FIRE, FIRE AND MORE FIRE

Here recently, we had two separate fires the same day. The first one got started in the morning and burned what was left of our neighbor's pasture. A fire about a month ago had burned most of it. The volunteer fire department got it whipped out in short order. Later that same day, after the wind had gotten up, another one started a couple of miles away, and was ripping towards us and our neighbor to the west. With the increased wind, it was rapidly heading straight to their house. As we found out, the neighbor's wife was at home alone without any transportation, so another neighbor dashed over in his pickup and got her. Right in the middle of all this, two trucks and two graders needed to cross our place and try to save the neighbor's house. We had to cut our fence in three places for them to get through. Even then, they had to cross a creek and cut two more fences to get to the house. The flames were virtually licking at their front porch when the firemen arrived. In spite of all that, they managed to save the house. The next day, the wind blew some live embers over to some dead grass and got it going again. The fire guys got it hemmed in and killed it in short order. I've said all that to say this; our volunteer fire departments aren't called

"professionals," only because they don't get paid. Their abilities, actions and bravery, couldn't be more professional! It's also impressive, how all the departments from the surrounding towns show up to help each other. Without all these folks, able and willing to do what they do, we'd be in a deep trouble. I can't put in words, how much we owe to them.

Roads 19 and R on Tuesday was the first of the four fires. The five fire departments north of the river were called with the loss of approximately 1,500 acres.
The first of the Wednesday fires was at County Road 21 and O. This fire was of unknown origin. As our North Wheeler County Fire Departments were fighting this fire, the County Road R and 19 rekindled. Kelton School was evacuated as a safety precaution Wednesday. The second fire also resulted in the loss of 1,500 acres.

The Shamrock Volunteer Fire Department was called to a fire at Pakan Road and I-40. An estimated 12,000 acres was burned before this fire was extinguished some 24 hours later. At least one home was destroyed in this fire. A total count of outbuildings lost was not available.

WHEREAS, by declaration issued March 28, 2016, the County Judge of Wheeler County, Texas declared a state of disaster for Wheeler County, resulting from the potential threat of wildfires due to drought and diverse weather conditions; and

WHEREAS, said state of disaster requires that certain emergency measures be taken pursuant to the Texas Disaster Act of 1975 relating to Emergency Management, specifically §418.108(a) of the Government Code;

Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by majority vote, have authorized the Wheeler County Judge to sign this order for the benefit of the citizens of Wheeler County, Texas;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDERED, that the following emergency regulations be hereby established for all areas of Wheeler County, Texas, and shall take effect and immediately upon issuance of this order and shall remain in effect until the state of disaster is terminated:

(1) **THE USE OF COMBUSTIBLE MATERIALS IN AN OUTDOOR ENVIRONMENT BY ANY PERSON IS PROHIBITED:**

(A) Combustible materials include, but are not limited to the use of all fireworks (aerial and non-aerial), discarded cigarettes, cigars or other flammable materials, materials used in activities such as welding and any other activity that could result in a fire.

(B) Agricultural burning is strictly prohibited. This prohibition includes all burning to clear land of trees, stumps, shrubbery and other natural vegetation.

(C) Ground fires, camp-fires and bonfires are prohibited.

(D) The burning of household waste, including trash, garbage, leaves, grass, brush and other yard trimmings is prohibited.

(2) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;

Welding is allowed by commercial/professional welders under the following guidelines only:

(a) A spotter is required for each welder, each cutter, each grinder or for any activity that causes or may cause a spark.

(b) A diameter across the welding area shall be a minimum of 25 feet and clear of vegetation, if possible, and kept wet. The welding diameter must be three times the height of the actual welding. Example: if welding

(c) A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

(d) Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged 10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site.

(e) If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper precautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps).

(f) Each site will have cellular telephone communications for emergency response.

(g) Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

(3) **OUTDOOR COOKING IS ALLOWED UNDER THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES:**

(a) A charged water hose must be present in the immediate vicinity.

(b) Cookers must be on non-combustible surfaces,

such as gravel, concrete or bare dirt.

(c) Cookers must have a lid and be closely monitored while the lid is open.

(d) Use of wood or charcoal fueled cookers is prohibited.

(4) **ENFORCEMENT**
 (a) Upon notification of suspected outdoor burning, the fire department assigned to the location of the fire shall respond to the scene and take immediate measures to contain and/or extinguish the fire.

(b) At the discretion of the Peace Officer or Fire Chief, violations of this order may be prosecuted in accordance with the statutes and procedures governing misdemeanors.

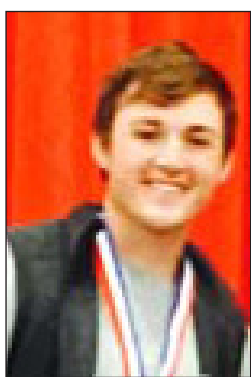

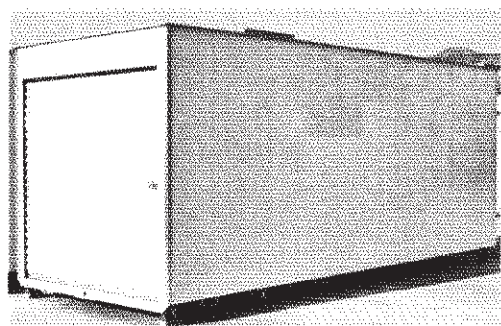

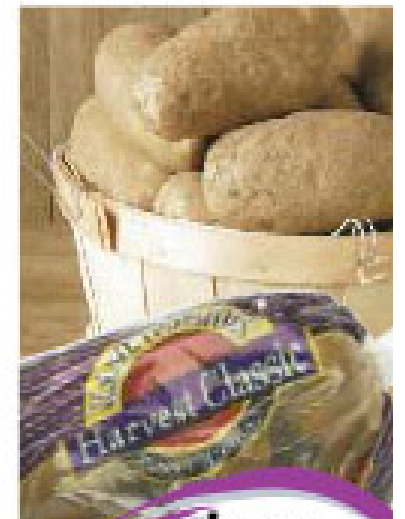
