**Breast Cancer Awareness**

In 2013, according to the American Cancer Society, 232,340 new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed among women, with an estimated 64,640 additional cases of in situ breast cancer. Approximately 39,620 women were expected to die from breast cancer in the same year.

The best prevention of breast cancer is early detection, which is why it is important that women receive annual screening mammograms. Research has shown that mammograms reduce the risk of dying from breast cancer. Early detection of breast cancer leads to a greater range of treatment options, including less-aggressive surgery. The American Cancer Society recommends that women receive an annual mammogram beginning at age 40. As a woman ages, her chances of developing breast cancer increase. As long as a woman is in good health and would be a good candidate for breast cancer treatment, she should continue to be screened with an annual mammogram. If there is a question about a woman being a good candidate, she should thoroughly discuss it with her physician.

Some women choose not to get mammograms be-

cause of the cost. Beginning in 2011, the Affordable Care Act required that all new health insurance plans fully cover screening mammograms without any out-of-pocket expenses for the patient. This is also required of Medicare. For uninsured women and those not eligible for Medicare, resources are available for which these women may qualify. To help women learn about these resources and how to access them, Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service in Wheeler County will be conducting a



Friend to Friend party on August 16 at 5:30pm at the First Baptist Church in Shamrock. A health professional at the event will provide information about both breast and cervical cancers. In addition to the speaker, there will be discussion of the obstacles that prevent women from getting mammograms and Pap tests. Exhibitors will be pres-

ent, and participants will have an opportunity to schedule a screening mammogram. Help will be provided to direct women who qualify to financial resources that will cover the cost of a screening mammogram. 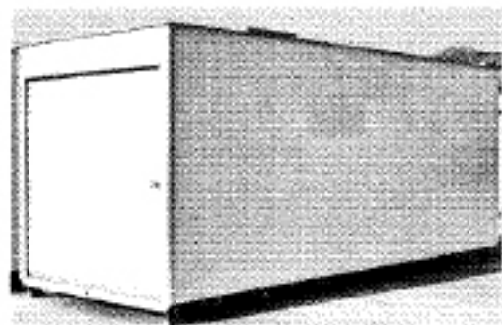

Quality takes center stage in upcoming Cotton Fiber Quality Conference Aug. 4 in Lubbock

LUBBOCK – Raising quality cotton means better products for the consumer and more return to the producer.

To ensure growers have all the information they need to make decisions that impact quality, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service will conduct the Cotton Fiber Quality Conference and Tours Aug. 4 in Lubbock.

The educational program will start with registration at 8 a.m. at the Texas A&M AgriLife Research and Extension Center, 1102 E. Farm-to-Market Road 1294, also known as Shallowater Road.

"Producing pounds of lint while maintaining quality fiber is always a challenge for cotton producers," said Danny Nusser, AgriLife Extension regional program leader in Amarillo and Lubbock.

"Topics related to harvest aides, equipment setting and care, irrigation timing, weed control, genetics, fertility, etc. are all late-season decisions producers make that impact this challenge. 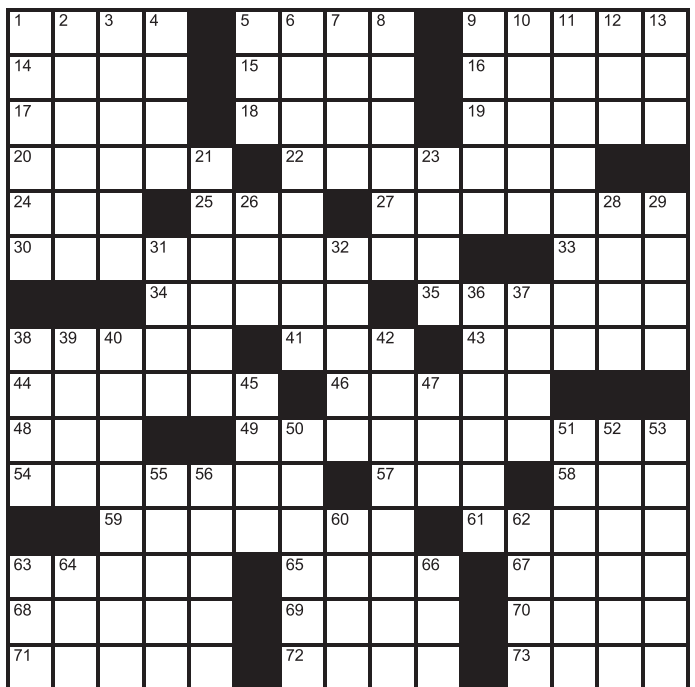

### Wheeler County Stage One Burn Ban Order Prohibiting or Restricting Outdoor Burning

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- (1) Firefighter Training;
- (2) Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops;
- (3) Burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;
- (4) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;

Example: if welding is occurring ten (10) feet off the ground, a diameter of thirty (30) feet must be protected.

III. A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

IV. Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged 10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site.

V. If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper precautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps).

VI. Each site will have cellular telephone communications for emergency response.

VII. Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

In accordance with Local Government Code Sec. 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.
