

# Aquatic Center Phase 1 To Cost \$1,786,211

The Wheeler City Council met in regular session on Monday. The bids were

opened for the first phase of the Wheeler Aquatic Center.

After discussion of the bids the council voted to accept the proposal by Plains Builders, Inc. Their bid was \$1,786,211.00 with a completion time of 200 days.

Six bids were received with a price range from \$1,838,000.00 to \$2,293,472.00. The time frame was 180 days to 400

days. It is the hope to have the project completed in time for next summer's swimming season.

The phase includes the aqua play feature, associated concrete decking and storm drains.

## OLD TIMES NOT FORGOTTEN

### MA BARKER, BONNIE & CLYDE

Isn't it funny, how Hollywood tends to glamorize criminals? I realize that the movie folks have to make a living some way and I wouldn't want them to go hungry. There have been several movies based on "Ma" Barker and her four criminal sons. They've usually portrayed her as the mastermind of the gang, who planned all the jobs. According to one of their captured gang members, "She couldn't plan breakfast." Her husband, George, father of her sons, finally left her and the boys because he couldn't tolerate their lifestyle. It turned out he made the right choice, because she and their four

sons wound up getting killed. Ma and her son, Fred, died in a shootout in Florida. Herman committed suicide after being stopped at a police roadblock. Arthur, was killed in an escape attempt from Alcatraz. Her last son, Lloyd, was killed by his wife. As you can see, crime really paid off for their family. Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow, were pretty much a generation later, but became equally well-known. There have been several movies about them, too. They and their small gang went on a crime spree in the Midwest, from about 1930 to 1934. During their last year, it was mostly just Bonnie and Clyde, along with his brother, Buck and his wife Blanche. In one shootout with the law, Bonnie and Clyde escaped, but Buck was killed and Blanche captured. The next year, May 23, 1934, Texas Ranger Frank Hamer and Louisiana police ambushed Bonnie and Clyde, on a highway near Sailes, Louisiana. That put a quick end to Bonnie and Clyde's murderous career. Crime didn't work out too well for them either.

Answer to last week's history trivia question: Frenchy McCormick, was the last resident of Old Tascosa. She had come there to work as a dancehall girl, during the boom years. She wouldn't tell anyone where she came from, or anything about her past. She met and married a young man named Mickey McCormick. He was a gambler, hunter and livery stable operator. After everyone else had moved away from Tascosa, they were the only remaining residents. A few years later, he died at home. She continued to live there by herself for quite a few years, with local ranchers checking on her every week or so. When she got so old, she couldn't take care of herself, friends at Channing took her in. She lived with them for two years, until she died. They took her body back to Tascosa and buried her next to "her Mack," as she had always told them she wanted.

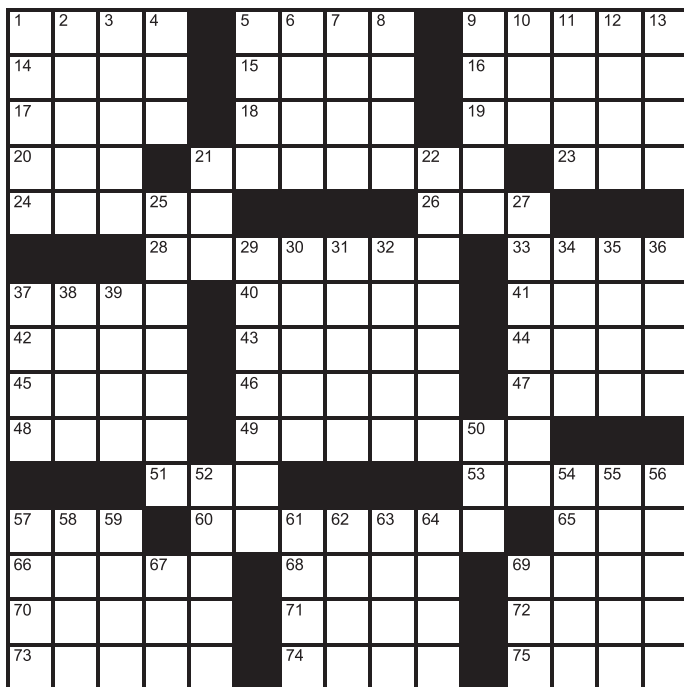
