Neusch, officiating. Burial followed in Wheeler Cemetery under the direction of Peppers Family Funeral Home, of Wheeler, TX.



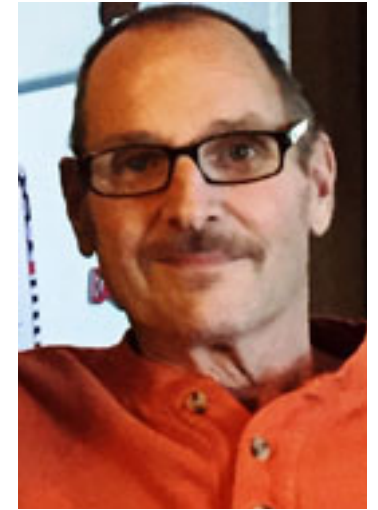

Dave died peacefully in his home, surrounded by his family, on Friday, July 29, 2016.

David Madison Britt Jr. was born December 5, 1952, in Shamrock, Texas, to the late David Madison Britt and Paula Irene (Bledsoe) Britt. Dave attended Kelton School and later Wheeler Junior High and High School, graduating in 1971. After graduation, Dave attended Texas Tech University for 1 year before returning home to Wheeler to work. Dave re-enrolled in college at Texas A&M University and graduated as a proud member of the Fightin' Texas Aggie Class of 1977. It was at A&M that he met his future wife, Mary Michele (Albers) Britt, and the two were wed on March 17, 1979. Dave moved back home to the Britt Ranch east of Wheeler in 1981, where he resided until his death. Dave and Mary had 3 sons, Benjamin, Jacob, and Joshua. Dave worked as the adult probation officer for the 31st Judicial District until he retired.

Although physically disabled by a car accident at age 17, Dave did not let his disability stand in the way of accomplishing his goals and giving of his time and talents. Dave always knew he wanted to come back to Wheeler to the family ranch, and he worked to help make Wheeler a great place to live and raise his sons. Dave was actively involved in Little League baseball, Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts, Wheeler Livestock Boosters, Parkview Hospital Board, Wheeler Mustang Athletic Boosters, and St. Mary's Catholic Church. He was also a founding member of the Wheeler Area Activities and Improvements Council and played an integral role in the construction of the Wheeler County Ag and Family Life Center. Dave was recognized as the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce's Man of the Year and also received the Pioneer Spirit award.

Dave was preceded in death by his father, David Madison Britt, and one son, 1LT Ben Britt.

Dave is survived by his wife, Mary, of Wheeler, TX; two sons, Jacob Britt and wife Ann Marie of Wheeler, TX; Josh Britt, of Wheeler, TX; one granddaughter, Therese Britt, of Wheeler; his mother, Paula Britt, of Wheeler; and his brother, Lewis Britt and wife Jennie and family, of Amarillo.

### FIREWORKS & FEED SACKS

Every year, on the fourth of July, our families out here, have a small fireworks show. As it always works out, I've just plowed a field where it's handy and safe to do it. We usually have a few friends over to watch. The older kids share the job of lighting them. It's kind-of an honor to be a "lighter"; shows you're old enough to be trusted. Grandson and another kid use Shirley's golf cart to haul the fireworks out to the field; really is handy. We don't play golf, but the cart is fun to have around. Several years ago, I built a wire enclosure to burn things like feed sacks, seed sacks and whatever else needs to be burned. Since the plowed field is south of the enclosure, I wait for a still day, or the wind out of the north, before I burn anything. In the summer, we get quite a lot of wind, but hardly ever out of the north. Consequently, by the time there's a good day to burn, I've accumulated a lot of stuff. Grandson told me a few days after the fourth, that he'd accidentally thrown away some unused fireworks when they were cleaning up. He said he'd dig through the stuff and try to find them. I told him to just leave it and we'd see how it acted when we burned all that. It was about two weeks before there was a good day to burn. I gave him a call and told him to come up to the field and watch, but he couldn't for a couple of hours so, I went ahead and lit it. I waited for several minutes, but nothing happened. I figured they had gotten wet, or maybe he had been mistaken about the fireworks. All at once, they started firing off. It wasn't as exciting to watch as I thought it would be, but it did make me jump a little. One thing that scared me more than that was a WD-40 can I'd thrown in the feed sack. When it finally exploded, I almost had a runaway. Now, when I've emptied a WD-40 can, I shoot a hole in it before throwing it away.

**Late Summer Supplementation with Protein For Young Cows**  
Because condition at calving and breeding are so important, it may at first seem silly to begin worrying about condition in the in this part of the summer. However, it must be remembered that there are few economical ways to increase body condition once winter has arrived. So, good body condition in the winter must depend on the nutritional program the previous summer. If young cows are still thin this time of year, which would probably be your two year old cows that are still growing and with suckling calf, it is with every likelihood, they will be thin going into the winter. Thought needs to be given about the most economical method of improving condition before winter. Weaning dates can be moved up; remember calves would be young and weaning weights will be reduced but prices are excellent. Removing the calf early will give a young cow a great opportunity to gain weight and be in good body condition as winter sets in. A well-planned supplementation program may offer help. When forage is available as in most cases around the county, feeding small amounts of protein supplements during late summer can efficiently increase weight and condition of spring calving cows. Feeding as little as .6 lbs/hd/day of soybean meal during

August and September, increased cow weight by 25 lb. and improved condition score by .67 units. The same could be done with cottonseed cake and weight gains could be even more. The important point is that during late summer, high protein supplements can permit efficient increases in weight and condition when forage is available. If one waits until winter to try to increase cow weight, protein may not be sufficient

and larger amounts of energy supplements or hay will be required. It is usually not economically feasible to try and improve body condition during winter conditions. A thin cow now means thinner cows in winter which results in poor cows at calving when February rolls around. The thought to remember is: what you are doing now affects body condition at calving and breed back time for next spring.

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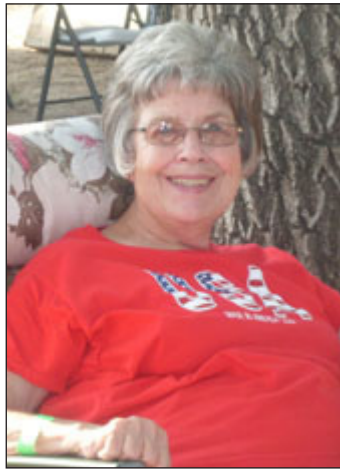

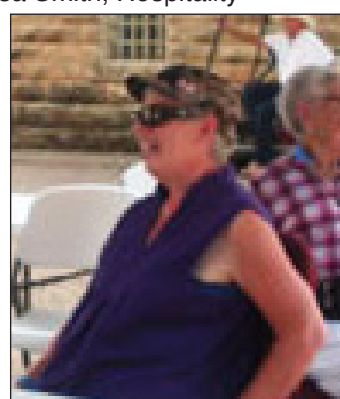

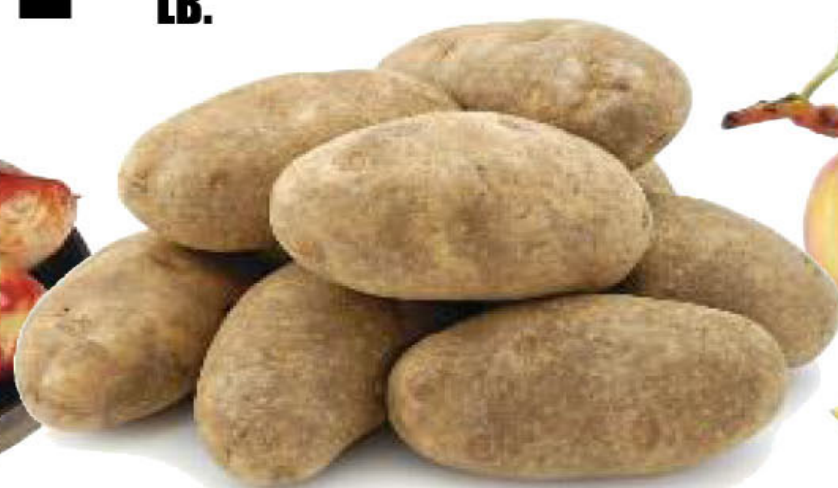
