## Air Force to change selection process for SUPT students

The Air Force plans to change the timing and method for classifying student pilots in specialized undergraduate pilot training, scheduled to begin in 1992.

The change calls for student pilots to be classified into one of two "tracks" — bomber-fighter or tanker-transport — after they complete the primary flying phase of training in the T-37. This will allow each student to directly participate in the classification process, Air Force officials said.

Initially, Air Force officials had planned to classify the students prior to their entrance into training, using a number of criteria, including a battery of cognitive and hand-eye coordination tests. The change to move classification to after completion of the T-37 phase will give students a choice in the classification process, based on actual flying performance.

According to Col. Larry Driskill, 64th Operations Group deputy commander, the change is welcomed by instructors and mirrors recent changes in the assignment system providing students greater choice based on merit.

Demonstrated performance in the T-37 phase, primarily flying performance, will be the key factor because students will choose their classification based on their class standing at the end of the T-37 phase, the officials explained. A merit system considering flying, academics, and military performance will be used to rank order the students, who will then choose their classification from available slots in one of the two advanced-training tracks — one for eventual bomber or fighter pilots, the other for eventual tanker or transport pilots.

Those entering the bomber-fighter track will finish training in the T-38 Talon; those entering the tanker-transport track will finish training in the T-1A Jayhawk.

The T-1A will be added to the Air Force inventory specifically for the tanker-transport track of pilot training. The Air Force will begin accepting T-1As in December. Air Training Command officials said students pilots will begin training in

# Suicide: Be alert to warning signs

Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States. Motor vehicle and aircraft accidents, cardiovascular disease, and suicide are the most common causes of death among active-duty Air Force members.

Most people who eventually commit suicide have told or hinted of their considerations of it to several people on multiple occasions, and in several ways. Thus, timely intervention is critical in preventing suicide.

Thinking of suicide may result from many kinds of problems, and is usually the consequence of a combination of problems.

Most commonly, suicide is the result of depression that may or may not have an apparent cause. It may also result from alcoholism or other drug dependence or severe physical illness or chronic pain. Individuals who feel alienated from others, experience the loss of a relationship, such as a breakup with a spouse or other close relationship, or the death of a family member or close friend, may have thoughts of suicide.

Unfortunately, military people who experience extreme disappointment on return from Desert Storm deployment may struggle with thoughts of suicide. A strong support system is important to all in dealing with life stressors.

People who are "loners" are more prone to consider suicide than those with close families and friends.

Talk of suicide, notes reflecting thoughts of suicide or preoccupation with death should always be taken seriously. While most people who have thoughts of suicide find ways of dealing with their problems, these thoughts are a sign of a need for help. Other possible warning signs

for suicide include changes of a self-destructive nature (such as gambling, promiscuity, drinking more than usual or using drugs), outbursts of anger, becoming careless or accident-prone, withdrawal from friends and activities, lowered work performance or grades in school, giving away prized possessions, and making a will or taking out a new life insurance policy with haste.

Statements of hopelessness, such as "I'm not worth anything" or "my wife would be better off if I were dead," are certainly warning signals. The greatest risk factor is the handling of multiple problems, including some combination of the warning signs just mentioned.

When a person thinks someone might be in trouble and considering suicide, it is important that someone express the concern to them. Showing concern, or even asking about thoughts of suicide, will not put the thought into someone's head.

Rather, it may give the person an opportunity to discuss feelings that are troubling to him.

If there is concern about an individual's consideration of suicide, he or she should be referred to a hospital emergency room or mental health clinic. Most active-duty members who resolve their problems with assistance are returned to successful military careers.

The idea that being treated or evaluated in the mental health clinic will ruin a career is simply inaccurate; members who have career problems after treatment for emotional problems nearly always were in trouble prior to evaluation in the mental health system.

Suicide is usually a preventable tragedy. Proper attention to troubled individuals and referral to professionals who are trained to assist others in coping with their problems may be life-saving.

### Suicide warning signs

- Talk of suicide
- Notes reflecting suicide
- Preoccupation with death
- Self-destructive behavior
- Emotional outbursts
- Withdrawal from friends and family

## From YOUR perspective

### EOM complaint

I have a complaint against the enlisted open mess. I departed base in late June. I went over to the club to cancel my membership May 21 and avoid having to pay June dues. I was informed that since the June statements had already been computed, I would owe for June anyway. I had to pay the \$7 fee for June in order to get my outprocessing slip signed off. People need to know to resign from the club very early to avoid the extra charges.

Enlisted Open Mess monthly membership fees are placed on a member's account on the 15th of each month and are good for that entire month. These dues are payable on or before the last day of the month and are delinquent if not paid by the 20th of the following month. With regard to the member who thought he/she

had paid dues for June, in actual fact, he/she had only paid May dues which we placed on his/her account May 15. Had he/she resigned from the EOM on May 14, there would have been no dues charged for May.

For personnel in permanent change of station status, we encourage you to request a temporary card which will allow limited club privileges at any EOM during your travel. Additionally, any time you have a question regarding your EOM statement, please feel free to drop by the club or morale, welfare and recreation and discuss the matter. Thanks for your inquiry.

I think the recycling program here is excellent, however, can we move the drop point from in front of the base exchange to somewhere else? It is always such an eyesore there.

Morale, Welfare and Recreation Logistics Branch will check the recycling containers every Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning to ensure they are not overfilled. One of the leading causes of home fires is the careless misuse of electricity.

Electrical wiring includes much more than what we see every day in our homes. Wall outlets, appliance cords, light fixtures and light switches are all potential areas where the misuse or lack of knowledge of safe operating habits can cause a fire.

The circuit breaker panel in each home is designed to automatically trip off when excessive amperage is drawn for a particular area. If a circuit breaker trips repeatedly, there may be a serious problem — possibly too many appliances exceeding the maximum amperage; a defective appliance; defective circuit breaker; or older wiring and wiring connections that are not capable of handling modern day technology.

If you are experienced these problems, you may need to use your appliances selectively and wisely.

The same goes for light fixtures and light bulbs. Do you

ever think about the maximum wattage of a light bulb when you put in a new bulb? If a lighting fixture does not have an imprinted warning somewhere on the lighting fixture, never go above 60 watts. In both the renovated and unrenovated base housing units, some of the lighting fixtures have either

an imprinted warning or stick-on label providing information as to maximum wattage required to reduce the possibility of electrical fires.


When heavy amperage-drawing appliances are being used, turn on lights to see if there is any visible indications of lights becoming bright or dimming. This could be an indication of potential problems or defects in installed wiring.

If you use extension cords, be extremely careful. Extension cords are not designed to be used permanently like the wiring in your home is. Don't tie knots, pull on the cords to pull the plug out of the wall socket, or put through doorways, windows or anywhere else that can cause crimping of the wires inside the insulation.

When the circuit breaker trips, especially when you are using a lot of amperage or particular appliances, something is wrong!

Don't attempt to do electrical work by yourself, other than changing light bulbs or turning circuit breakers on and off.

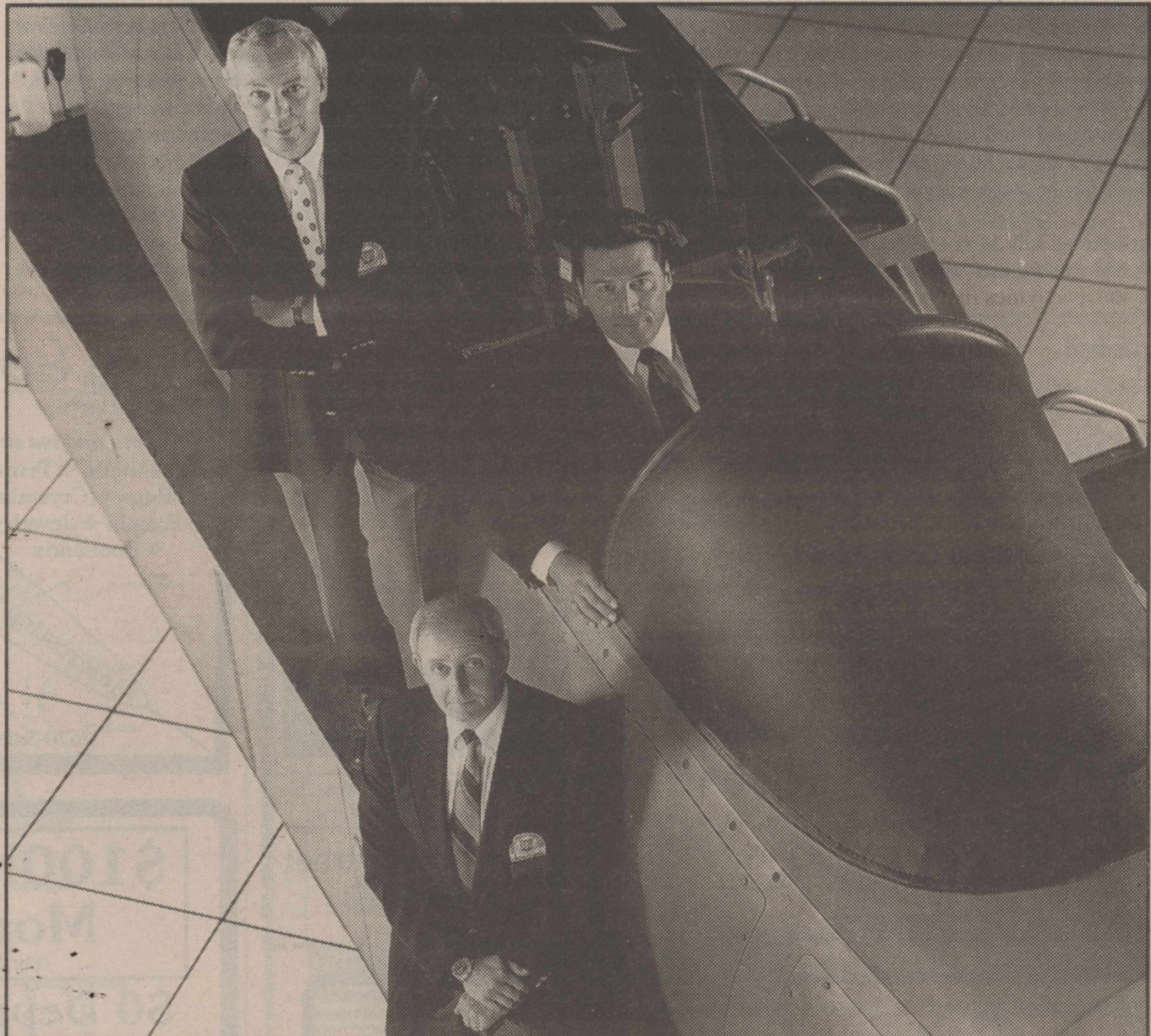

# Search and rescue

## CAP aids in search for missing aircraft

Two men killed in an airplane crash late last week were located Saturday by Civil Air Patrol searchers. The wreckage was located in a pasture northeast of Whitharral, Texas, which is 55 miles west and slightly north of Lubbock.

Over 150 CAP personnel from the South Plains and the state used more than 20 aircraft and ground vehicles during the two and one-half day search for the single-engine Piper Tomahawk.

"We were notified July 18 at 11:30 p.m. that a plane had crashed and still was not

found," said 1st Lt. Mark Cheslow, a senior member of Civil Air Patrol's Lubbock County Composite Squadron, located at Reese. "We rounded up our group July 19 at 6:30 a.m. at the Lubbock International Airport, designated as mission control."

A ground team was dispatched south of Plainview — the last known location of the aircraft. Lieutenant Cheslow led the ground team. Team members were: Cadets Tim and Jeremy Josey, Michael DeWild, Michael Vermillion, Dustin Kendrick and David Furnish. Lieutenant Cheslow's team searched

for the aircraft with no luck. The search was called off at sunset July 19 at 9 p.m.

"We regrouped Saturday at 6:30 a.m. to begin looking again," Lieutenant Cheslow added. "Senior member Gerald Vermillion was used as an observer, flying two sorties."

The aircraft was located shortly after 10:15 a.m. Ground teams were dispatched to target site about 10:20 a.m. and quickly secured the site until the National Transportation Safety Board and the Federal Aviation Administration arrived.

The site was handed over to local law

enforcement once the preliminary investigation was done by the CAP.

Cadets Kathy Dewild, John Domansky, Lindell Forbes, Elizabeth Holden, Tony Whitehead, Michael Domansky, Mark Case and Michael Welker stayed at the airport and served as flight line marshals.

Other Reese CAP members that participated in the search were: Lt. Col. Gene Ridgeway; Capts. JoAnn Ridgeway, Joyce and Dan Domansky; flight officer James Lewallen; and senior member Michelle Henderson.

the T-1A in January 1993 at Reese. A missionized version of the 400A business jet built by Beech Aircraft, the T-1A is designed to teach specific skills unique to piloting tanker and transport-type aircraft.

"Crew coordination is a critical part of effectively and safely flying crew aircraft such as the C-5 or KC-135," Lt. Col. Mike Campano, commander of Detachment 2, 3307th Test and Evaluation Squadron said. "We selected the T-1A Jayhawk not only for its potential to train pilots in the basics of flying, but also to provide a much better airborne classroom than the T-37 or T-38 to teach concepts and procedures associated with crew flying."

Currently, ATC uses a single-track method of pilot training. In it, all students train in both the T-37 and T-38. Five to seven weeks before graduation, the students select their individual follow-on aircraft assignments from a block of available aircraft and associated locations.

The merit order system is used to determine class standing and order of selection for assignment choice. Officials said the process was tested April 5 to ensure that it was well understood, standardized between bases, and provided maximum opportunity for the graduate to have a say in aircraft and base.

The feedback was positive and the first class to be assigned was Class 91-09 here. Since then, four UPT and two Euro-NATO Joint Jet Pilot Training classes have received assignments under the new merit order system. The process emphasizing choice, incentive, and student performance, has been well received by the students, command officials said. (Adopted from ATC News Service)

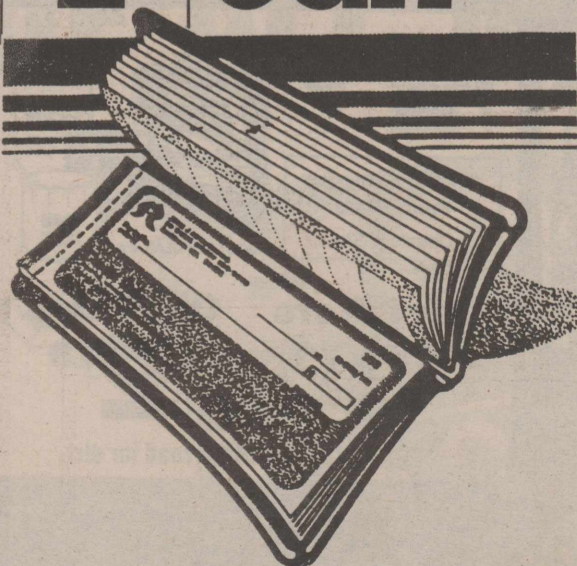

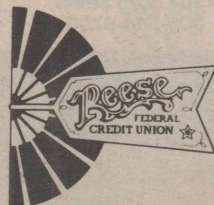

### CCAF deadline

The fall graduation documentation cutoff date for the October class of the Community College of the Air Force is Aug. 26, CCAF officials said.

All documents necessary to place a student in candidacy status must be received at CCAF by close of business on that day.

People who are close, or think they are close to graduating, should contact their base education office or CCAF representative for a records review.

# Members leaving AF offered variety of benefits

The Air Force will offer a full range of transition benefits to people preparing for civilian life through the transition assistance program, senior Air Force and Department of Defense officials told Congress July 18.

Locally, the transition assistance program is currently the responsibility of the education office and the family support center, according to Phil Thierry, family support center director. "However," he said, "other base agencies will have a part to play in the overall transition program."

"The Air Force intends to do what it has always done, take care of its own," said J. Gary Cooper, assistant secretary of the Air Force for manpower, Reserve affairs, installations and environment.

As the Air Force faces downsizing, it will continue to put proper focus on maintaining a quality force through the retention of high quality people, "yet at the same time implement a transition program that takes care of those who are forced to separate, one that minimizes turbulence for the separating members, their families and the Air Force mission," Mr. Cooper told the Veterans' Affairs subcommittee on education, training and employment.

With the Air Force reducing its force by nearly 20 percent over the next five years, an Air Force task force was formed in August 1990 to work transition issues.

"The Air Force goal is to provide the member the smoothest transition to civilian life possible," said Mr. Thierry. "This will require a team effort by all 'OPRs' on base that will be involved in the transition assistance program."

For the Air Force, transition assistance benefits planned for separating people include granting up to 30 days excess leave or

up to 10 days permissive temporary duty. This is intended to help people in their search for employment and homes, the Air Force said in a message to personnel offices worldwide.

Additionally, permissive TDY may be allowed during the 180 days prior to separation for attending Defense Department-approved transition assistance programs, if they are not offered locally. Eligible people may be allowed space-available travel to and from these transition seminars. Ser-

vice activities. This preference applies to any NAF job, UA-8 or below and equivalent positions, as well as for positions paid at hourly rates, regardless of the job grade.

Extended use of exchanges and commissaries. Eligible people and their families are allowed these privileges for up to two years after separation, during a five-year period which began Oct. 1.

Extended housing privileges. Space permitting, members and their families may be allowed to stay in government housing

goods. These allowances are offered to people involuntarily discharged under other than adverse conditions during the five-year period which began Oct. 1. The entitlement is limited to people on active duty on Sept. 30, 1990, who, if involuntarily discharged, would not immediately be eligible for retired pay.

DOD Dependent Schools. During the five-year period, dependents who have completed their junior year by the date their sponsor is discharged and are likely to finish their senior year within one year of that date, will be allowed to enroll in their senior year of high school at government expense. This determination will be made by the regional school director serving the military community.

The effective date for the transition benefits is Oct. 1, 1990, except for the Montgomery GI Bill, which is Feb. 3, 1991, and the hiring preference, which is Nov. 5, 1990.

People who have already been discharged, but who are eligible under these standards, will be notified on how to receive reimbursement, if due one, or to obtain the benefits.

To ensure proper reimbursement, everyone is encouraged to save medical receipts for civilian medical treatment received 60 to 120 days after separation. Receipts for the shipment and storage of household goods associated with final moves should also be saved.

In order to receive these benefits, people must be discharged under honorable conditions.

vicemen and women may be accompanied by their spouse between the United States and overseas areas, however, dependent travel within the United States is prohibited.

Involuntarily separated people who meet certain requirements will also receive medical and dental care in DOD-sponsored medical facilities. This also applies to their families. They can also receive medical care through CHAMPUS in the same priority as dependents of active-duty members. The transitional medical benefit is in effect for a five-year period which began Oct. 1.

Other transitional benefits being offered are:

Hiring preference in nonappropriated

for up to 180 days after separation on a rental basis equivalent to the variable housing allowance and basic allowance for quarters for that locality. Availability will be determined by the installation commander.

Montgomery GI Bill. People who previously elected not to take part in the Montgomery GI Bill will be given another opportunity to enroll or convert to the bill from Veterans Education Assistance Program with a \$1,200 payroll deduction.

Travel allowances. Eligible people will be authorized travel allowances for up to one year after separation to home of selection anywhere in the United States. This includes travel for their family members and shipment and storage of household

Applicants must have a superior performance record, a master's degree, retainability through the summer of 1997, and a minimum of three years at their current duty location by August 1992. The three-year minimum can be waived for overseas returnees or those completing a controlled tour.

Colonels applying for ROTC duty will be considered for any projected vacancies, regardless of their school preference. School preferences are solicited and every effort is made to satisfy desires; however, unique requirements may require an individual be assigned to a particular school.

Some schools require a personal interview, and the final selection is approved by the college or university.

Vacancies in 1992 are currently projected at: University of California, Berkeley; Florida State University, Tallahassee; University of Florida, Gainesville; Indiana University, Bloomington; University of Notre Dame; University of Kentucky, Lexington; and University of Maryland,

College Park.

Also, Michigan State University, East Lansing; University of Missouri, Columbia; North Carolina State University, Raleigh; University of Oklahoma, Norman; Oregon State University, Corvallis; University of Pittsburgh; South-

west Texas State University, San Marcos; Angelo State University, San Angelo, Texas.

Application procedures and the résumé format are outlined in Air Force Regulation 36-20, Paragraph 8-13. (Air Force News Service)

### Air Force allows Desert Storm participants to change records

The Air Force has made it easier for people affected by promotion delays from Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm to correct their military records, officials at the Air Force Military Personnel Center said.

Because of an increased number of supplemental promotions as a result of the Middle East conflict, the Air Force board for the correction of military records is allowing deviations from the standard procedures for correcting the effective date of promotion.

Many enlisted people could not be considered for promotion in a timely manner because they were unable to take the required tests, as well as for other operational reasons. As a

result, some were not notified of promotion until after they would have originally assumed their new rank.

In order to correct the effective date of promotion to equal the date of rank and receive all back pay and allowances, a person normally is required to submit to the board an application for correction of military records, Department of Defense Form 149.

People whose supplemental promotions were affected by Desert Shield and Desert Storm do not have to submit a DD Form 149. The Air Force Military Personnel Center will work with the Air Force board for the correction of military records to correct the promotion effective dates.

The board will then provide the information to the Defense Finance Accounting Center for payment, and the Air Force Military Personnel Center will update the effective date of promotion to agree with the date of rank.

Personnel officials say this procedure is only for the correction of the effective date of promotion to coincide with the date of rank because of supplemental selection. Any other corrections, to include termination of withholdings and deferrals, still require submission of a DD Form 149 with supporting documentation to the board.

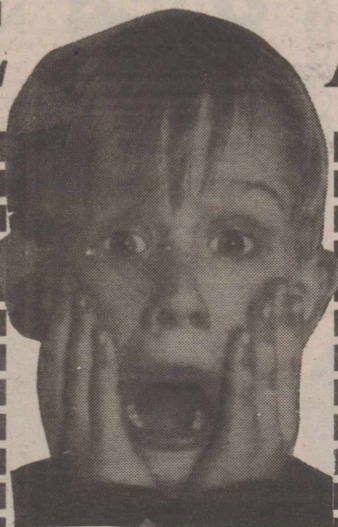

# Sergeant selected by President Bush as 'point of light'

An active member of the parent-teachers association, Sergeant Erickson has established a program to ensure that children return home safely after school.

In addition, Sergeant Erickson volunteers for the "Volunteer in Public Schools" program, assisting third-, fourth-, and fifth-grade teachers in the classroom. He supplements the history textbook with interesting historical facts. Sergeant Erickson also teaches students skills such as reading maps.

President Bush salutes Sergeant Erickson for following through on the president's suggestion: "If you have a hammer, find a nail. If you know how to read, find someone who can't. If you're not in trouble, seek out someone who is." (ATC News Service)

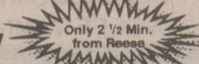

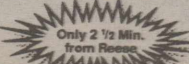

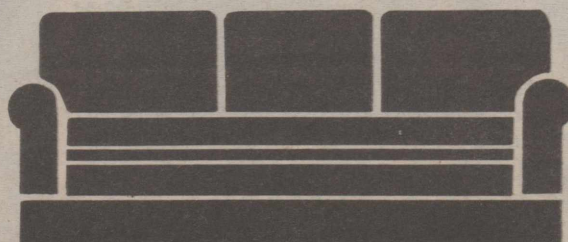
