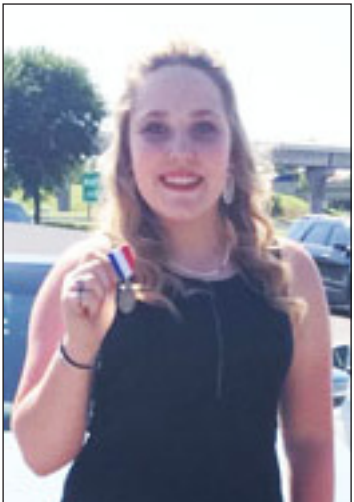

Commissioners’ Court

Co. Expenses for Month, \$446,950.84

The Commissioners’ Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, June 13, 2016, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners’ Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concerns.

At 10:00 a.m. actions were taken on the 15 items on the agenda.

- The minutes of the previous meetings were approved as presented.
- The monthly reports of the Justices of the Peace, County Tax Assessor, County Treasurer, County Clerk and District Clerk were accepted.
- There were no Budget Amendments.
- Line transfers were made within the precincts.
- No action was taken on the Policy Manual.
- No action was taken on the Burn Ban.
- The Wheeler County Cafeteria Plan, having to do with retirement, was adopted, effective June 1.
- The county contract with ARTS was not renewed.
- Leslie Standerfer, County Attorney was allowed to add Cristina Hoffman to the payroll as a full time employee,

Wheeler County’s Farmers Market Set To Open Wednesday, June 29

The Wheeler County Farmers’ Market is going to begin on Wednesday, June 29th,

effective June 13, 2016, at a salary of \$2,896.96 per month.

• The court voted to allow Margaret Dorman, County Clerk, to revise postage machine contract.

• The commissioners voted to pay-off the debt on Asphalt Zipper for Precinct 4, John Walker, Commissioner, in the amount of \$104,798.40.

• John Walker, Commissioner, Pct. 4, requested the purchase of a 15 ft. Bat Wing mower at a cost of \$14,000.00. The purchase was approved.

• The court approved advertising for bids for a 30’x50’ porch cover, all with 4” concrete for 4-H Shooting Range in Shamrock, Texas.

• The commissioners are completing the TxDOT’s Transportation Infrastructure Fund grant program work on two miles of County Road O. Next work will be done on County Road A, followed by work on County Road 9. The completion of these three roads will complete the TIF program.

• The county voted to pay the bills in the amount of \$319,199.15 for the pay period, 5/24/2016 to 6/10/2016. Payroll amounted to \$127,751.69.

for more. With all the early growing season, more people should have plentiful gardens, and the market provides an excellent outlet source for the sale of agricultural products to the public. Only products grown in Wheeler County should be sold at our market; therefore no Colorado peaches, Okla-homa watermelons, Floydada pumpkins, etc. would be allowed. The exception would be made by a general consensus vote of the participating vendors on a one-by-one basis.

Some gardens were planted early this year and with recent rains results should be great. It promises to be a good fruit year with lots of blackberries, plums, apples, grapes, etc. available; however there are very few apricots and peaches this year. There should be lots of summer squash, winter squash, tomatoes, peppers, peas, okra, corn, turnips, radishes, melons, cantaloupes, cucumbers, etc. In addition to the fruit and vegetables for sale, the usual fare of agricultural products including honey, eggs, nuts, etc. will be available as well as baked goods and canned goods.

Market will be held every Wednesday from 3 until 6 and starting Saturday, July 2nd, every Saturday from 9:00 a.m. until 12 noon on the west side of the courthouse in Wheeler.
