Reese gears up for open house

Col. Bill Henny, 64th Flying Training Wing commander, announced that the U.S. Navy's Blue Angels will perform at Reese June 15 and 16.

The Blue Angels are the Navy's renowned Flight Demonstration Squadron. They will be helping Reese community members begin a series of "fiftieth anniversary" celebration events during the two-day open house, the first Reese has held since March 1989.

"This year's open house celebrates the completion of 50 years of cooperation and support between the wing and the citizens of the Lubbock area community," said Colonel Henny. "I invite all residents of the West Texas-Eastern New Mexico area to come out during the weekend to help us celebrate the start of our 51st year and to see up close how the Armed Services perform their mission."

Although the Blue Angels will be the featured flying attraction, there will be a number of other aircraft performing flyovers and flying capability demonstrations. The remainder of the aircraft will be on static (ground) display on the flightline parking ramp.

The base will be open to the public from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day. During that time there will be a variety of continuing activities. Static display aircraft will be on hand, as will a number of other displays. Starting at 10 a.m. and continuing to 6 p.m. there will be a "Red, White, and Blues Musical Salute Front West Texas to the Armed Forces" featuring a number of West Texas bands. The bands were organized by Landa Jones of Lubbock.

More than 30, and possibly as many as 40 military aircraft will be on static (ground) display on the flightline parking ramp when the gates open. The display will include fighters like the Air Force's F-15 Eagle and F-16 Fight-

ing Falcon, and the Navy's F-14 Tomcat and A/F-18 Hornet. Attack aircraft like the Air Force's A-10 Thunderbolt II and AT-38 Talon, and the Navy's A-4 Skyhawk will have cockpit viewing ladders available.

The seldom seen U-2 reconnaissance plane will make a rare appearance at Reese. Other aircraft not seen here frequently will be an EC-135 command and control ship, and a Navy S-3 Viking. The Canadian Air Force will send a Tudor.

Transport aircraft such as the C-130 Her-

cules and possibly the C-141 StarLifter will be open for walk-through visitors. Both the giant KC-10 Extender and the specialized KC-135Q refuelers can be seen, as can a large variety of Air Force and Navy training aircraft. A few helicopters and some vintage aircraft historically significant to Reese are also slated.

A number of the latest military aircraft, some of which participated in the recent Operation Desert Storm, are expected to fly-by above the flightline, while others will give a demonstration of their flying and maneuvering

capabilities.

Foremost among the capability demonstrations will be an F-15 from the 1st Tactical Fighter Wing at Langley AFB, Va.

The Marine Corps pilots who man the Blue Angels C-130 "Fat Albert" support aircraft will fly a short field jet assisted take-off (JATO) demonstration on both Saturday and Sunday.

Four A-7 Corsair II jets from the New Mexico Air National Guard at Kirtland AFB, Albuquerque, N.M. will stage a simulated air-

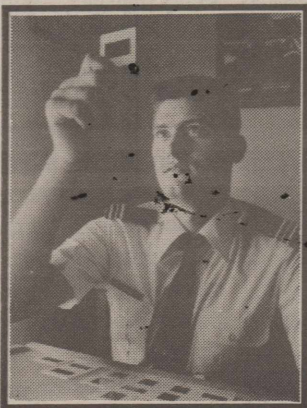

101 Critical Days are here

The USAF developed the "101 Critical Days of Summer" campaign to reverse the unacceptable accident trends that developed between Memorial Day and Labor Day weekends.

According to Reese safety officials, the accident trends have been controlled, but the need to prevent summer accidents still exists. Accident potentials must be identified, corrected and personnel informed of the hazards to prevent a possible accident and injury.

"The primary types of summer off-duty accidents are sport and recreation related," said Charles Gerior, Reese ground safety manager. "With the onset of summer and extended hours of daylight, more sports and recreation accidents occur in greater numbers due to several factors or causes.

"Private motor vehicle, motorcross, bicycle, softball, volleyball, fishing or swimming related water accidents and around the home type accidents are the most common types. Most of these accidents could be avoided if common sense and logic were used," he added.

According to Mr. Gerior, in many accidents, basic safety rules were ignored or not observed. Many times the person injured thought accident prevention was for others, not them.

Sometimes the person injured is a bystander not involved with the activities producing the injury.

Often the person injured is a small child. A child is run over by a ball player, an outdoor grill is spilled over or the child falls out of a boat without a life jacket.

"Summer can be a great season if we all take the time to be safe," he said. "Observe safety rules at home, at the beach, on the playgrounds or ball fields to make your summer accident-free for you and your family."

field attack. This is an event that has never before been witnessed by spectators at a Reese AFB Open House. The attack will be staged with the help of the explosive ordinance disposal unit from Cannon AFB, Clovis, N.M.

Four-ship formations of Reese AFB's own T-37 "Tweet" and T-38 Talon training jets will fly-by in formations each day prior to the Blue Angels show.

Other aircraft expected to fly-by are a B-1B, a B-52 Stratofortress and the F-117 Stealth Fighter. The F-117 will only fly-by on Sunday at a time to be announced later.

A number of exhibits and displays will be available for viewing. The Reese AFB Honor Guard Drill Team will perform during the day, as will the Security Police Dog demonstration team from Sheppard AFB, Wichita Falls, Texas. The Civil Air Patrol, the Federal Aviation Administration, and NASA will have displays in hangar 82.

Also housed in Hangar 82 will be radio controlled model aircraft, a Reese historical exhibit, an Army Air Corps glider exhibit, a mini-Vietnam museum, Operation Desert Storm videos, Reese Security Police armaments, and Reese Fire Department equipment displays.

Starting at 10 a.m. each day, and continuing through 6 p.m. there will be a "Red, White, and Blues Musical Salute From West Texas to the Armed Forces" featuring bands coordinated by Landa Jones. Saturday's bands will be: Blue Steel, Showdown, Robin Griffin, Ground Zero, D.G. Flewellen, and The Nelsons. Sunday's musical entertainment will come from: D.B. Flewellen, Robin Griffin and Tony Adams, Blue Thunder, PJ Belly and the Lone Star Blues Band, and Bugs Henderson.

Reese Open House project officer, Lt. Colonel Loren Stendahl recommends that persons traveling to the base should arrive early and follow the directions of the law enforcement officials who will be trying to make motorists' arrivals and departures as smooth as possible.

There is no charge to attend any of the activities on base. There will be plenty of food, drink, parking, and rest rooms available. There will be a charge for food and beverages.

The Reese AFB visit will mark the only appearance in the West Texas, Arizona, New Mexico and Oklahoma area this year by the Blue Angels.

Locations prone to high kite attacks

Officials urge all to avoid areas

"WHOOSH!!!" was a familiar sound in July 1990, as a group of Mississippi Kites—distant cousins of the falcon—staked a claim on certain areas of Reese.

When the kites arrived this year, they made one thing perfectly clear. They like their privacy.

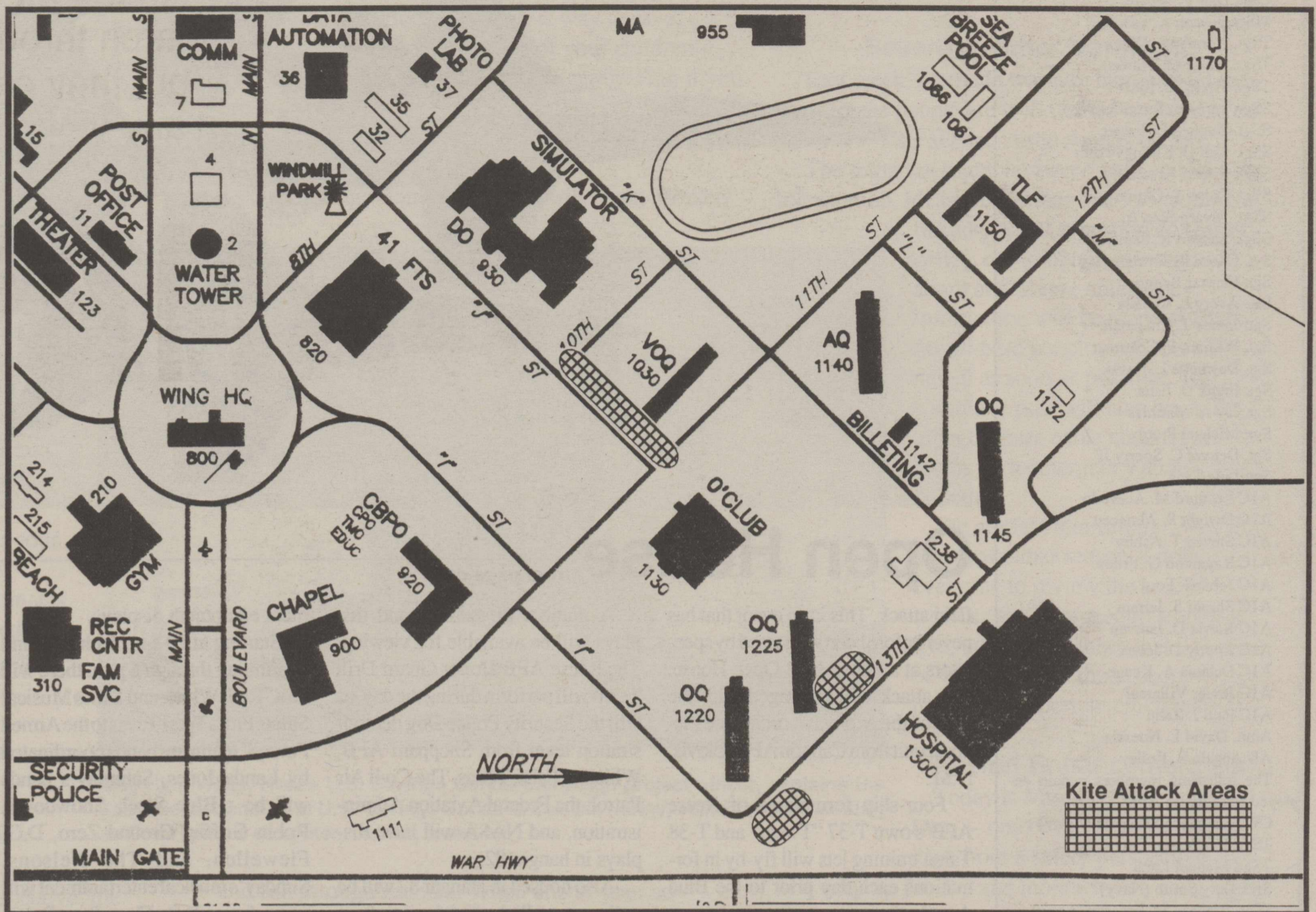
The kites have a wingspan up to three feet and weigh about eight to 12 ounces. They have been noticed between the flight simulator building (Bldg. 930) and visiting officers' quarters (Bldg. 1030) and around the tennis courts and unaccompanied officers' quarters.

"The kites have already built their nests in some trees on base," said Stephen Jones, 64th Civil Engineering Squadron Environmental Planning Section. "After they build their nests, they are protective of their area because of their young offspring."

"Since the kites are migratory, it is illegal to harm them in any way," Mr. Jones said. "The federal game warden will not hesitate to prosecute you. The fine could cost you as much as \$500."

The kites are expected to be in the area until they head south sometime in October. Until then, entomology officials advised wing members to take the following precautions:

- Avoid areas around their nests as much as possible during July and August.
- Look at the bird as it dives. This will intimidate it.



- Wave your arms or a stick. This causes the bird to pull out of its dive.
- If it is necessary to go into one of these areas, try walking parallel to

the line of trees. Also, as strange as it may sound, stay close to the trees. The kites are more apt to swoop into open areas.

Bioenvironmental officials also said people should wear hats when they are in kite areas, since kites tend to strike at the highest point on their

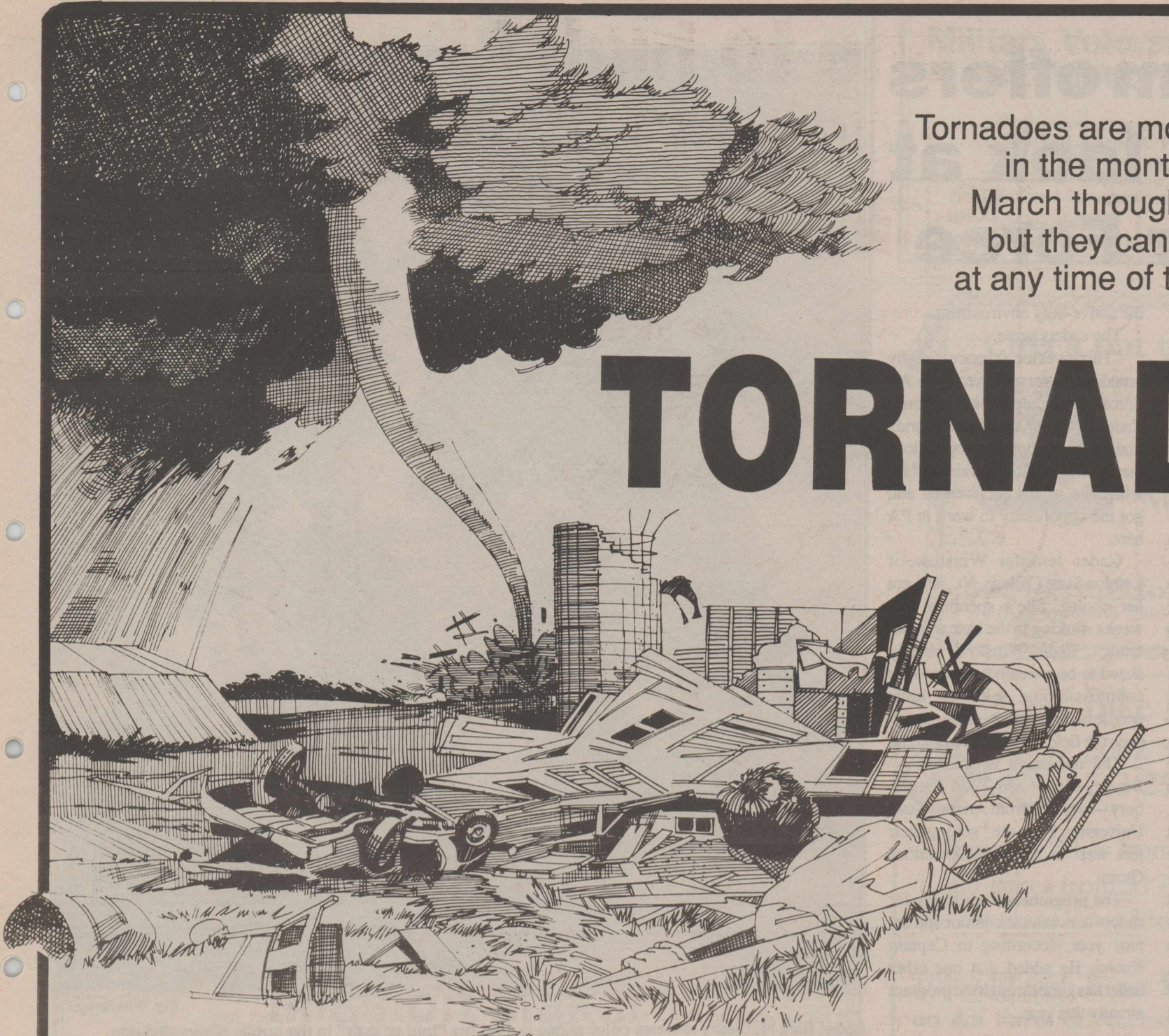

Knowing what to do could save a life

Protective actions you can take in case of tornado:

- If driving in open country, move away from the funnel at right angles.
- In developed areas, seek shelter inside, if possible.
- Greatest safety is to be found in a basement in the corner toward the tornado.
- Lacking a basement, go to small central rooms with closets, storerooms or bathrooms. Safety is enhanced by taking cover under heavy furniture.
- Mobile homes are especially vulnerable to high winds and must be abandoned in favor of better protection.

Pre-Plan

Before the season arrives, find a suitable shelter area in your home or work place. This should be a central hallway or closet on the ground floor. If you live in a mobile home, plan to seek shelter elsewhere.

Assemble a "storm kit," containing flashlights, battery powered radio, spare batteries, and other emergency items.

Instruct family members on actions to be taken in case of your absence.

Notification

The local radio and television stations will issue tornado watches and tornado warnings as instructed by the weather service.

While all the area radio and TV stations will keep you updated on weather conditions, KFYO radio (790) is a member of the Emergency Broadcast System.

Tornado warnings may also be announced by a 3 to 5 minute STEADY TONE on the base siren.

What to do —

Tornado Watch: Weather conditions are favorable for the formation of tornadoes. Tornado activity may be expected.

Tornado watch:

- Secure loose items outside your home or work place. This includes charcoal grills, bicycles, yard tools and other items that may be blown about in high winds.
- Restrict the movements of children to the immediate vicinity.
- Have your "storm kit" standing by.
- Monitor the Emergency Broadcast System — KFYO (790) — for official weather information if thunderstorm activity is observed.

Tornado Warning: A tornado has actually been sighted. Persons in the area of its expected path should take immediate safety precautions.

Tornado warning:

- STAY INSIDE YOUR BUILDING!** The only exceptions to this would be if you are in a mobile home or a metal hangar. Injury or death may occur if you are caught in the open.
- Monitor radio station KFYO (790). Confirming sightings and movements will be broadcast.
- A steady 3 - 5 minute tone on the base siren indicates a tornado has been sighted within 6 miles and Reese appears to be in its path.
- If either the base siren or a loud roar is heard, or if you actually sight a tornado, take cover in the central hallway or storm shelter.
- Avoid areas near windows.
- Do not remain on the second story of any building.
- Lie flat on the floor under some protective cover.

Program offers cadets look at real Air Force

Most everyone has heard a few jokes about lieutenants who are new to the service. The stereotype of the naive, unsure second lieutenant has survived generations of military service.

One program that could eventually quell such an image is active at Reese. The Air Force ROTC Professional Development Program gives cadets a chance to spend time in the active-duty Air Force, getting experience in a field they're interested in as well as the workings of the active-duty force.

Four cadets will complete a two-week stint today at Reese. Literally drawn from the far reaches of the nation, they are getting a chance to see what the "real" Air Force is like. Capt. Jim Kuehn, the wing project officer for the program, said that the students fill out a list of major command and career fields that interest them before they're sent to a base.

The captain, who went through the program himself at Tinker AFB, Okla., when he was in ROTC, said the program's benefits lie in how it gives the cadets a "good feel" for

the active-duty environment.

The cadets agree. "This gives me a chance to really broaden my perspective of the Air Force," said Cadet Rich McCleary. Cadet McCleary, a student at Florida State University, listed operations management, public affairs and intelligence as his preferences and got the opportunity to work in PA here.

Cadet Jennifer Winslow of Lyndon State College, Vt., also got her choice. She's spending two weeks working in the base weather branch. Cadet Winslow, already slated to be a weather officer after commissioning, said that most people in the program get to experience the field they are interested in.

The remaining two cadets — Bradley Harris and Todd Canterbury — are here from Arizona State University. Both are "getting their feet wet" in the 64th Operations Group.

The program is exclusively for cadets between their junior and senior year, according to Captain Kuehn. He added that one other cadet has gone through the program already this year.

Education program results announced

The results of all military service's education programs for fiscal year 1990 were announced April 1991 by DOD DANTES. The total expenditure were \$189,501,103. The Air Force total expenditure was \$59,846,012. Reese's contribution of \$50,000 was used for tuition assistance and another \$122,000 spent on expenses such as personnel and supplies.

The Air Force led all services regarding degree completions as 17,295 associates through doctorates were earned by airmen. The Air Force was followed by the Army with 5,838 degrees and the Navy and Marines had 4,324 degrees.

Enrollments at Reese totaled 692 at the undergraduate level, while there were 50 graduate enrollments. Wing members completed 59 degree programs during fiscal year 1990.

"Despite budgetary constraints, funds for educational assistance remain readily available," said Jeffrey Wilbur, education services officer. "Expenditures here are running 25 percent over the previous year, but additional funds have been provided by Air Training Command."

May 1970 — The Lubbock area was hit by a tornado. Fourteen T-41 aircraft were destroyed and three badly damaged (\$112,774) at the Lubbock Municipal Airport. Nine aircraft were received from other Undergraduate Pilot Training bases to aid in training.

May 1975 — Officers' Open Mess completed.

May 1985 — 3500th Services Squadron designated and authorized on a test basis as a result of a MIP (formerly Services Division).

May 1988 — First Janus Group (honorary squadron commanders) inducted. The group was organized to involve businessmen/women from the Lubbock community in Reese activities.

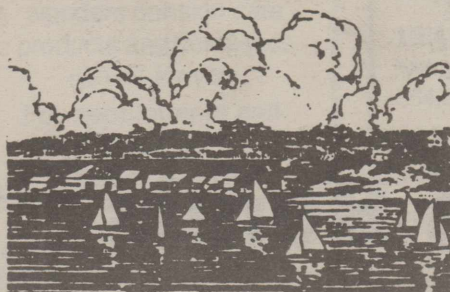

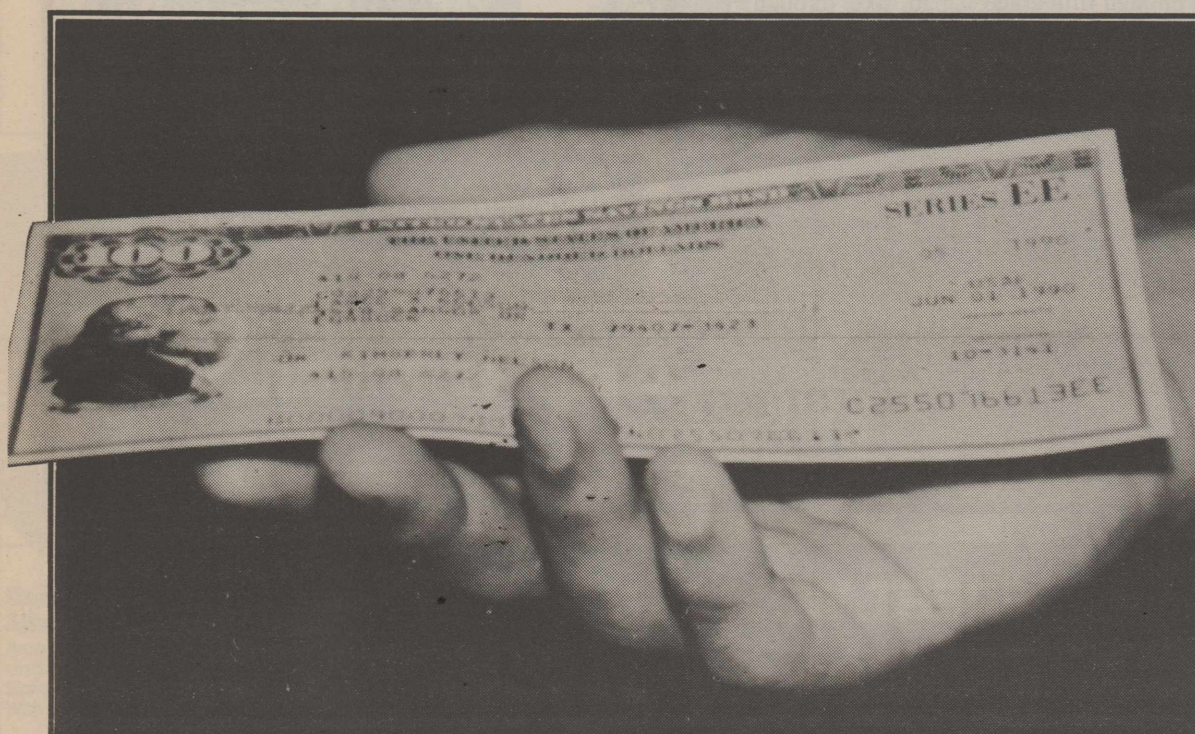

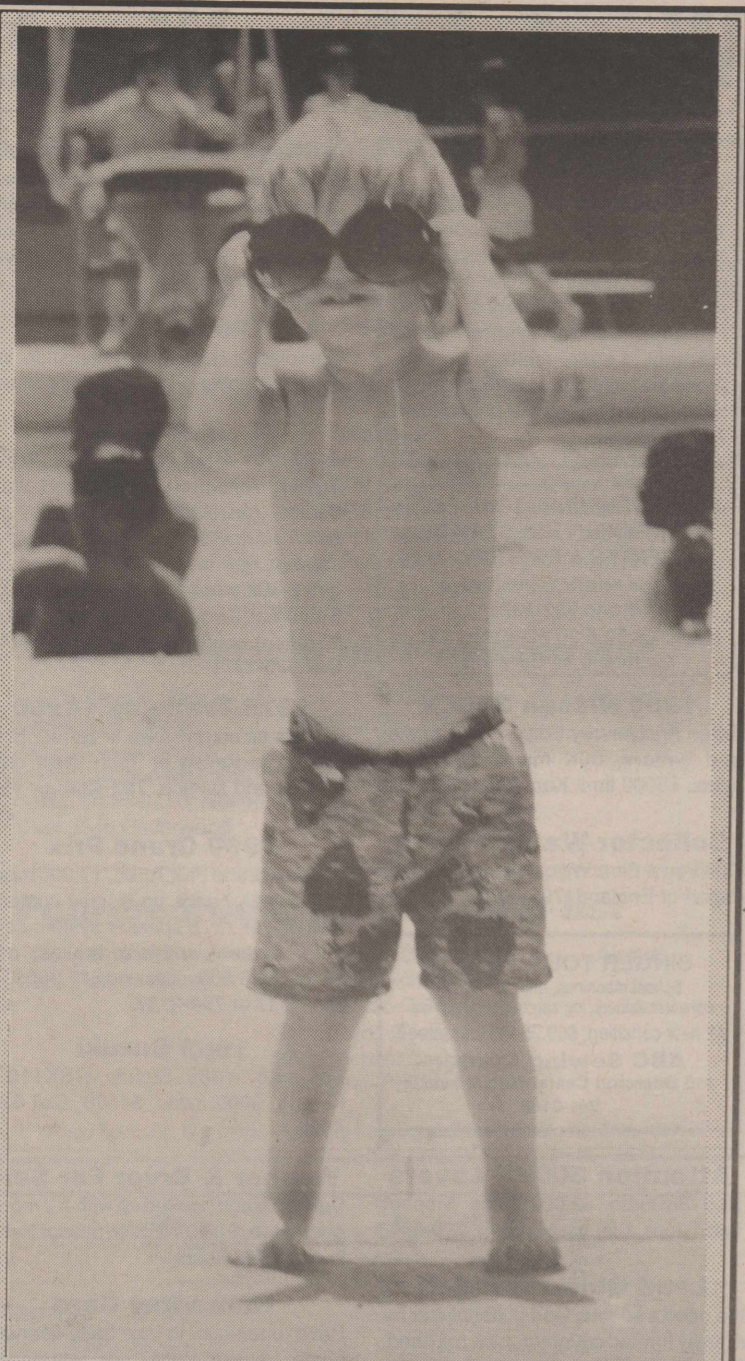
