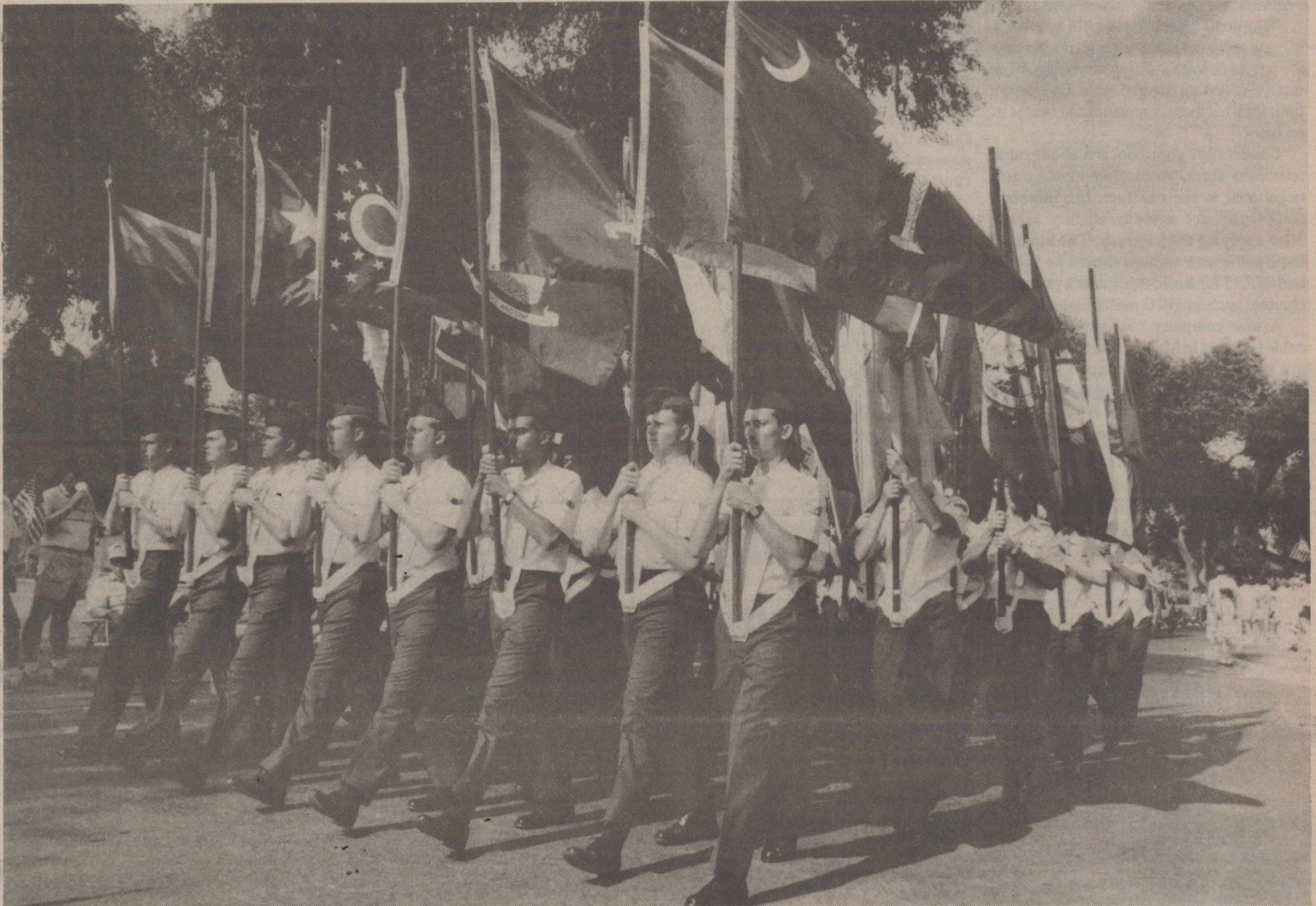

Wing members affected by retraining

Senior airmen through master sergeants in 48 career fields can volunteer to retrain under phase I of the fiscal year 1990 retraining program.

Classes will begin in October for training into the various fields.

First termers, whether they be-

come senior airmen early or not, must wait the required time before applying for retraining: four-year enlistees cannot apply until their 33rd month of service and six-year enlistees have to wait until their 56th month.

Phase I is the voluntary portion of the program. It identifies overage Air Force Specialty Codes and

encourages individuals in these fields to voluntarily retrain in shortage AFSCs.

Persons enlisted in the overage fields will not be personally contacted for retraining. "Instead, they must contact us and then we will begin the paper work," said Sgt. Linda Barnett, from the classification and training section.

"If enough people do not elect retraining, the Air Force will begin phase II, selective retraining, and will then identify persons for selection based upon how close they are to retraining levels for phase III, mandatory retraining," she said.

"People currently in the overage fields will be denied reenlistment within those fields until the man-

ning is reduced to its necessary quantities. At that time, all others within those fields will be allowed to reenlist in their present career field," said Sergeant Barnett.

First termers in an overage field may still apply for a career job reservation within that field. However, the waiting lists are long, and

Cable in base housing

Why do the people residing in base housing pay more for basic cable television than the people downtown? It seems rather unfair that we're getting charged more. Isn't there a limit for what these companies can charge us on base?

I appreciate your concern about cable television rates. According to the rates negotiated in the contract, the Lubbock cable rates are actually slightly higher after applying the sales tax. The monthly basic cable rate on base should be \$14.95 and \$25.95 for basic cable and a premium channel such as HBO and Cinemax.

A new company "bought" the Reese cable contract in March, and billing errors are possible. You may contact the cable contractor if your billing, plus sales tax, is different from these rates. If you are still dissatisfied, please contact my contracting division at 3996.

Highway expansion

Could you consider widening War Highway? I realize that it's not part of the base. The road is in terrible condition and I think widening the road would increase the safety of the many wing people who travel on it daily.

War Highway (Spur 309) is a state highway and is maintained with all the other highways in this district. Spur 309 was made into a four-lane highway by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation several years ago. To widen this facility to a six-lane highway would require that Reese give up additional right of way. This section, even though it is heavily traveled from 7 - 7:45 a.m. and 4 - 4:45 p.m., will not meet warrants to make it a six-lane highway.

At the 2020 Transportation meeting, Reese did request additional traffic controls to provide safety. The light at 19th Street (SH 114) and Spur 309 has been upgraded and additional lights are being installed along west 19th.

Motorcycle parking

In reference to the parking problem on base, I'd like to know why motorcycles are allowed to park in automobile slots? Oftentimes people pull into a space that appears vacant only to find a motorcycle parked

there. I realize there aren't a lot of motorcycle parking spots on base, and with the warm weather more people are riding their motorcycles. But, at the same time, there's not an overabundance of automobile spots on base either. A car cannot park in a motorcycle's space, therefore, motorcycles shouldn't be parking in the car's spot. Can't something be done to help alleviate the parking problems on base?

It is true that parking is congested in some parts of the base, especially along Hangar Line Road. However, motorcycles are classified as vehicles, the same as a car, and have the same rights to a full parking space. Reese tries to provide two-wheeled parking at several locations, to include the 54th Flying Training Squadron, Hangar Line Road and Bldg. 91.

The number of motorcycles varies from season to season, therefore, it is difficult to provide the right amount of special parking spaces. This issue will be studied to see if additional two-wheeled parking spaces can be added.

Additional parking lots are scheduled to be built as funds and time become available.

Telephone rates

Why do the people in family housing pay more on basic telephone rates than people

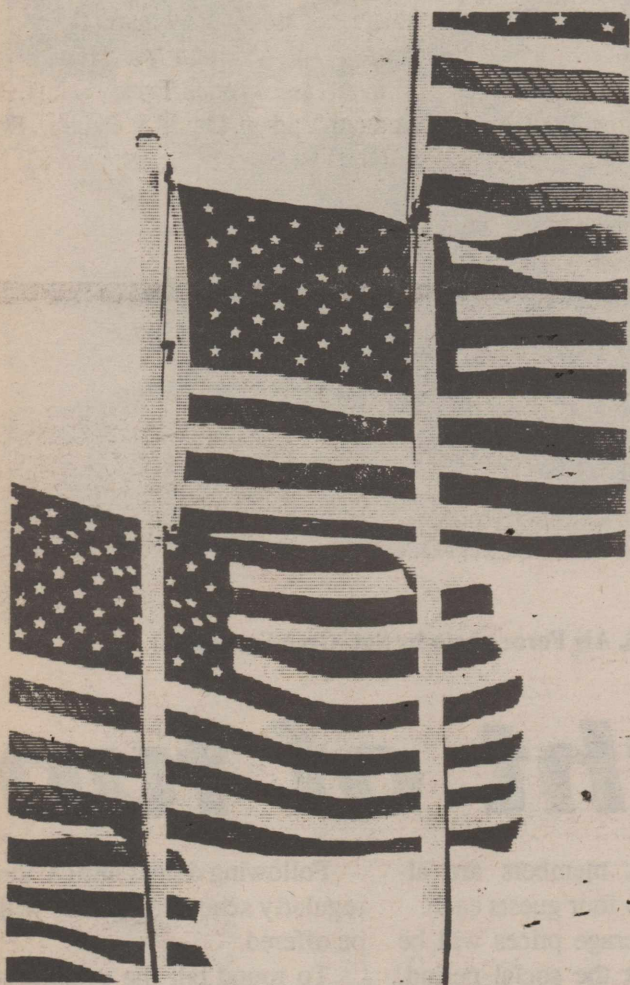
downtown? It seems like we should have a limit on what these companies can charge us on base.

Telephone charges are based upon the "cost of doing business" within a given location. These charges, which are approved by Texas, are shared by everyone using phone service within that location. Hurlwood, which includes Reese Village, is operated by GTE, and has fewer telephone subscribers to share the cost than Lubbock, which is served by Southwestern Bell. As a side note, GTE has programmed installation of new telephone equipment for Hurlwood. The new equipment, which should be installed by October 1990, will both improve service and provide customer features found in Lubbock.

Staff judge advocate advises AF members to limit political activity

The recent U.S. Supreme Court decision concerning burning of the U.S. Flag as an expression of free speech has become a fiery political issue which could draw the unwary military member of the Air Force into restricted territory.

In the case of Texas vs. Johnson, the high court ruled that, in some cases, burning the American Flag is a legal display of freedom of speech. The 5-4 split ruling has spawned a flood of local national letter writing campaigns and demonstrations protesting the decision and calling for legislative reform.

While federal employees (including military personnel) have the Constitutional right to voice their individual opinions on this and other political issues, there are limits to the extent they may be involved in political issues.

According to Maj. Howard Altschwager, Reese staff judge advocate, these restrictions are detailed in U.S. federal statutes, specifically Codes 5, 18 and 42 and in AFR 110-2. Basically, Air Force personnel may

not "officially" participate in activities or events which endorse a particular political candidate or cause.

"What this means," explained Major Altschwager, "is that bluesuiters should not participate in a partisan political activity, such as a demonstration, while in uniform, nor should they use their official position or title in support of such an activity."

Major Altschwager stressed that all federal employees retain the right, as individuals, to contact their legislative representatives to express personal opinions. The difference is between expressing your opinion as a representative of the Air Force, whether real or perceived, and expressing your opinion as a private citizen.

Anyone considering participating in a partisan political activity should first contact the staff judge advocate's office for information on what is and is not authorized.

Anyone having questions or desiring to read the full text of the court's opinion can either visit the staff judge advocate's office, Bldg. 230, or call 3505.

Disposing of American symbol with dignity

"The Flag, when in such a condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning."

Air Force regulation 900-3, refers to proper disposal of the U.S. Flag and other flags.

To ensure all flags at Reese are disposed of only when necessary and in a dignified way, the following policy has been established:

- Base housing occupants who believe that their flag is no longer service-

able will turn it in to the family housing management branch for inspection and determination. Upon determination of unserviceable condition, housing will turn the flags over to the security police for disposal.

- Other wing members who believe their flags are no longer serviceable should take them to the security police for inspection and determination.

- Upon receipt of flags, the security police will: publicize turn-in dates, times and point of contact; coordinate with the

hospital for use of their incinerator; inspect all flags to determine if they can be repaired or cleaned or if they should be disposed of; and then dispose of unserviceable flags by burning.

This policy is necessary to ensure only those flags no meeting the standards outlined in AFR 900-3 are destroyed, and that proper respect is shown when our symbol is destroyed.

Inoperative taxiway becomes valuable to base

Suggestors gain \$3,929 from its closure

How valuable is taxiway 3?

In operational condition, not very.

But inoperative, the taxiway is worth \$1,964.50 each to Scott Shephard and James King, community planners from the 64th Civil Engineering Squadron, once they submitted an Air Force form 1000, "suggestion form," to have it closed.

Closure of the taxiway also provided Reese with approximately \$145,850 in tangible savings.

Taxiway 3, used primarily by locally assigned T-37s, was temporarily closed due to surface breakup. A project to repair and resurface it was programmed for fiscal year 1991, but had not yet been awarded to a contractor. Oct. 3, 1988, the

suggestion was being considered, and until further notice, the plans for repair were canceled.

Evaluators Maj. Ernest Petrash and Lt. Col. Robert Crawford, from the 64th Student Squadron, reviewed the suggestion and its possible impairment of the wing's mission.

According to Major Petrash, chief of air field management, "The two hundred feet of taxiway was infrequently used when it was in operation condition, therefore closure would have no effect on the wing's mission.

"In its present condition, it is accessible by motor vehicles. Therefore, the fire department will be using it as a roadway, for easier access to the runways," the major added.

Colonel Gerald Deakin, deputy commander of operations, made the final

decision and taxiway 3 was officially closed Feb. 16.

"It was a good idea, saving money from something we didn't really need," concluded Major Petrash.

"The award recipients aren't the only ones who benefit from these suggestions," said Lisa Quigg, suggestion program manager. "Since the money saved comes from tax dollars, in essence, everyone benefits."

Fiscal year 1988 brought Reese \$36,109 in tangible savings, thus, wing members received over \$9,400 in awards.

Since the beginning of fiscal year 1989, 37 suggestions have been adopted, \$8,677 has been paid out in cash awards and Reese has tangibly saved \$190,034.

Other suggesters recognized during fiscal year 1989 include: MSgt. Law-

rence Davis, TSgt. Michael Jordan, TSgt. Stephen Hudson and Gaile Talbott, from the 64th Field Maintenance Squadron; Sgt. Charles Stringham, 64th Organizational Maintenance Squadron; and TSgt. Charles Weltzin, Detachment 429, each received \$100; SSgt. Tom Mathis, 64th CES, received \$35; SSgt. Stephen Ulrich, 64th OMS, and SSgt. Joe Osborne, 1958th Communications Squadron, both received \$25.

A certificate of appreciation and mug were presented to the following for their suggestions: Bill McCoy, 64th Supply Squadron; SSgt. Sheila Newman, 64th CES; and Capt. Christopher Habig, USAF Hospital-Reese.

Camouflaging the Air Force uniformly

The camouflage battle dress uniform will become the mandatory utility uniform for the Air Force effective Oct. 1.

However, the olive green 507 fatigues may be worn on an optional basis until Sept. 30, 1990. "We no longer carry fatigues, but they may be ordered on an availability basis only," said William Watson, base clothing sales representative.

"Clothing sales at Reese is presently well stocked in most sizes of BDUs. Any sizes not stocked that must be ordered

will take approximately 30 days to receive," Mr. Watson added.

The only exception to this new policy is the olive green field jacket, which can be worn through Sept. 30, 1992. "Base supply will issue the BDU jackets through organization authorization once they're available in 1992," said Mr. Watson. "The jackets will not be available for sale at any time through clothing sales."

"People who entered the service prior to when Lackland AFB, Texas began issuing BDUs through basic training will not be authorized issue sets of BDUs,"

said Sgt. Leonard Jones, from the base personal affairs office.

The prices for BDUs are: winter - \$13.25 for shirt, \$14.20 for trousers; summer - \$14.60 for shirt, \$14.30 for trousers.

As of July 1, the Army BDU hat is no longer authorized. Camouflage Air Force hats are available at clothing sales for \$2.45 each. Squadron baseball caps are also authorized.

"Clothing allowances are not expected to increase to offset the doubled-price of BDUs compared to fatigues," said Sergeant Jones.

For those in the Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard, the camouflage fatigues will become mandatory for wear Oct. 1, 1990.

"Other items recently phased out were the men's light blue shirt without epaulets and the women's longer length overblouse, June 1. The men's overcoat shade 1549, is scheduled for phase-out Jan. 1, 1990. Other items with a phase-out date to be announced include jungle fatigues, green T-shirts and the women's blue beret," concluded Sergeant Jones.

Base closures begin in January 1990

The Air Force released the timetable recently for closing five major air bases in the United States, a process that will begin in January 1990.

The schedule comes six months after an independent commission completed its study for the closing of unnecessary military installations in an effort to trim the defense budget. The commission's findings were approved Jan. 5 by former Secretary of Defense Frank Carlucci.

Plans call for completing the force structure (aircraft and related personnel) movement at Pease AFB, N.H., in early 1991; George AFB, Calif., in mid-1992; Mather AFB, Calif., in mid-1993; and Norton AFB, Calif., in late 1993.

The fifth Air Force installation slated for closure, Chanute

AFB, Ill., is expected to complete movement of its technical training courses by early 1993.

Pease is expected to be closed by January 1991.

Chanute will close its gates in July 1993, George in December 1992, Mather in July 1993 and Norton in April 1994.

The annual savings from closing the five bases are estimated at \$381.2 million.

The timing of the transfer of people and equipment has been planned to minimize the impact on the communities involved and provide interim use of the facilities as they become available.

Air Force major commands will be working the implementation and execution of closure actions in concert with local commanders and community leaders. (AFNS)



War stories

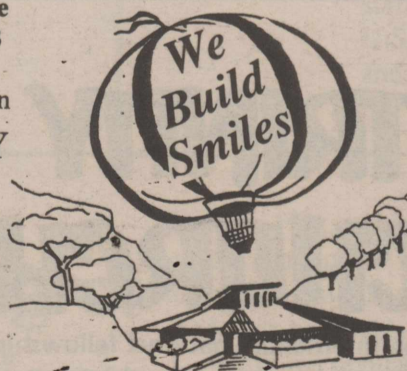

there's no guarantee that their CJR number will come up prior to their date of separation.

"It would be better to apply for retraining than to wait for a CJR and possibly risk reenlistment opportunities," commented Sergeant Barnett.

Persons who have retrained, and are now in an average field, may elect to retrain again or return to their primary career field (if manning slots exist).

In order to retrain, persons must ensure the required amount of retainability following graduation, by either reenlisting or extending for 23 months.

"If someone has already used their extension, and their DOS is too far off for reenlistment, the gaining AFSC may dictate additional extension time or early reenlistment to qualify for retraining," said Sergeant Barnett.

"Once entered into an extension, a person cannot terminate that extension for reenlistment purposes unless within 90 days of their DOS," SSgt. Toni Pittman, from the special actions section.

"Also, those 90 or less days left cannot be used for extension time at a later date," Sergeant Pittman added.

Those persons who have met

time on station requirements at Reese and are in shortage fields, that aren't short here, may soon receive an assignment to a base with a shortage. "CONUS to CONUS moves are unlikely, but not impossible depending on the Air Force's needs," said Sergeant Barnett.

Presently, a mandatory rollback is not expected. "We haven't received anything on paper, so we're not planning on one," she concluded.
