/or windows when either the air conditioning or heating units are running.
- Setting thermostats too high in the winter or too low in the summer.

Adopting efficient energy conservation habits will bring about significant results, thereby curbing wastefulness and enhancing personal savings accounts. In the long run, this is an investment in America's future. Start saving now!

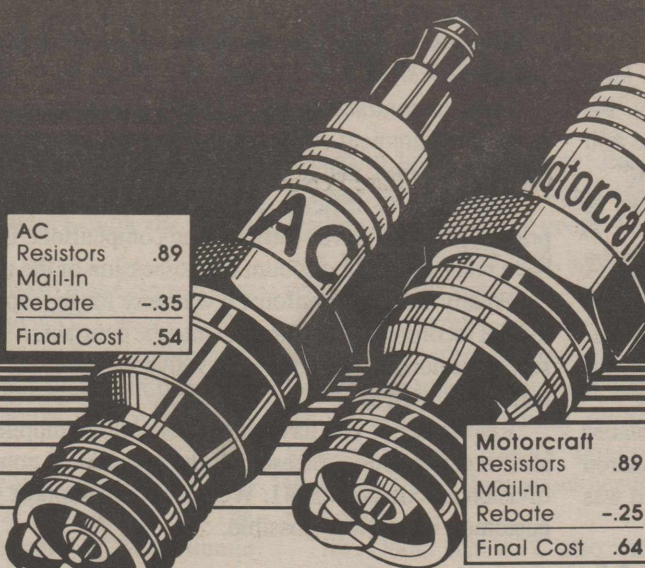

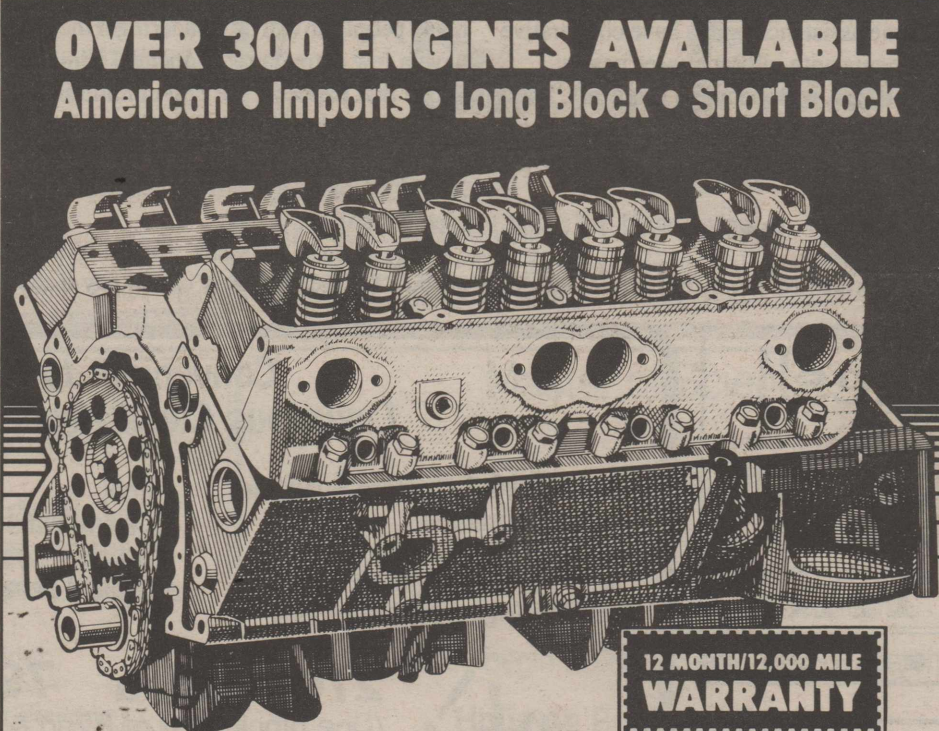

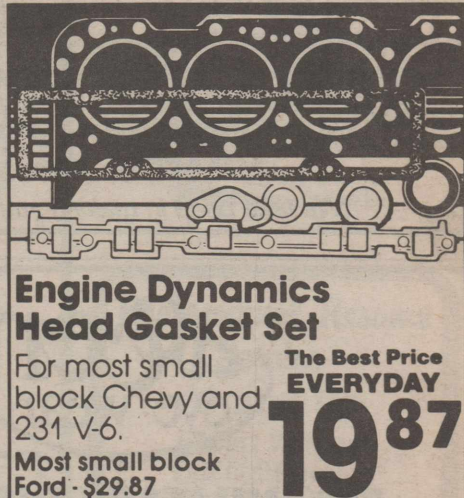

Authority needed to obligate government

Over the past year, there have been several instances of unauthorized personnel contacting commercial vendors without first going through the Reese Operational Contracting Division. As a result, we end up processing a costly, time-consuming (not to mention embarrassing) ratification against the individual who committed the unauthorized act.

Federal Acquisition Regulation 1.602-3 defines a ratification as "the act of approving an unauthorized commitment by an official who has the authority."

The regulation continues to state, "Only the contracting officer is authorized to obligate the government. Contracting officers ensure all requirements of law, executive orders, regulations and approvals have been met."

At Reese, the ratification authority is the 64th Flying Training Wing deputy commander for resources.

When contracting becomes aware of an unauthorized act, we must get a detailed statement of fact from the individual's deputy commander (the deputy commander for resource for

example — but no lower than deputy commander, hospital commander or base commander) on the events that led to the unauthorized act.

The statement of facts will be forwarded to the contracting officer, who will review the actions and prepare a second statement of facts.

The file is then sent to the staff judge advocate for legal review and to determine disciplinary action. Finally, the deputy commander for resources will determine who will pay for the unauthorized act — the government or you!

Here are a couple of examples I have experienced at Reese:

□ A construction contractor was installing air handlers. A military member called this contractor and asked him how to program his climate control system. The contractor responded and provided the training. As a result, the contractor billed the government \$400.

This could have been avoided if the customer had placed a work order with the 64th Civil Engineering Squadron because CE was initially trained by the contractor and was provided with detailed operating instructions.

□ The second example deals with contract repair services. One of the squadrons needed a piece of equipment repaired. The custodian took the equipment downtown, had the contractor repair it, then processed the request for purchase form for the amount of the repair.

This placed the government in a bad position for several reasons.

First, the contracting officer cannot determine whether the repair is economical, when considering the value of the item, less depreciation, and other previous repairs.

Second, it is difficult to determine fair and reasonable pricing since we have restricted the competition. Third, we have no audit trail to account for possession of the property.

Finally we cannot enforce a warranty for the repair if we did not incorporate the warranty into the contract. As you can see, unauthorized commitments waive all rights the government is entitled to.

Remember, if you have a requirement for supplies, services or construction, please call the operational contracting division at extension 3441. We are here to support you, the customer, in any way possible.

Assistance points help military travelers

When service members, civilian employees and their families travel from duty station to duty station, especially when overseas, there's comfort in knowing someone at the airport will assist them.

Those flying through New York, Philadelphia, St. Louis, Seattle and Charleston, S.C., have the added benefit of knowing there are personnel assistance points for them.

Each Army staffed assistance point is staffed by three to seven non-commissioned officers. The staff will assist anyone affiliated with the Department of Defense.

"We'll usually refer members of other services to a sister service-related activity or handle the problem through other appropriate channels," said Master Sgt. Michael L.

Charleston Personnel Point

Rose of the Army Personnel Command's Travel Operations and Procedures Division.

Some assistance points have cooperative agreements with military bases nearby.

"We deal with people's problems," said Army Sgt. 1st Class Ron Copeland, commander of the Charleston Personnel Assistance Point.

You name it, we've heard it," Sgt. Copeland said.

He has heard a variety of sad tales includ-

ing "the dog ate the ticket."

"We can authorize leave extensions, and many people do call us wondering if they can have a few extra days," Copeland admitted. When that happens, the non-commissioned officers coordinate with the Military Traffic Management Command and the Military Airlift Command to reschedule the member's flight.

"We're here to assist people. We can arrange for them to draw casual pay if they

need it or overnight lodging," said Copeland Assistance Points

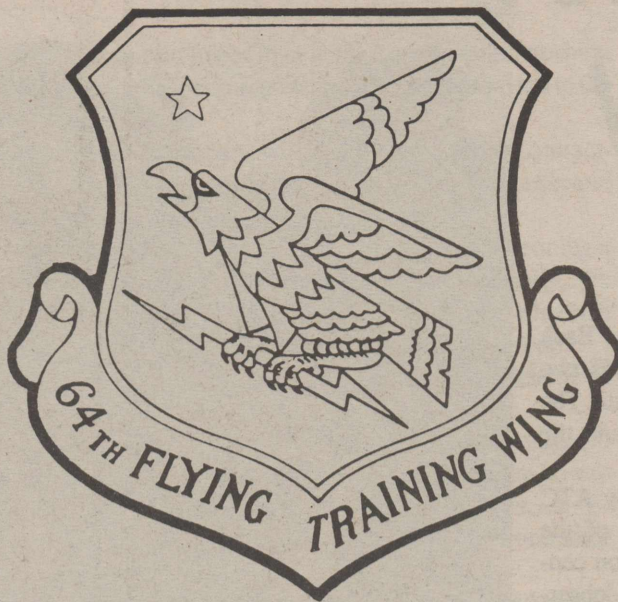

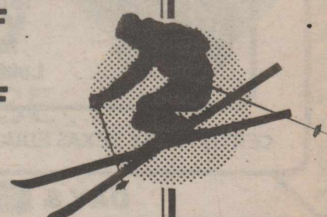

Officer release program extended

The Officer Voluntary Early Release Program has been extended to meet fiscal year 1990 officer strength reductions.

"By reducing the number of officers coming into the service and continuing the voluntary early release program, we should be able to attain the fiscal 1990 congressionally mandated officer strength reductions," said Maj. Kathleen Pivarsky, chief of the officer separation policy branch, Headquarters Air Force.

Fiscal 1990 reductions are currently set at 2,300 officers, but with final action on the fiscal 1990 Authorization Act still pending, this number could go higher, Major

Pivarsky said. The early release application period is open now and continues through July 31, 1990, with dates of separation from October through Sept. 29, 1990.

The program permits waiver of certain active-duty service commitments and allows officers to separate early from the Air Force, the Major said.

A maximum of 24 months can be waived for officers who have a commitment due to commissioning through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps, Airman Education and Commissioning Program or Officer Training School.

Up to 18 months can be waived

for officers who recently accepted an assignment in the continental United States, and for officers wishing to separate who recently accepted promotion to major through colonel. However, requests for retirement in current grade by lieutenant colonels or colonels with less than three years time-in-grade cannot be granted, Major Pivarsky said. For example, a lieutenant colonel eligible for retirement could waive up to 18 months of commitment, but retirement would be in the grade of major since the time-in-grade requirement had not been served.

Up to 12 months can be waived from a service commitment for

non-medical service officers who attend a full-time education program at a resident or civilian institution. This also applies to officers who attended non-flying resident or technical training courses, including professional military education courses or off-duty education. Education with Industry Program participants and officers previously selected for a selective continuation can also waive 12 months, Major Pivarsky said.

Officers serving overseas tours of 30 months or less, along with those who have not completed 24 months of a 36-month overseas tour or 36 months of a 48-month overseas tour.

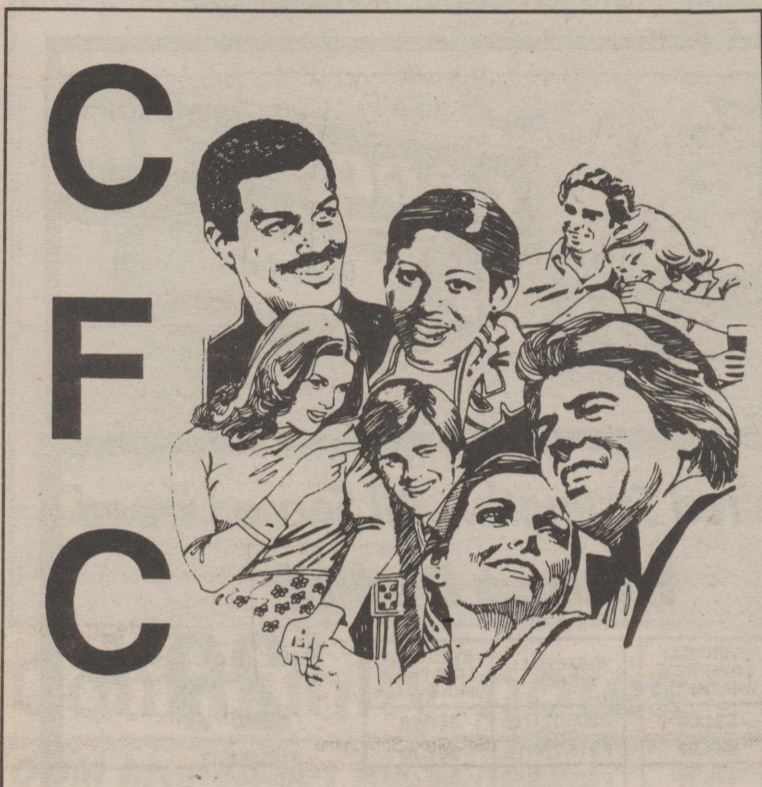
□ Pilots and fighter weapons systems officers in the grade of lieutenant colonel and below.

□ Medical service officers and officers possessing skills in communication-computer systems, civil engineering and certain scientific and development skills.

□ Colonels who possess acquisition, contracting, comptroller or intelligence skills.

□ Officers already pending separation because of quality factors, court-martial or promotion nonselection.

Eleven receive Article 15s

Members punished under Uniform Code of Military Justice

The third quarter of 189 showed a steady number of Article 15 actions. During the quarter, 11 actions were completed.

Following is a summary of these actions. Each case is unique and the commander's action, with regard to punishment, was tailored to the offense and offender. The relevant article in the Uniform Code of Military Justice is listed at the end of each Article 15 summary.

□ An officer was reprimanded and ordered to forfeit \$500 per month for two months for conduct unbecoming an officer (Article 133).

□ A staff sergeant was reduced to sergeant (suspended) and ordered to forfeit \$250 per month for driving under the influence of alcohol (Article 111).

□ A staff sergeant was reduced to sergeant (suspended) and or-

dered to forfeit \$150 per month for two months and to perform 30 days extra duty for assault and disorderly conduct (Article 128 and 134).

□ A sergeant was reduced to airman first class (suspended) and ordered to forfeit \$175 per month for two months and to perform 30 days extra duty for assault, disorderly conduct and resisting apprehension (Article 128, 134, and 95).

□ A senior airman was reduced to airman first class (suspended) and ordered to forfeit \$100 per month for two months for assault on a security police officer and disorderly conduct (Articles 128 and 134).

□ An airman first class was reduced to airman (suspended) and ordered to perform 14 days extra duty for failure to go (Article 86).

□ An airman first class was reduced to airman (suspended), ordered to forfeit \$391 per month

for two months, and ordered to perform 45 days extra duty for being absent without leave and falsifying official documents (Articles 86 and 107).

□ An airman first class was reduced to airman (suspended) and ordered to forfeit \$150 for providing alcohol to a minor (Article 134).

□ An airman first class was reduced to airman and ordered to perform 14 days extra duty for fraudulent checks (Article 123a).

□ An airman first class was reduced to airman (suspended) and ordered to forfeit \$100 per month for two months for wrongful possession of a false military identification card (Article 134).

□ An airman was ordered to forfeit \$50 and to perform 14 days extra duty for underaged drinking and failure to obey an order (Articles 92 and 134).

CHAMPUS limits start new year

The deductible for outpatient care and the limit on how much families will pay for medical bills under CHAMPUS started over for the fiscal year 1990 on Oct. 1.

CHAMPUS, the Civilian Health and Medical Plan for the Uniformed Services, requires that participants pay the first \$50 (for one person) or the first \$100 (for a family) of allowable outpatient bills.

Additionally, active-duty families participating in the program do not have to pay more than \$1,000 in deductibles in any given year, thanks to the deductible cap. Non-active-duty participants have a \$10,000 cap.

Crash causes inspections

Inspections have been ordered on the fleet of Strategic Air Command KC-135s following the explosion of a KC-135A in Canada Oct. 4 that killed three crewmen and left one missing and presumed dead.

Each KC-135 Stratotanker is restricted from flying until it has been inspected. The checks add a couple of hours to the normal pre-flight inspection. Investigators have yet to determine what caused the Loring AFB, Maine, tanker to crash in New Brunswick.

This latest accident happened just two weeks after an Alaskan Air National Guard DC-135 burst into flames on the ramp at Eielson AFB, Alaska, killing two boom operators. (Air Force News Service)

USAFE not leaving Britain

Recent stories in Stars and Stripes reporting impending closure of four U.S. bases in England are untrue, according to the commander in chief of U.S. Air Forces in Europe.

"We have no plans to pull our forces out of England," said Gen. Michael J. Dugan, CINCUSAFE.

The Stars and Stripes front-page report claimed preliminary work was complete on the decision to pull American forces out of RAFs Alconbury, Bentwaters, Fairford and Mildenhall. The story appears to be based on speculation

about the conventional forces in Europe talks being held in Vienna, a USAFE News Service release said.

Stars and Stripes gave precedence to unnamed sources in its report in spite of the Department of Defense expressing incredulity. Lt. Col. Sam Giammo, 3rd Air Force spokesman at RAF Mildenhall, flatly denied the report. (Air Force News Service)

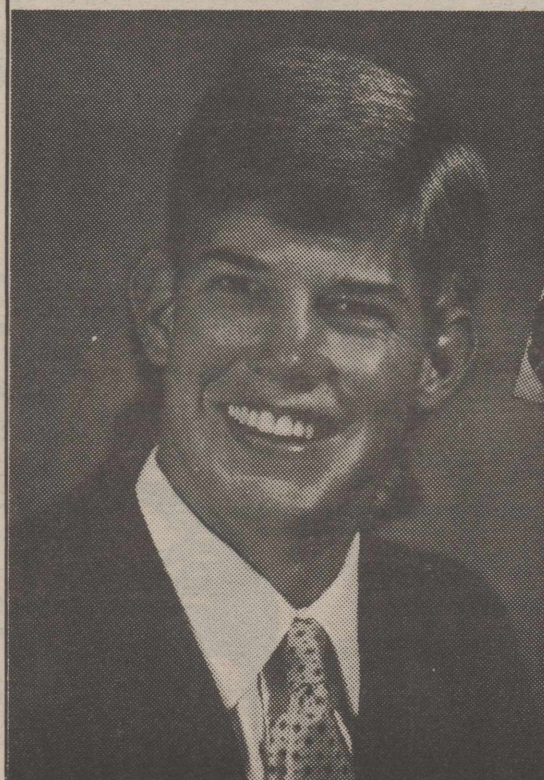

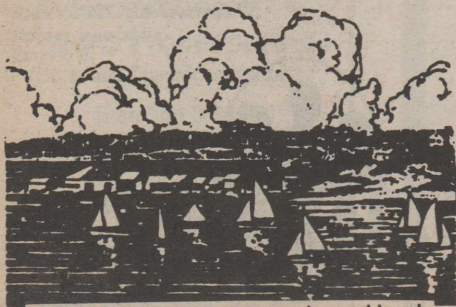

The evening's entertainment will also include the "sexiest men's legs"

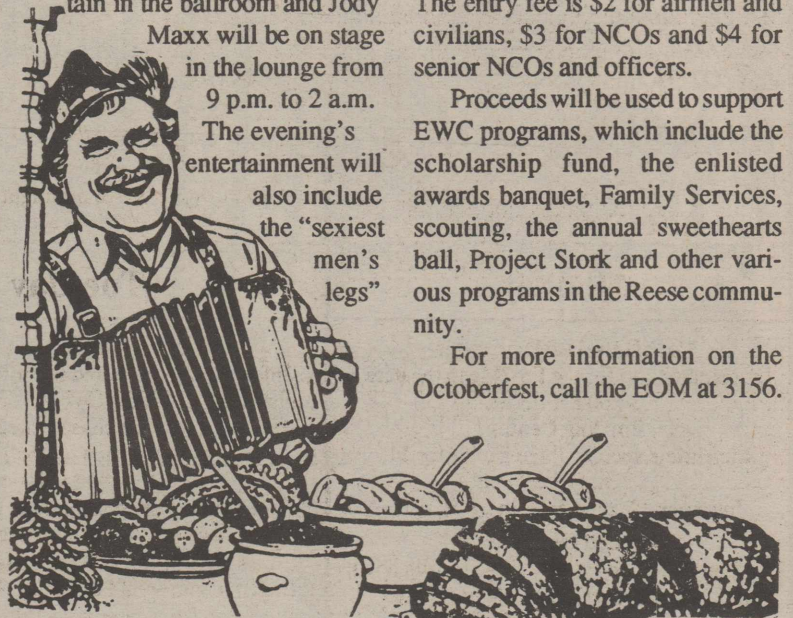
contest. Club patrons can vote for their favorite pair of legs by contributing to the Enlisted Wives Club charitable fund.



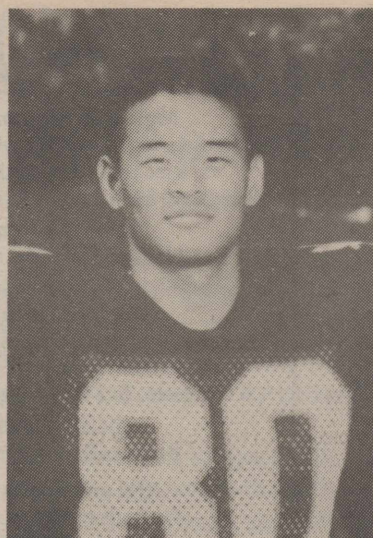

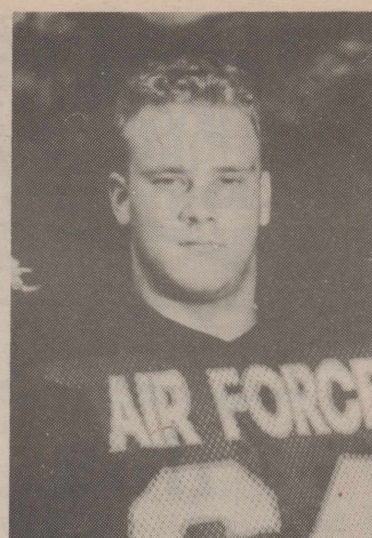

New fitness program in effect

The first phase of the Air Force's Improved Physical Fitness Program started Oct. 1.

Standards for the men's 1.5-mile run are now more demanding, with running times for each age group lowered every Oct. 1 through 1992, shaving some two minutes from previous run times.

Age categories are also changed to 10-year groupings instead of five-year groupings for men and women, and option to walk three miles instead of running 1.5 miles will be restricted to people 35 and older beginning Oct. 1, 1990.

Fitness standards for the women's 1.5-mile run were not substantially changed. Minor reductions were made in women's standards to allow for the transition from women's five-year age groups to the new 10-year age groups.

The new standards are based on current fitness research. Recent studies determined that the men's standards based on old research data were too low to properly assess fitness. The same study showed that women's standards, already based on more current research, were appropriate.

lished long before the women's standards, and they had become outdated," said Capt. Kimberly Ritsche, chief of military fitness at the Air Force Military Personnel Center.

"This revision, phased in over the next four years, brings the men's physiological requirements in line with women's requirements. The adjusted run times will create an equitable baseline standard throughout the Air Force," Captain Ritsche said.

The new physical fitness program also has more demanding three-mile walk standards for men and women in all age categories.

The new run and walk standards are listed below.

"We encourage all Air Force members to adopt the healthy lifestyle habits that will enable them to safely and reasonably attain better fitness," Captain Ritsche said. "Fitness specialists at base fitness centers have been trained to help individuals reach their fitness goals."
