Underserved or beginning farmers and ranchers who cannot obtain commercial credit from a bank can apply for either FSA direct loans or guaranteed loans. Direct loans are made to applicants FSA. Guaranteed loans are made by lending institutions who arrange for FSA to guarantee the loan. FSA can guarantee up to 95 percent of the loss of principal and interest on a loan. The FSA guarantee allows lenders to make agricultural credit available to producers who do not meet the lender's normal underwriting criteria.

"During fiscal year 2015, Texas FSA obligated \$157.6 million in loans and guarantees to assist 1,592 targeted underserved and beginning producers," said Canales.

The direct and quaranteed loan program provides for two types of loans: farm ownership loans and farm operating loans.

Farm ownership loan funds may be used to purchase purchase easements or participate in the operation. rights of way needed in the farm's operation, build or improve buildings such as a dwelling or barn, promote soil and water conservation and development and pay closing

Farm operating loan funds may be used to purchase poultry, livestock, equipment, fertilizer, and other materials necessary to operate a successful farm. Operating loan funds can also be used for family living expenses, refinancing debts certain conditions, paying salaries for hired farm laborers, installing or improving water systems for home, livestock, or irrigation similar other and improvements.

In addition to customary farm operating and ownership loans, FSA now offers Microloans through the direct

The focus of Microloans is on the financing needs of small, beginning farmer, niche and nontraditional farm operations, such as truck farms, farms participating in direct marketing and sales such as farmers' markets, CSA's (Community Supported restaurants Agriculture), and grocery stores, or those using hydroponic, aquaponic, organic and vertical growing methods. Microloans are available for both ownership operating finance needs. To learn more about microloans, visit www.fsa. usda.gov/microloans.

Repayment terms for direct operating loans depend on the collateral securing the loan and usually run from one to seven years. Financing for direct farm ownership loans cannot exceed 40 years. Interest rates for direct loans are set periodically according to the Government's cost of borrowing. Guaranteed loan terms and interest rates are set by the lender.

To qualify as a beginning operated a farm for less than 10 years. Applicants must

ownership For farm purposes, the applicant must not own a farm greater than 30 percent of the average size farm in the county at the time of application. All direct farm ownership applicants must have participated in the business operations of a farm for at least three years out of the last 10 years prior to the date the application is submitted. If the applicant is an entity, all members must be related by blood or marriage and all entity members must be eligible beginning farmers.

USDA (from Page one location, the data that's important to both FSA and RMA will be securely and electronically shared with the other location," said FSA Administrator Val Dolcini. "This will avoid redundant and duplicative reporting, and we expect this to save farmers and ranchers time.

"Accuracy in crop reporting is a key component for crop insurance, because error in this information can affect premiums or claims. This is going to greatly improve efficiencies and reduce mistakes," said RMA Administrator Brandon Willis.

Since 2009, USDA has been working to streamline the crop reporting process for agricultural producers, who have expressed concerns with providing the same basic common information for multiple locations. 2013, USDA consolidated the deadlines to 15 dates for submitting these reports, down from the previous 54 dates at RMA and 17 dates for FSA. USDA representatives believe farmers and ranchers will experience a notable improvement in the coming weeks as they approach the peak season for crop reporting later this summer.

More than 93 percent of all annual reported acres to FSA and RMA now are eligible for the common data reporting, and USDA is exploring adding more crops. Producers must still visit both locations to validate and sign acreage reports, complete maps or provide programproducer, the individual or specific information. Dolcini also reminded farmers and ranchers that they can now access their FSA farm information from the convenience of their home computer. "You can see your field boundaries, images of your farm, conservation status, operator and owner information and much more," said Dolcini.

The new customer selfservice portal, known as FSAFarm+, gives farmers and ranchers online access to securely view, print or export their personal farm data. To enroll in the online service, producers are encouraged to contact their local FSA office for details. To find a local FSA office in your area, visit http:// offices.usda.gov.

Zeka (from Page 1) Α. possibly albopictus). These mosquitoes are mainly found in South Texas and along the Texas coast, but are also present in other parts of Texas, especially urban environments. They typically lay eggs in and near standing water in things like buckets, bowls, animal dishes, flower pots and vases. They live indoors and outdoors.

### Contracting Zika

Even if you don't know you're infected, mosquitoes that bite you could transmit the virus to others. Mosquitoes may pick up certain viruses, such as Zika, from biting a human who has a Zika infection. The mosquito takes a blood meal from the human and takes in the virus in the human's blood. Then, after about 7-10 days, the mosquito may pass the Zika virus to other humans when biting them. The illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting several days to a week.

Most Texas cases of Zika are related to travel. People were bitten by an infected mosquito while traveling to areas where Zika is being spread and then diagnosed after returning home.

Although rare, the Zika virus may also be among the causes of Guillain-Barré syndrome, a condition in which your immune system attacks part of your nervous system. The Zika virus also with the Zika virus during pregnancy.

The Zika virus has been linked to birth defects such as microcephaly, a condition where a baby's head is much smaller than expected and can cause developmental delays.


There have not been any reports of pets or other kinds of animals spreading or contracting Zika.

Sexual contact, blood transfusion

The Zika virus can also be spread through sexual contact and blood transfusion. In known cases of sexual transmission, men Zika symptoms and spread the virus to sex partners. Research shows the virus might persist in semen longer than in blood; studies to determine the duration of persistence in semen are not

yet completed. To date, there have not been any confirmed blood transfusion transmission cases in the United States. The best way to protect the U.S. blood supply is to screen blood donors using the donor history questionnaire and asking about recent travel to areas with active transmission of Zika, according to the American Association of Blood Banks. That's because there is no screening test or vaccine available for Zika at this time. The FDA recommends that individuals at risk for Zika virus infection postpone blood donations for four weeks.
