

# ATC commander advocates 'taking stock in America'

or many of us, saving is hard work. But it doesn't have to be. We can all save more, and do it easily, through the Payroll Savings Plan for U.S. Savings Bonds.

# Sometimes, it's good to be a quitter

ore than 38 million Americans have quit smoking cigarettes, and nearly half of all living adults who ever smoked have quit.

Unfortunately, some 50 million Americans continue to smoke cigarettes, despite the many health education programs and antismoking campaigns that

have been conducted during the past quarter century, despite the declining social acceptability of smoking, and despite the consequences of smoking to their health.

Previous reports of the Surgeon General have reviewed the health effects of smoking. Scientific data is now available on the consequences of smoking cessation for most smoking-related diseases.

The major conclusions of these studies are:

Smoking cessation has major and immediate

health benefits for men and women of all ages. Benefits apply to persons with and without smoking-related disease.

☐ Former smokers live longer than continuing smokers. For example, persons who quit smoking before age 50 have one-half the risk of dying in the next 15 years compared with continuing smokers.

☐ Smoking cessation decreases the risk of lung cancer, other cancers, heart attack, stroke and chronic lung disease.

Women who stop smoking before pregnancy or during the first three to four months of pregnancy reduce their risk of having a low birthweight baby to that of women who never smoked.

☐ The health benefits of smoking cessation far exceed any risks from the average five pound weight gain or any adverse psychological effects that may follow quitting.

Remember how good you used to feel before you started smoking? Well, it's easy to feel that way again. Join those who have quit. Smoking is something you can definitely live without.

# T-37 ends 32 - year Air Force career



**Farewell flight** 

The T-37 is towed to the Officers' Open Mess after its final flight during a ceremony honoring its 'retirement.'

Greater than three million miles flown, equalling 135 trips around the globe.

More than 20 million pounds of fuel turned in its engines.

Flying time in excess of 16,000 hours.

Add it all up and you have 32 years of flying service turned in by the first Reese T-37B to reach its structural life limit. The aircraft, tail no. 57-2338, was retired after its final flight May 30.

Col. Robert Negley, 64th Operations Group commander, and Lt. Col. Bob Brooks, 64th Flying Training Wing, piloted the Tweet on its final flight.

The previous day, 1st Lt. Kenny Crain flew the last operational mission in the jet. The 35th Flying Training Squadron instructor pilot was on a continuation training flight.

After the May 30 flight, a retirement ceremony was held in front of Base Operations, which saw the Tweet towed to the Officers' Open Mess for a brief time before being returned to the flight line.

The T-37 began its service in 1959 with the 3560th Pilot Training Wing at Webb AFB, Texas. It came to Reese in 1977.

The final decision on what will be done with the aircraft has yet to be made.

# Savings bond campaign 'looking to the future'

The Reese U.S. Savings Bonds campaign began June 3 and will run through June 28.

"When your squadron savings bonds representative asks you to increase your allotment or to sign up for the payroll savings plan for the first time, you may ask 'why'?" said Maj. Rich Willis, Reese savings bonds campaign project officer.

In the 1940s when the series E savings bond was introduced, the U.S. personal savings rate went as high as 25 percent. In 1989, it was 5.5 percent of every after-tax dollar.

"It is clear that we need to do better if America is to do better," said Major Willis, "and saving regularly with savings bonds is one way to achieve this goal."

When held for five years or more, savings bonds pay a guaranteed rate of 6 percent no matter what the market does. If the market rises, the savings bonds rate can rise too.

The tax liability on the interest earned on savings bonds can be deferred from federal income taxes and is totally exempt from state and local income taxes.

Since Jan. 1, 1990 for some purchasers, interest earnings on savings bonds may be eligible for exclusion from federal income tax when the bonds are redeemed to pay education expenses, according to Major Willis.

"Savings bonds are easy to obtain through payroll savings plans," said the major. "You don't need large sums of money to begin a savings bonds fund. In the event of an emergency, your investment is available for use after six months."



chance to see some of the aircraft they may soon be flying.





# Storm damage minor, say CE officials
