### **Motor Cycle Wreck Claims Driver's Life**

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) was called to a one-vehicle crash Sunday on FM-1046 in Wheeler County, resulting in the death of one person.

At approximately 7:25 p.m., Robert Gonzales, 56, of Pampa, was driving a 2005 Harley Davidson west on FM-1046 approximately five miles northwest of Mobeetie. Gonzales failed to negotiate a curve in the roadway which caused him to lose control of the motorcycle and ultimately fall off.

Gonzales was pronounced dead on scene by Wheeler County Justice of the Peace. Mark Brown.

Gonzales was not wearing a helmet.

The road conditions were dry and no other vehicles were involved.




